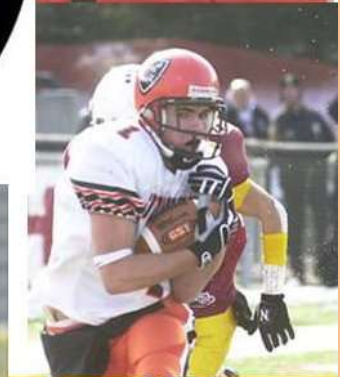

Another loaded team for Reed, Coldwater

COLDWATER — Although sometimes it's hard to see through his calm stoic demeanor that has been his trademark, John Reed is excited about the upcoming season.

After all, the longtime Coldwater coach has seen his teams go 58-10 since 2000 and have had two 10-0 regular seasons to go with three Midwest Athletic Conference titles.

When asked about how he sums up how the Cavaliers are looking going into the season opener, a smile began to grow wide.

"I think what has helped us with the depth we have (88 players on the roster this season) is we're getting a great turnout in the offseason for lifting. If kids aren't in basketball, wrestling, or swimming (in the winter) or playing baseball or running track (in the spring), they're in the weight room," said Reed, who has 103 wins as Coldwater coach, six short of the record 109 held by Paul Ponzuric. "The bar has been set so high, they better be in the weight room."

An experienced quarterback, talented receivers and one of the most stifling defenses in the state are back this season for Reed starting his 11th year as mentor of the Cavaliers' program.

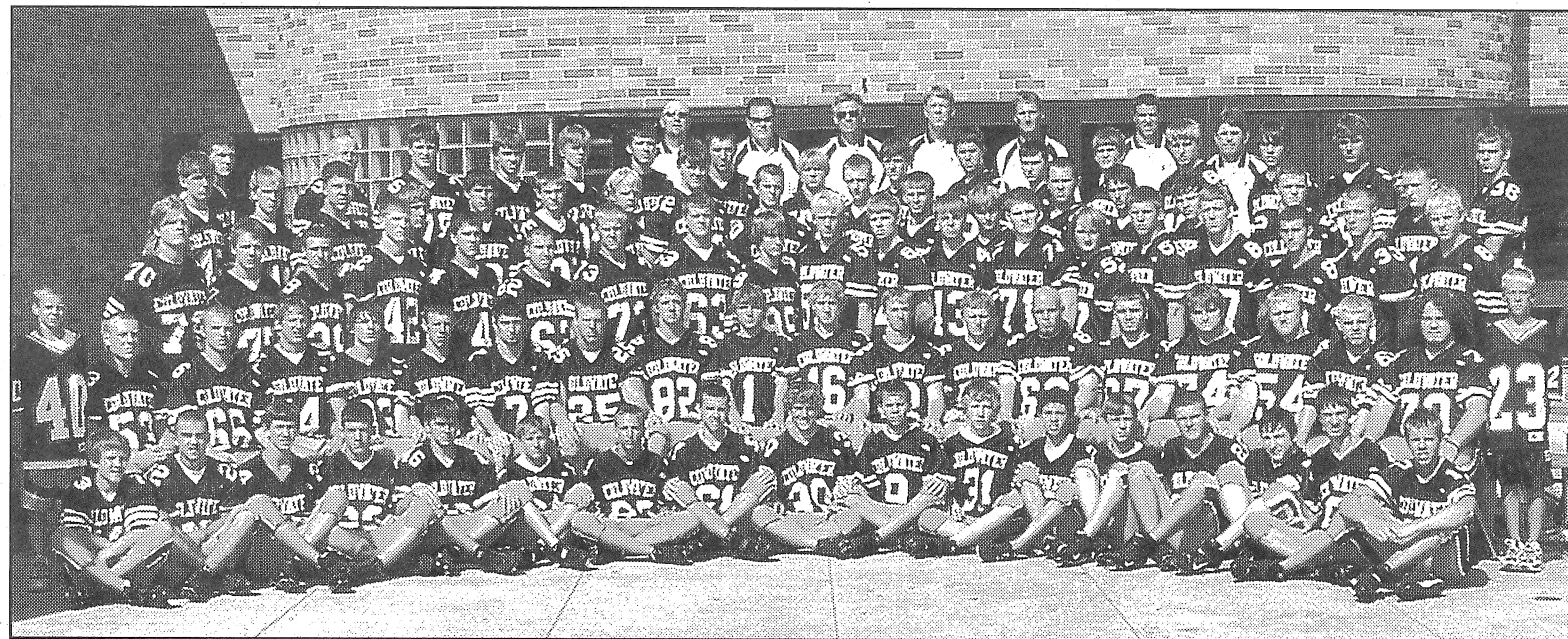
OFFENSE

Steve Borger blossomed as the season wore on last year as the quarterback for the team. Replacing a long line of Hoyngs —

first Kyle, then Kevin and finally Alex —

passed for 1,535 yards in the regular season and passed for another 768 yards in four post-season games.

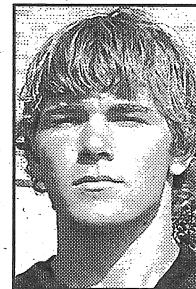
Now, a little bigger, more experienced and stronger, Borger is better — not just on the field, but in the film room.

"The thing I'm most excited about is how he immersed himself in watching tape and trying to find ways to be a better quarterback," said Reed. "He will be an altogether different quarterback than he was last year simply because of his off-season preparation. He has done the thing all the other great quarterbacks before him have done. That's what people don't see."

The receiving game took a hit with All-District first teamer Craig Wellman graduating, but as has been the case, depth has shown brightly on that position. The Cavalier coaches believe they have nine or 10 players that could play the spot. The front runners to start

in the four-receiver set are Brady Geier (6-0, 164, Sr.), Justin Kahlig (5-8, 145, Sr.), Ryan Geier (6-1, 171, Soph.), Matt Hoyng (5-9, 158, Jr.) and Devin Swartzel (6-2, 180, Sr.). The tight end position will see Brian Brunswick (6-5, 185, Sr.) and G a s t o n Pleiman (6-5, 194, Sr.) battling for time.

"It does create great competition, but it also creates defensive problems," said R e e d . "There's not



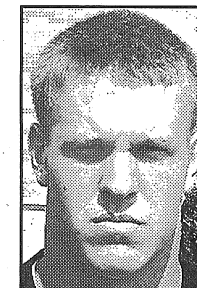

just one go-to guy. Whoever the four we'll have out there, those four have the ability to be a big playmaker. When Steve looks at the defense, he won't have to say 'Well, they took away my number-one receiver.' It just doesn't work that way in our offense."

The Cavs also worked more out of a traditional offense last season, emphasizing the running of Ross Homan (809 yards, 18 rushing touchdowns). The Cavaliers will look to either Doug Kahlig (6-0, 174, Jr.) or Tyler Kunk (5-9, 182, So.) to take over the full-back spot, a key spot considering that the player is almost a sixth lineman in blocking



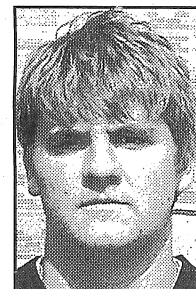

schemes.

One line spot is set in stone with P a u l Matthewson (6-2, 234, Sr.) holding down the left tackle spot. Adam Berger (5-8, 183, Jr.) and Mike Rengers (6-5, 238, Jr.) are in the battle for right tackle position. Batting for a guard spot will be Tylor Muhlenkamp (6-1, 206, Jr.), Lucas Homan (6-1, 186, Jr.), Josh Pax (5-11, 220, Jr.) and Adam Geire (5-10, 182, Sr.). The center battle will feature Ryan Hoyng (6-1, 215, Jr.) and Gavin Bettinger (5-6, 205, Jr.)

DEFENSE

The 4-4 defense outlined by Tim Hoyng has ranked among the best around northwest

Ohio and has proven to be very versatile adjusting from Kenton's five-wide formations to the Versailles full-house backfield.

"Last year, we prepared for Kenton in their five-wide and they came out with two tight ends and tried to run the ball," said Reed. "After a period of adjustment, we were able to, because of the fact that we see so many different looks in the league itself, adjust. It's not going to throw us off."

The anchor of the defense continues to be Ohio State signee and All-Ohio linebacker, Ross Homan.

Homan (6-1, 235, Sr.), a two-time All-Ohioan at linebacker went over 200 tackles for the second straight year and forced many teams to try and focus all their energy finding him.

That in turn, allowed others to wreak their havoc, as Cody Muhlenkamp (5-11, 177, Sr.) had over 100 tackles last season and junior Joe Wermert (6-1, 185, Jr.) was solid as a sophomore. Ryan Geier will

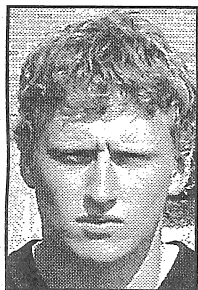

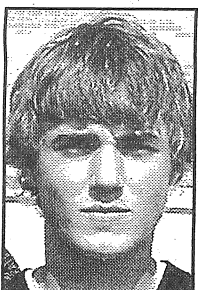

look to replace Ryan Gerlach in the other outside backer spot of the 4-4 defense.

The front wall lost key players with tackles Aron Castle and Mark Heint and end Nick Rengers graduated. Pleiman and Brunswick will man the ends while Trent Post (5-6, 174, Sr.) will look to line up inside. Trent Dues (6-0, 247, Jr.) is among those in the running for the other spot at tackle.

While Wellman's defensive backfield play will be missed,

The unit will still be heavy on willing players to handle wideout duties.

Matt Hoyng and Cory Klenke (6-0, 168, Fr.) are in the running for the safety spot with Trevor Stromblad (5-10, 151, Sr.) and Justin Kahlig at the other corner

SPECIAL TEAMS

The team will miss the punting of Rengers, who earned two first team All-District nods as one of the premier pinpoint punters in the area, averaging 36.7 yards a boot last season.

Brady Geier will handle the chores this season while Stromblad will handle the point-after, field goals and kickoff chores for a third straight season.

In addition to his defensive prowess, Homan is also an explosive special teams performer and he will be joined by Geier to help return kickoffs.

OUTLOOK

Reed cannot wait for opening night.

"We're so tired of practicing and hitting one other," said Reed. "We can't wait to get out and play on Friday nights. I think we're way ahead, and I'm not comparing it to other years, but we're working on things already a lot of teams haven't had the chance to work on because

we've been here for 10 years and starting 11."

Reed gives plenty of credit to the other coaches — Hoyng, Randy Wright, Jason Hemmelgarn, Chip Otten, Jerry Kanney and Thad Forsthoefel.

"There are seven head coaches here," said Reed. "I have the title, but they have their own head coaching responsibilities, and I love it. They are so good at what they do. I don't have to worry what Randy is doing with the tackles. He's forgotten more about defensive tackles than I will know. I'm just really blessed."

Offense:

- Ross Homan rushed for 1395 yards on 216 attempts for a 6.5 yards per carry average and 26 touchdowns.
- Steve Borger completed 166 of 241 passes (69%) for 2651 yards and 29 touchdowns with only 3 interceptions. His QB rating was 198.5 (NCAA calculation).
- 12 different receivers caught passes from Coldwater quarterbacks.
- Brady Geier had 49 receptions for 870 yards for 17.8 yards per catch and 14 touchdowns.

Defense:

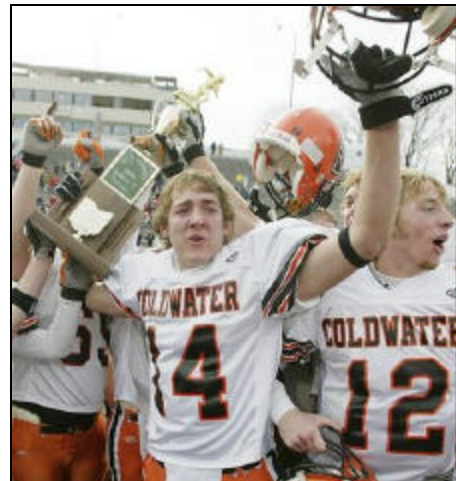
- Coldwater allowed only 87 points this season.
- Coldwater held their five playoff opponents to 3 points and allowed only 547 total yards.
- Coldwater allowed 173 yards total offense per game this season.
- Coldwater shut out 6 of their 15 opponents.
- Coldwater owned a + 25 turnover margin.
- Eight Coldwater defenders intercepted 24 passes. Brady Geier had 11.

Kicking Game:

- Brady Geier averaged 36.4 yards per punt.
- Trevor Stromblad completed 5 of his 6 field goal attempts. Longest was 38 yards.
- Trevor Stromblad completed 74 of 78 PAT attempts. His best streak was 36 straight.
- Trevor Stromblad completed 100 kickoffs for an average of 50 yards (36 net) with 15 touchbacks.

Other Items of Interest:

- Coldwater won its first State Football Championship in its third try.
- This year's 15 wins are the most wins in a season for any Cavalier team, a record which at this time is very secure.
- Coldwater won the Midwest Athletic Conference for the second straight year, 14 overall since MAC football competition began in 1973.
- Coach Reed has won 7 MAC championships (4 at Coldwater, 3 at Rockford Parkway).
- 2005 Division IV AP Poll Title is the third for the Cavaliers (2002, 2004, and 2005).
- 39-1 in the regular season during the past 4 years, 50-4 overall.
- Coach Reed is 118-26 in 11 seasons at Coldwater.

Coach makes bad call

Anyone who thought this week was going to be boring, think again.

Coldwater High coach John Reed, whose team will play Cardinal Mooney in Saturday's Division IV state final, was asked in a state-wide teleconference Monday how much better Mooney is with quarterback Derrell Johnson on the field.

It was an innocent question with a not-so-innocent answer.

"He brings another facet to their game," Reed said of Johnson, who transferred from Campbell High to Mooney last winter. "It was a great move to get him."

A reporter, picking up on the hint, asked Reed if he thought public schools such as Coldwater were at a disadvantage playing parochial schools such as Mooney.

"I don't think there's any question about that," Reed said. "The town of Coldwater has three or four thousand people and all the kids come from [the same school district]."

"It's an un-level playing field. It's nice to be able to go to Campbell and pick out a quarterback. I can only imagine what an all-star team from Mercer County" — where Coldwater is located — "would look like. But that's just the way it is. There's nothing we can do about that."

Strange timing for complaint

From a journalistic standpoint, this is sort of like finding a \$50 bill on the ground. Especially since most coaches use the teleconference as a way to talk about how great their opponents are.

I just question the timing.

I'm not going to go into the public/private debate this week, nor am I going to argue that Reed is wrong to feel that way. But when you complain about parochial schools having an advantage five days before you're going to play in a state championship game, you're basically giving your team an excuse to lose.

And that bugs me.

"It is interesting timing," said Mooney coach P.J. Fecko. "The focus isn't on the game and that's puzzling to me."

Reed shared similar thoughts after his team lost to Ursuline in the 2000 state final, which was the last time the Cavaliers played in the state championship game.

"I think I made the comment back then that you could have an S-10 truck and it could be the best truck it can be, but if it meets a semi going the other way, the semi is going to win," Reed said. "We just have to hope that our speed and tenacity will level things out a little bit [on Saturday]."

Reed was no doubt exaggerating, but what makes those comments so puzzling is the fact that Coldwater enters Saturday's final as the state's top-ranked team.

"When people say things like that, they obviously don't know the facts," Fecko said. "Furthermore, with open enrollment, there's a lot of public schools in the same scenario. There are a lot of athletes around here going to different schools and I'm sure it's the same thing over there [on the northwest side of the state]."

"In situations like these, people make assumptions without knowing what they're talking about. But that's what's beautiful about America. You can do that."

Staying away
from debate

Regardless of where you stand on the public/private debate — and there's some pretty heated opinions on both sides — the setup isn't going to change this week. And if Coldwater loses this weekend, it's going to sound like sour grapes, which is why so many public school coaches prefer not to talk about it during the season — if at all.

"If you want to find an excuse not to be successful, you can find one," said Canfield coach Mike Pavlansky, whose team will play a parochial school, Toledo Central Catholic, in Friday's Division II state final. "Some years you're too small, too slow or too hurt. We just play the teams on our schedule that we're told to play."

"I don't think it's my place to tell parents where to send their kids."

Obviously, Reed has a pretty good team this year. Maybe his team is at a disadvantage — maybe — but at this point, it's a moot point. All Reed did was give his team an excuse for losing. (Along with some rather spicy bulletin board material for the Cardinals.)

A coach has to make a lot of good calls during the season to get his team to the state final. On Monday, Reed made a bad one.

Jays, Cavs hope to double MAC's glory

It's nothing new to the football die-hards in Massillon and Canton, but the Midwest Athletic Conference will be well represented today at the state finals.

Delphos St. John's and Coldwater will try to bring one-third of the state's six state championships to the Lima area. The Blue Jays are shooting for their fourth state title, the Cavaliers their first.

MAC coaches say winning a conference title can be harder than getting a state title.

To get through our league schedule and have an opportunity to play in Week 11 says a lot," Delphos St. John's head coach Todd Schulte said. "Every week you see playoff-caliber teams in Coldwater, Versailles, St. Henry won it last year and Marion Local, who has won a few state titles.

Every week you see high-caliber athletes and high-caliber coaches who go on to be very representative in the playoffs."

No. 1-ranked Coldwater (14-0), which won the MAC title for the second straight year, will meet defending champion Youngstown Mooney (12-2) in the Division IV final at 11 a.m. today at Canton's Fawcett Stadium. Delphos St. John's (12-2) and Steubenville Catholic Central (11-3) will face off in the Division VI final at 3 p.m. today at Massillon's Paul Brown Tiger Stadium.

MAC members have won 12 state titles. This is the fourth time two MAC teams have played in a state final in the same year. The conference has yet to double its treasure, though. Coldwater has suffered both of its state final losses in years when another conference member won it all.

In 1998, Delphos St. John's defeated Lancaster Fisher Catholic for the second of its three consecutive crowns in Division VI, while Coldwater suffered a 23-21 loss to Orrville in the Division IV final.

In 2000, Coldwater fell 49-37 to Youngstown Ursuline, but Marion Local won the Division VI title with a 54-0 drubbing of Mogadore.

The other year was 1999. St. Henry fell to Amanda-Clearcreek in the state final, but St. John's finished off its title run with a 42-10 victory over Norwalk St. Paul.

Division IV: Coldwater Wins Championship

No. 1 Coldwater's granite-wall defense supplied one score and Steve Borger tossed three touchdown passes to lead the Cavaliers to a 33-9 victory Saturday over defending champion Youngstown Mooney in the Division IV state title game.

The Cavaliers (15-0) captured their first football championship in their third trip to the ultimate game.

They lost to Orrville 23-21 in the 1998 final and to Youngstown Ursuline 49-37 in 2000.

The victory also gave the Midwestern Athletic Conference at least one state champion for the third consecutive year and the 12th time in the last 17 years.

Coldwater has averaged almost 40 points a game this season, but the defense has set the tone. The Cavaliers shut out their last three playoff opponents and surrendered just 5.6 points a game for the year.

Mooney (12-3) netted only 126 yards on 50 plays, with three sacks for 43 yards in losses.

Fifth-ranked Mooney fell to 5-2 in state championship games.

With a win, the Cardinals could have moved into a tie for fourth place in football titles. Mooney was without starter Derrell Johnson, a first-team all-state at quarterback along with Coldwater's Steve Borger.

Johnson, who had leg injuries throughout the season, hurt his shin late in last week's 20-13 win over Bellaire in the semifinals.

Junior Tony Brunetti took his place in the starting lineup. Borger completed 12 of 17 passes for 209 yards with one interception.

His scoring throws covered 35 yards to Justin Kahlig and 22 and 42 yards to Brady Geier. Geier had 106 yards on four receptions.

Ross Homan, the Ohio State-bound linebacker and running back, rushed for 70 yards on 16 carries. He had a 15-yard touchdown on the first play of the third quarter that gave the Cavaliers some breathing room.



Nate Burney, a first-team All-Ohioan for Mooney, carried 33 times for 136 yards.

Coldwater led 20-9 after a crazy first half in which Borger threw two touchdown passes and the teams traded big plays on defense and special teams.

Borger hit Kahlig on a pinpoint spiral in the back of the end zone for a 35-yard score on the opening possession. Borger aimed his pass just over the outstretched arm of defender Dom Scarnecchia, with Kahlig leaping high to make the two-handed grab.

After Will Kandray kicked a 32-yard field goal for Mooney, the Cavaliers took a 14-3 lead when Brunetti was chased out of the pocket and hit by Ryan Geier.

The ball popped out, and defensive end Gaston Pleiman scooped it up and coasted 70 yards to the end zone, surrounded by a convoy of blockers.



Mooney countered with a surprise score of its own on the first play of the second quarter.

Dan McCarthy, brother of the quarterback from last year's state championship team, blocked Brady Geier's punt, then unloaded a huge block to spring Robert Walker for a 37-yard touchdown return. Borger showed his athleticism on his second scoring pass.

He took the snap at the left hash, rolled all the way to the right hash, then threw back across his body to hit Geier, who was streaking along the goal line headed for the left corner.

Coldwater netted just 3 yards in the third quarter, but added two fourth-quarter scores to put the lead out of reach. Homan took a pitch and cut inside, scissoring between two tacklers for the score that pushed the lead to 27-9.

Borger later flipped a short pass into the right flat to Geier, who slipped a tackle and then raced untouched to close the scoring. Brunetti hit 4 of 8 passes for 29 yards but was harassed all day by the Coldwater defense.

The Cavaliers also forced four fumbles, recovering three to lock up the biggest win in school history.

Cavaliers knock down Mooney's giants

CANTON — Youngstown Mooney's offensive line was big. But Coldwater's offensive line played bigger.

One of the concerns for Coldwater going into its Division IV state football championship game against Youngstown Mooney on Saturday was that the Cardinals offensive line averaged 285 pounds a man. Two of the linemen checked in at more than 300 pounds.

But by any measuring standard, Coldwater's smaller offensive line got the gold medal and Mooney settled for the silver.

Coldwater won the most important competition, outscoring the Cardinals 33-9 to win its first state football championship. The Cavaliers also had the edge in total yards, 293 to 126.

And, while Coldwater's defense teed off on Mooney's backfield for nine tackles for losses, the Cavs offensive linemen gave up only four plays for negative yardage.

Coldwater quarterback Steve Borger operated behind that line for 12 completions in 17 attempts for 209 yards and three touchdowns. He finished the season with 2,652 yards, 29 touchdown passes and only three interceptions.

It was just more of the same thing Coldwater has seen all season.

"He's an excellent athlete. He's come so far from last year. It's easy to block for a guy like that when you know if you give him enough time he's going to make a play," offensive tackle Paul Mathewson said.

And when Borger has time, good things happen, Coldwater coach John Reed said.

"You have to have a triggerman. If you're going to do the offense we do, you have to have a triggerman," Reed said. "I can remember four times where I had us in a bad play today and he got us into a good play."

Coldwater took Mooney's size as a challenge but not a daunting challenge, guard Josh Pax said. "You can't worry about their size. You just have to do the best you can do."

NUMBER SIX: Coldwater became the sixth Midwest Athletic Conference team to win a football state championship. All of them have come since 1989.

St. Henry has won five state football titles, Delphos St. John's has four, Marion Local has won two, Minster has one and one of Versailles' state titles came after it joined the MAC.

Coldwater's state title was the 11th in school history. It has five in baseball, three in girls track and two in girls basketball.

ONE TO SHARE: Coldwater has won 107 games and lost 23 the last 10 years but Saturday's title was its first state championship.

This year's players remembered the guys who came before them.

"It wasn't just for us, it was for all those teams in years past that got so close," Pax said.

ONE FOR THE PLAYERS: Reed said the credit for this state title belongs to the players. “When you don’t have players, you’re not a very good coach. When you’ve got players like this, you’re a real good coach,” he said.

SEEING IS BELIEVING: Reed said he wasn’t sure injured Mooney quarterback Derrell Johnson wasn’t going to play until the game began without him.

“We thought he was playing. We had no idea. When they came out for kickoff we still thought he would probably play,” Reed said.

Johnson suffered an ankle injury in a state semifinal win over Bellaire last Saturday.

Coldwater rocks Mooney, finally wins 'big one'

CANTON — An hour-and-a-half after Coldwater's 33-9 win over Youngstown Mooney in the Division IV football state championship game on Saturday, some of the Cavaliers lingered on the field in street clothes.

The score was still on the Fawcett Stadium scoreboard. The time clock was at zero.

A few players took turns cradling the state championship trophy. One put a kiss on it. Another dropped to a knee to try to pick a few blades of artificial grass from the playing surface.

Any state championship is something to celebrate and soak in. But maybe it was more so for Coldwater.

The No. 1-ranked Cavaliers (15-0) dominated one of the legendary programs in Ohio high school football to win the first football title in school history.

Their first trip home with the big trophy came after a decade of getting oh-so-close to winning it all.

The Cavaliers were state runner-up in 2000 and in 1998. Last year they were unbeaten until the state semifinals. They've won at least 11 games seven of the last eight seasons.

Coldwater coach John Reed had a one-word answer, "Yes," when a television reporter put a microphone in his face and asked him on the field after the game if this took a monkey off his back.

Later, he expanded on that thought. "The program's success speaks for itself," the veteran Coldwater coach said. "But when you're the head coach, they always say, 'You haven't won the big one.' There are no more big ones to win now."

Mooney (12-3) was the defending Division IV state champion and had a history of winning the big one, with five state championships in football.

But Coldwater grabbed the lead early and never let it go. Steve Borger's 35-yard touchdown pass to Justin Kahlig in the first two minutes of the game started the ball rolling.

Borger threw for 209 yards and three touchdowns, two of them to Brady Geier. Ross Homan rushed for 70 yards and a TD and the Cavaliers' defense held a fifth straight postseason opponent without an offensive touchdown.

Coldwater had 293 yards and limited Mooney to 126 yards overall. Mooney's only scores came on a 32-yard field goal by Will Kandray in the first quarter and a blocked punt for a touchdown on the first play of the second quarter.

Homan, an Ohio State recruit as a linebacker, called Mooney "the best team we faced."

But in a battle of speed versus strength, speed won, he said.

“We used speed to beat their size. We knew if we came into them they’d overpower us. We tried to get around them and make plays,” Homan said.

The Cardinals played without quarterback Derrell Johnson, who rushed for 1,239 yards and threw for 499 yards this season.

That threw the burden of the offense onto running back Nate Burney, who gained more than 2,000 yards this year. Burney had 136 yards on 33 carries but his longest run was for 18 yards.

Coldwater’s speed contained Burney, and the absence of Johnson because of an ankle injury made the Cardinals’ offense much more predictable.

“We just made sure everybody knew how fast they were. We made sure everybody got to the ball. We wanted to prevent the long play,” said Brady Geier, who played defensive back.

Johnson’s replacement, Tony Brunetti, was a key player in one the game’s key plays.

With Coldwater leading 6-3 late in the first quarter, Mooney had a first down on the Cavaliers’ 7-yard line. One play later, Brunetti was hit by Ryan Geier as he rolled to his right and fumbled.

Defensive end Gaston Pleiman picked up the ball and ran 70 yards untouched for a touchdown to make it 13-3.

Pleiman said his eyes got “as big as that trophy,” looking toward the state championship trophy, when he saw the ball come out.

“I didn’t see it until late. Ryan came up with the sack and all of a sudden it just rolled out,” he said. “I turned around twice and didn’t see anybody. By that time I was just cruising my way to the end zone.”

Mooney coach P.J. Fecko called that play “a big momentum swing.”

“We were looking at points offensively and it turned around with them getting points,” he said.

Mooney was still in the game at 13-9 when it blocked Brady Geier’s punt and Robert Walker took it 37 yards for a touchdown to open the second quarter.

But Coldwater answered with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Borger to Brady Geier to go up 20-9 with eight minutes left in the first half. After Kahlig returned a punt to the Cardinals’ 15-yard line, Homan sprinted 15 yards for a touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Coldwater closed out the scoring with a 42-yard scoring throw from Borger to Brady Geier with 7:53 left on the clock. Trevor Stromblad added his third extra point kick of the day for the 33-9 final.

Homan led Coldwater defensively with 12 tackles. Tyler Kunk and Brian Brunswick each had two tackles for losses.

Add it all up and it was time to celebrate.

“To be the best you have to beat the best. All year people have been talking about how Coldwater and Mooney are the two best teams in the division. I don’t think I’d want it any other way,” Brady Geier said.

Homan said, “We knew we had all the pieces of the puzzle. Putting them together was the big thing. We came so close last year. We knew next year (2005) would be our time.”

Offensive lineman Paul Mathewson said, “It’s such a rich tradition. To finally bring back a state title to our town — words can’t describe the feeling we’re all feeling right now. It’s a feeling only a certain amount of people get to experience and to be in that certain amount is great.”

Coldwater joins MAC championship parade

CANTON - Welcome to the club, Coldwater.

After watching five other Midwest Athletic Conference schools win state football titles before them — and coming close several times themselves — Saturday was Coldwater's time. The Cavaliers capped a perfect 15-0 season by shutting down Youngstown Cardinal Mooney, 33-9, in the Division IV title game at Canton's Fawcett Stadium.

The win was the 13th state title for the MAC (with Delphos St. John's going for 14 in the D-VI final) and avenged a conference loss to Mooney (12-3) in last season's title game, a 28-6 win over Versailles.

Coldwater never trailed behind its smothering defense and big-play offense. But it also couldn't shake a Mooney team playing without its All-Ohio quarterback. Derrell Johnson, who accounted for 1,738 yards and 16 touchdowns combined running and passing in nine games, watched from the sidelines with a leg injury suffered in last week's semifinals.

"We thought he was playing. We had no idea," Coldwater coach John Reed said. "When they came out for kickoff we still thought he'd play. I'm sorry for him he didn't get to play."

While the Cavs' harassed back-up Tony Brunetti (4 of 8 passing 29 yards) with three sacks for minus-44 yards rushing, Coldwater QB Steve Borger enjoyed more time to survey the field. He completed 12 of 17 attempts for 209 yards and three touchdowns. He threw one interception, just his third in 15 games.

"It's easy to block for a guy like that," Coldwater lineman Paul Mathewson said of Borger. "When you know if you give him enough time, he's going to make the play."

Three of Coldwater's four offensive touchdowns came on drives of 1:38, 1:32 and six seconds. The fourth was a clock-draining 3:18. The Cavs also scored a defensive TD on Gaston Pleiman's 70-yard fumble return — a D-IV state title game record — after Ryan Geier sacked Brunetti.

Mooney (5-2 in state finals) entered the game never allowing more than seven points in a championship game. Coldwater needed just 1:32 to nearly match that. Receiving the opening kickoff, Borger led a six-play, 60-yard drive capped by Justin Kahlig's 35-yard TD catch. He fought defender Dom Scarnecchia for the ball as both fell backwards in the rear of the end zone. The extra-point missed.

"I knew I had to make a perfect pass," Borger said. "I just threw it in there and Justin had to make a heck of a catch. It was a great catch by Justin."

Borger's other TD passes found Brady Geier for 22 and 43 yards. The first one Borger rolled to the right, stopped and fired across his body to Geier streaking across the end zone. The second Geier

fought off a defender, picked up some blocks and sped into the corner. Borger also threw the lead block to help Ross Homan (16 carries for 70 yards) bounce outside for a 15-yard score in the fourth.

Mooney's only points came off a 32-yard field goal in the first quarter and a blocked punt in the second quarter. Coldwater outgained Mooney 293-126 in total offense.

"Very tough," Mooney fullback Pat Kelley said. "The toughest team we've played all year. Very physical."

Coldwater D utterly dominant

Cavs outscored playoff foes 169-15, did not allow an offensive TD in five games

CANTON - When Coldwater defensive end Gaston Pleiman picked up a fumble off the Fawcett Stadium turf and strolled 70 yards into the end zone Saturday, it provided an amazing stat from the Cavaliers' Division IV state championship season.

With that score — and holding Youngstown Cardinal Mooney's offense out of the end zone — Coldwater's defense outscored its five playoff opponents' offenses combined, 6-3. Mooney's field goal on Saturday was the first time since Week 10 the Cavs' defense has been scored on. Elyria Catholic's interception return and Mooney's blocked punt accounted for the only postseason TDs against a Coldwater team that outscored playoff opponents 169-15.

It was much of the same Saturday as Coldwater beat Mooney 33-9 to claim its first state football title in three appearances. Mooney, playing without multi-threat quarterback Derrell Johnson, became one-dimensional with the shifty running of Nate Burney. Burney was involved in 34 of Mooney's 50 plays (33 rushes for 136 yards; 1 reception for minus-4 yards).

With the Cavs putting up 33 points on the Cardinals, 20 points more than Mooney allows, the defense could focus on shutting them down.

"We used our speed to beat their size," Coldwater linebacker Ross Homan said of a Mooney offensive line that averaged 6-foot-3 and 286 pounds. "We tried to get around them to make the plays. They are the best team we've played so far. They are unbelievable."

Coldwater recovered three of four Mooney fumbles, sacked QB Tony Brunetti three times for minus-43 yards and allowed just four completions. The biggest sack came in the first quarter. Brunetti rolled out and was chased down by Ryan Geier. The ball popped free on the hit and Pleiman had an easy path to the end zone. His 70-yard TD set the record for longest fumble return in a D-IV title game, bettering the 35-yard return by Newark Licking Valley in 2001.

Pleiman's eyes lit up seeing the ball there for the taking.

"They got about as big as this trophy is," Pleiman said of the large gold championship trophy he hoisted in front of the Cavs' fans. "They were huge."

Homan, who intends to graduate from Coldwater early and enroll at Ohio State in January, led the Cavs with 12 tackles. Tyler Kunk, Brian Brunswick and Geier all registered sacks.

"The guys up front did a great job," said Coldwater linebacker Cody Muhlenkamp, who finished with five tackles and forced a fumble. "When they blow up (Mooney's offense) in the backfield like that it gives me, Ross and the other linebackers a lot of time to make tackles."

The juking Burney had his share of nice runs and bailed Mooney out several times. But Coldwater's team speed contained him often enough, especially after wearing down Mooney's line in the second half. Having Johnson would have helped. But it might not have made a difference on Saturday as Coldwater held Mooney to 15 points below its season average.

"I don't know. That's an impossible question to answer," Mooney coach P.J. Fecko said of how much impact Johnson would have had. "You can't play it that way."

State crowns keep piling up for MAC

MASSILLON - The Midwest Athletic Conference added to its unrivaled tradition Saturday, claiming two state football titles. It was the first time in history the MAC won two titles in the same season, despite sending two teams to finals five previous times.

Coldwater defeated Youngstown Cardinal Mooney 33-9 in the Division IV championship, and Delphos St. John's beat Steubenville Central Catholic 28-0 in D-VI.

The D-IV title was the first in school history for Coldwater, while St. John's improved to 4-0 in state finals. The Blue Jays also won crowns in 1997-99.

Overall, the MAC has 13 state football titles. The conference has dominated D-VI, winning eight of 12 possible championships.

Private vs. public

Five of the six state title games featured a public school against a private/parochial school (D-VI had two private schools). The public schools won three of the five matchups after going 1-2 in that situation last year.

Four for two

Both the MAC and Northwest Ohio Athletic League have four active coaches who own state titles. By virtue of Coldwater's win, Cavs coach John Reed joins St. Henry's Jeff Starkey (2004), Marion Local's Tim Goodwin (2000-01) and St. John's Todd Shulte as MAC coaches with crowns. Patrick Henry's D-V win on Friday enabled coach Bill Inselmann to join Liberty Center's Rex Lingruen (1997), Wauseon's Mark Emans (1993) and Archbold's John Downey (1988) as NWOAL coaches with titles. Had Versailles coach Al Hetrick not retired recently, the MAC would have five coaches (more than half the conference) with state titles heading into next year.

Helping hand

To simulate the athleticism of Cardinal Mooney dual threat quarterback Derrell Johnson this week in practice, Coldwater employed the services of a familiar face. University of Dayton starting quarterback and Coldwater grad Kevin Hoyng ran the Cavs' scout team. A junior at UD, Hoyng set the Flyers' total offense record this season with 2,547 yards. Johnson, a first-team All-Ohioan, didn't play Saturday due to an injury sustained in the state semifinals.

Flashback

Prior to the D-VI final, the Ohio News Network showcased past state performances on the big screen scoreboard at Paul Brown Tiger Stadium. One of the featured flashbacks was Chaminade-Julienne graduate Javon Ringer's performance in the 2002 D-II title game. Ringer, then a sophomore, rushed

for 251 yards and four TDs (still D-II finals records) in the Eagles' 41-26 win over Macedonia Nordonia. Ringer is a freshman at Michigan State.

Word of warning

After their D-IV final loss, Cardinal Mooney players were asked how hard it was to defend the state title. Last season the Cardinals beat Versailles in the D-IV championship.

"It's very hard," Mooney senior Pat Kelley said. "As soon as the season begins, you have a big target on your back and everyone is gunning for you. From scrimmages to the last game, everyone wants to knock you off."

Mooney was the lone defending state champion to make it back to the finals. Only four of last year's six winners made the playoffs.

MAC means what?

So what else do the letters MAC stand for? One vehicle from Coldwater proclaimed it means "Making Another Champion." Hard to argue with that.

Double duty

A trio of St. John's players not only dressed for the D-VI title game, but performed in the marching band prior to kickoff. Decked out in shoulder pads and cleats, freshmen Nathan Papiot (trumpet), Zach Reindel (drums) and Andy Wieging (trumpet) joined the band in time to play the national anthem and fight song.

Tradition wins out over loss

No Valley team has won back-to-back state championships.

CANTON — Five years ago, the Cardinal Mooney High football team suffered through the worst season in school history, going 1-9 with the lone victory coming because of a forfeit.

Over the next four seasons, the Cardinals returned to prominence, qualifying for the playoffs the past three years and advancing to back-to-back state championship games for the first time in school history.

"I guess you can say we brought Mooney back to where it was," said senior cornerback Desmond Marrow.

Unfortunately for the Cardinals, they finished one game short of where they wanted to be.

Playing without injured quarterback Derrell Johnson, the Cardinals were no match for the state's top-ranked team, falling to Coldwater 33-9 in Saturday's Division IV state final at Fawcett Stadium.

"These [seniors] have done a tremendous job of adding to the rich tradition at Cardinal Mooney," said Mooney coach P.J. Fecko. "What they've done over the past four years is something that will be remembered for a long time."

Looking back

The Cardinals (12-3), who defeated Versailles 28-6 in last year's Div. IV final, dropped to 5-2 all-time in state championship games.

Mooney won state championships in 1973, 1980, 1982, 1987 and 2004 and fell to Galion in the 1985 final.

No team in the Valley's history has won back-to-back state championships.

The Cavaliers (15-0), who compete in the Midwestern Athletic Conference, improved to 1-2 all-time in state championship games. They lost to Orrville in 1998 and Ursuline in 2000.

The MAC has produced 13 champions in the past 17 years.

"It's a great thrill," said Coldwater coach John Reed. "We've been so close so many times, and to finally win one is really special."

Cardinals struggle in 33-9 loss

CANTON — For the Mooney High football team, nothing proved harder than defending its state championship.

Minus the running threat created by an injury to quarterback Derrell Johnson, Mooney's offense struggled against a strong Coldwater defense in a 33-9 loss Saturday at Fawcett Stadium in the Division IV title contest.

"They are worthy champions, no question," said Mooney coach P.J. Fecko after the Cavaliers limited Mooney's offense to no touchdowns, 29 yards passing and 97 yards rushing.

Cardinals senior Desmond Marrow admitted that winning the championship a year ago generated added pressure.

"Everybody probably marked us on their schedules because everyone wants to beat us," Marrow said.

Burney short of record

Senior Nate Burney rushed for 136 yards on 33 carries, finishing his career 26 yards short of Ted Bell's school record of 4,428.

Johnson's absence made a difference, Coldwater linebacker Ross Homan said.

"It was a little easier because with Johnson out there it's like having two running backs in the backfield," the Ohio State recruit said. "With the misdirection they can give, it could be Burney or Johnson. With Johnson out of there, we keyed on Burney and it made it a lot easier for us."

Just 92 seconds into the game, Mooney trailed 6-0 as the Cavaliers drove 60 yards on six plays.

Perfect pass play

In the end zone, Justin Kahlig reached over Mooney defender Dom Scarnecchia to pull down a high toss from quarterback Steve Borger for a 35-yard touchdown.

"I knew he had his guy burned a little bit — I had to make a perfect pass," Borger said. "Justin made a heckuva catch. He had to turn around and lay it out — it was a great adjustment."

The extra-point kick failed, keeping Coldwater's lead at 6-0.

Mooney responded with their own scoring drive capped by Will Kandray's 32-yard field goal.

Late in the first quarter, Mooney defender Robert Walker hit Borger as he was throwing and Jack Zizzo intercepted, returning the ball to the Coldwater 31.

Costly fumble

Moments later came the play that knocked the wind out of the Cardinals' sails. Coldwater's Ryan Geier sacked quarterback Tony Brunetti for a 23-yard loss and the ball popped loose. Gaston Pleiman scooped up the ball and raced 70 yards for a 12-3 lead.

"That was a great momentum swing," Fecko said. "It was 6-3 and we were inside the 10 and we're looking at points and it turns around with them getting points. We could have made it 10-6 or 6-6."

Blocked punt helped

Trailing 13-3 on the first play of the second quarter, Mooney defender Dan McCarthy blocked Brady Geier's punt. Walker returned the ball 36 yards for Mooney's touchdown. The extra point kick missed, keeping Coldwater ahead by four points.

On their next possession, the Cavaliers marched 73 yards on eight plays. Borger hit Geier on a crossing pattern in the end zone for a 20-9 lead.

The biggest play of the scoreless third quarter was a Geier punt that rolled to the Mooney 1.

Kandray's punt four plays later was returned by Kahlig to the Mooney 15.

Homan broke right and scored a 15-yard touchdown for a 27-9 lead with 11:54 to play.

"It's very hard," said Mooney linebacker Pat Kelley of playing a year after winning it all. "The season begins with a big target on your back — everyone is looking for you. It's hard to get to this point, but we're just glad to be here.

"They were probably the toughest team we were up against all year as far as blocking and down-and-out physicalness," Kelley said.
