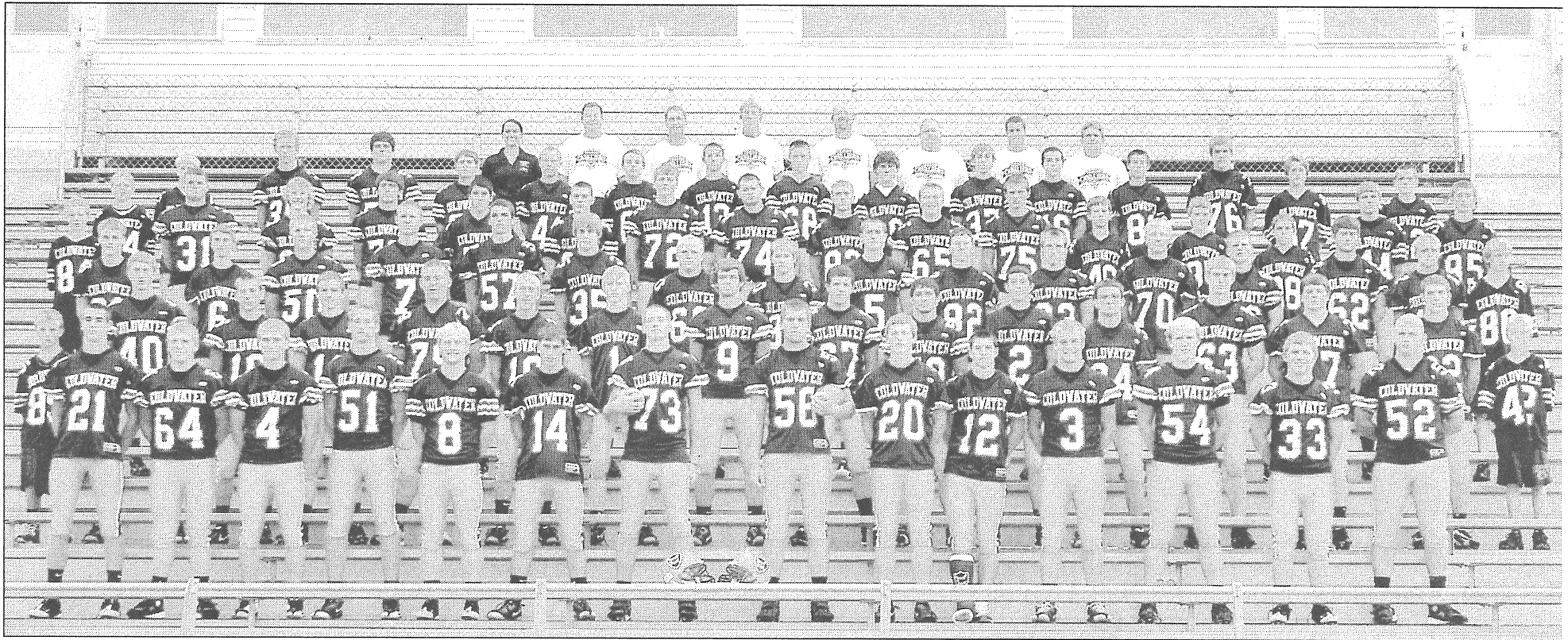

2010 Coldwater Football

Otten ready to continue Coldwater tradition

COLDWATER — As the Coldwater football team gets ready for 2010, there are some significant changes.

The most notable of these is the death of long-time coach John Reed in May after battling cancer.

Replacing Reed, who guided Coldwater to a pair of state championships and three state runner-up finishes in his 15 years as a Hall of Fame coach, is long-time Cavalier assistant Chip Otten.

There are a few changes, but one thing that won't change is the commitment to discipline.

"It is different and new, because without coach Reed, it's just different," said Otten. "We've tried to keep those similar philosophies that coach Reed has brought to us with the discipline, treat-

ing each other with respect, helping each other and not being selfish and helping the team first.... Those things have not changed. We have pretty much the same staff, with Jeff Kerr joining us. Chuck Alig (former Coldwater wrestling coach and football assistant coach) helping us some, which has been great. Again, it is a little different because coach Reed's personality is a little different than mine."
OFFENSE

The question about who would take over at quarterback with the graduation of all-Ohio

Keith Wenning was a popular topic even before conditioning and 7-on-7 drills.

That intrigue into Wenning's replacement got more intense when Ethan Bettinger broke his ankle early in camp, taking him out for at least the first half of the season and likely the majority of

the 2010 campaign.

Bettinger's injury led the Cavaliers to look at Austin Bruns to take over signal-calling duties.

"Austin, physically, can definitely do it," said Otten. "At Greenville (first scrimmage) he was 15-for-23 on his first day out, which is pretty outstanding for a young guy."

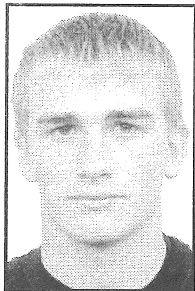
Bruns will have some talented receivers and backs in the Cav-Gun offensive set.

with 10 scores. Kurt Schoenherr added 713 yards on 54 catches and six scores. Drew Feltz (122 yards, 1 TD) and Nate Kaup also return with experience at wideout.

Aaron Rammel (465 total yards, 8 TD) and Ross Wermert (329 total yards, 5 TD) will handle the running chores and also offer the versatility it takes to play the position in Coldwater's offense. Dustin Gillis and Drew Klosterman will split time at the fullback spot.

"That crew (offensive skilled positions) is really good. That's also pretty much the core of the (defensive) secondary, along with a couple of guys helping out," said Otten. "That certainly helps Austin knowing there is some guys who have been out there and can keep things calm in the huddle. They are also guys you know that if you throw it to them, they'll catch it."

The offensive line brings back some experience, with Brad Buening starting at center. The guard spots are being contested by the likes of Brad Gilliland, Kyle Post, Alex Grieshop, Ryan Seas and Mark Brunet. Nick Gilliland — twin brother of Brad — and Cody Homan are penciled in to start at the tackle spots.

DEFENSE

While Otten would like to two-platoon, there will be some

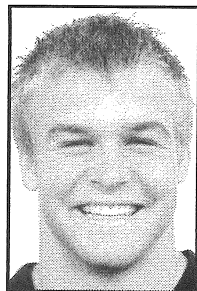

players that will see action on both sides of the ball.

Post (34 tackles in 2009) will line up at defensive end with the Gilliland twins battling with sophomore Jordan Harlamert for the other end spot. Gillis will handle one of the interior tackle spots with a by-committee rotation for the other spot. Those in contention for playing time alongside of Gillis will be Homan, Seas and Grieshop along with sophomore Alan Kunk.

"Ideally, we'd like to have all O-linemen and D-linemen just playing one way," said Otten. "Probably can't do that full time, but hopefully we'll be pretty close by the time we get going."

Rammel is the top return-

ing tackler with 93 from last season and will be starting at inside linebacker in the 4-4-3 set. The other three linebacker spots will be up for battle among several players, including Drew Klosterman, Jordan Klosterman, Jordan Chapin and Zach Dickman.

Klenke's three interceptions led the defense last season as he returns to the Cavaliers'

secondary. Caleb Siefring, Feltz and Wermert each added a pick a year ago. Troy Otten, son of the coach, will be looking for time at a corner spot as well.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Otten was 55-of-64 on PAT kicks last season and added a field goal to finish with 58 points in 2009. Matt Kramer and Kyle Bergman are also

contending for kicking time as well.

Alex Stammen, Harlamert and Vince Droesch are contenders to handle long-snapping chores for kicks and punts.

Rammel, Bruns and Dickman are the contenders to punt while Rammel and Wermert will be returning kicks for the Cavaliers.

2010 Kickoff Edition

A NEW ERA: This Friday night Coldwater will kick off the 75th season of football for the Cavaliers. It will also mark the beginning of a new era as former assistant Chip Otten assumes the head coaching position taking over for the beloved John Reed who passed away on May 7th after a courageous battle with cancer.



Coach Otten is a graduate of Coldwater High School where he played quarterback under the guidance of his father, Head Coach Barney Otten. During Coach Otten's 8 seasons as an assistant he coached defensive ends, guards and centers. On game nights he could be found in the press box on the other end of the headphones coordinating the offense with Coach Reed. During that period the Cavaliers were 100-9, with 4 state appearances, and 2 State Titles (2005, 2007). Coldwater won the MAC title 5 times and also had 5 undefeated regular seasons.

This will be Coach Otten's second stint as a head football coach. From 1995-2000 at Middletown he compiled a 26-34 (43%) record. He also served as an assistant at Middletown from 1987-1994 and at Valley View in 2001. He played college football and graduated from Bowling Green State University where he was awarded a scholarship at Quarterback. He served as a graduate assistant there as well as at Ball State and Indiana University. Currently, Coach Otten is a physical education and health teacher at Coldwater Exempted Village Schools.

He and his wife Diane have four children.

FAMILIAR FACES: The loss of Coach Reed leave some large shoes to fill. Coach Otten has said that can never replace Coach Reed he can only assume his position. Fortunately, the most successful assistant coaching staff for the past 10 seasons in the state of Ohio with a 123-15 record is returning in full. When speaking of his staff during a recent interview, Otten said, "All the coaches are coming back obviously with the exception of John. There's obviously going to be challenges in there because they're used to John and now I guess I'm a very different personality than John, so hopefully we can continue the same basic philosophical things with maybe different personalities doing that."



The defensive mastermind Tim Hoyng is returning for his 34th season, Randy Wright (26), Jerry Kanney (14), Jason Hemmelgarn (12) and Thad Forsthoefel (7) round out the veteran staff. They will be joined by first year coach Jeff Kerr.

Not much will change as far as managing the team is concerned. Fans can expect to see the same level of discipline they saw during the Reed years. You will see little things that are more a reflection of Coach Otten's easy going style, but make no mistake; intensity will remain a key attitude in Cavalier football.

PLAYERS TO WATCH: Every season Coldwater has to reload to some degree. The interior lines seem to be where graduation hits hard and this year is no exception. But the Cavs always manage to find a group of seniors that put in a lot of hard work in the offseason and do what needs to be done to give the skill positions a chance to perform. This year Coldwater returns a number of players who saw significant playing time last season and they will be the ones to watch this year.

Leading the way will be Reese Klenke (WR/DB 6-4, 185, Sr.) who caught 61 passes for 834 yards and 10 touchdowns last season. He will be joined by Kurt Schoenherr (WR/DB 5-11, 165, Sr.) who caught the ball 54 times for 713 yards and 6 scores.

Aaron Rammel (LB/RB 6-0, 190, Sr.), who was the second leading rusher last season with 315 yards and 7 touchdowns will be the workhorse out of the backfield at least in the early going. Ross Wermert (RB/DB 5-11, 170, Sr.) should prove to double the running threat. Last season he rushed for 122 yards and had 207 receiving yards. As a senior he will be called upon to raise his game.

The biggest hole to fill will be the one vacated by All-Ohio's Keith Wenning. The leading candidate heading into two-a-days was Ethan Bettinger (QB 5-



11,175, Sr.) who only completed 10 passes for 25 yards last season. But that situation was dealt a blow as Ethan suffered a break in his lower leg during the first week of practice. Look for Sophomore Austin Bruns to get the starting nod during the first few weeks of the season. When you first see Austin you will think they cloned Keith Wenning as it was hard to tell them apart last year save for their jersey number. Bruns at 6-4 will be the QB of the future but Bettinger at 5-11 will challenge him once he returns from his injury.

The offensive and defensive lines will have some senior leadership to look to as Kyle Post (6-1, 220), Nick Gilliland (6-5, 215) and brother Brad Gilliland (6-5, 215) will return with a lot of experience to draw upon.

A CHALLENGING SCHEDULE: This season will see a re-arranged schedule as the MAC enters the third season where schedules are re-balanced such that the teams with the best records over the past two seasons will not play the teams with the worst records during the same period. The MAC is renowned as one—if not the—toughest conference in the state. Coldwater will be challenged not so much by who is on the schedule but the order in which they play. Week one starts off with a very talented Kenton team followed by the home opener with Ben Logan, playing the final year of a two year contract. Then the MAC season begins with Anna and then St. Henry, two teams the Cavs faced during last season’s playoffs. Next is a rising Versailles team followed by Parkway. League favorite Delphos is next followed by Marion Local, two teams which also went far down the tourney trail last season. If the Cavs can gain significant

success in the first eight weeks of the season they can use the final two games versus New Bremen and Minster as tune-ups for the playoffs.

Regarding the schedule Otten reflected, “Right off the bat, we have Kenton, and they have probably one of the best quarterbacks in the state (Maty Mauk), That’s a huge game for us because they’re a division above us, and they’re going to get a ton of points for us if we can beat them. The league is very difficult. Fortunately I guess for this year, almost everybody lost a lot of good, key players with the exception of probably Delphos (St. John’s). Delphos has the most coming back. They did lose they’re quarterback, but they’ve got a ton of guys coming back, so that’ll be a huge hurdle. And of course, just like always, St. Henry, Marion Local, Anna, Versailles is really improving and getting close to back maybe where they were four or five or six years ago. The league is just tough; you just have to go in there every week and keep plugging away.”



FIRST UP—KENTON: The 2010 season starts off with the traditional match up with the WBL’s Kenton Wildcats. The Cavs are 9-1 in season openers versus the Cats and last year defeated Mike Mauk’s boys from Putnam County 29-22 for the eighth straight time. Coldwater is 17-9 all time verses Kenton.

Kenton is the defending champion in the WBL, going 9-0 in league action last season. They won on the opening weekend of the playoffs but lost in week 2 to finish the year at 10-2.

Cavaliers Stumble Out of the Gate

The Chip Otten era got off to a stutter-start Friday night as the host Kenton Wildcats defeated Coldwater for the first time since 2001 by a score of 50-31.

The game featured two high octane offenses. The Cats were led by Maty Mauk who accounted for 510 of Kenton's 552 yards of total offense. The Junior threw for 437 yards on 38-59 passing and five touchdowns and he added 73 yards on the ground in 21 rushes scoring two more touchdowns.

Coldwater can take solace in that they may have found a quarterback in Sophomore Austin Bruns. The youngster was 22 of 46 passing for 229 and five touchdowns. Four of those five scores were to Senior Reese Klenke who caught 13 passes for 204 yards. The other touchdown was scored by Senior Ross Wermert.

Inexperience and injuries hurt the Cavaliers in this game. Three Cavaliers including Seniors Aaron Rammel and Kurt Schoenherr left the game with injuries and did not play in the second half.

Coldwater got off to a fast start in the first scoring on two possession to take a 13-6 lead into the second period, but Kenton got on track in the second and scored three times, taking a 31-19 advantage into the locker room at half time.

Coldwater hoped to rebound as they were to receive the second half kickoff but Kenton pulled an on-side kick out of their bag of tricks and derailed the Cavaliers, going up 36-19 with less than two minutes gone in the second half.

The never quit attitude that is a hallmark of Cavalier football showed as

they continued to fight the up hill battle. The Cavs held Kenton scoreless the rest of the third quarter and pulled to within two scores at 36-25. Wermert scored his touchdown with nine minutes to play and the deficit closed to 36-31.

But Mauk engineered two touchdown drives in the last five minutes to put away the Cavaliers.

The Cavalier offense looks like it will compete in a manner fans have become accustomed to. Bruns spread the ball around hitting seven different receivers and five rushers added 85 yards on the ground accounting for 334 yards of total offense.

The defense will have to make some adjustments though as 552 yards of total defense is too much, especially in a conference featuring spread offenses. But it is early and this team is sure to improve..

Factoids:

As stated earlier this is the first opening loss since 2001 versus Kenton which is also the last time the Cavs lost consecutive games. Like this season the 2001 loss to Kenton was preceded by a state final loss to Ursuline the previous season. "It's Déjà vu all over again" said Yogi Berra.

The last back-to-back defeats in the same season game in 1997 in weeks 10 & 11 against Delphos and Versailles.

Honors:

The Kenton Athletic Department paid special tribute to Coach Reed prior to the game. They also donated \$600 to the John Reed Memorial Scholarship Fund. Also, the Cavs sported "JR" stickers on the back of their helmets.

Next Week:

Coldwater will look to rebound against visiting Benjamin Logan next week at Cavalier Stadium. The Raiders are coming off a 2-8 season in 2009 and they got off on the right foot Friday night defeating Riverside 42-14.

Senior running back Landon McKirahan scored four touchdowns and rushed for 128 yards to lead Ben Logan whose offense tallied 333 yards, all of which came on the ground.

"Landon is a special athlete and has been working hard," said Ben Logan head coach Carleton Cotner.

Coldwater Posts First Victory in 2010 Campaign

The Coldwater Cavaliers got back on the winning track Friday evening defeating the visiting Ben Logan Raiders and giving Coldwater native Chip Otten his first victory as Head Coach of the Cavaliers. Both team's records now stand at 1-1.

The offense was nearly flawless recording 424 total yards including 239 yards on the ground. This is the most rushing yards in a game since 2007 versus Minster (236). Nine different Cavs dented the rushing column lead by Aaron Rammel with 68 yards on six carries, Drew Klosterman (6-64), Austin Bruns (5-45) and Ross Wermert (8-42).

Bruns was a solid 10 of 16 passing for 185 yards. Reese Klenke was again his favorite target snagging 4 balls for 126 yards.

All the scoring came via the rush with Wermert scoring twice and Rammel, Klosterman and Dustin making the most of his one tote for 1 yard and a TD.

The Coldwater defense was stellar allowing just 131 rushing yards to a Raider offense that put over 300 rushing yards and 45 points on the board in week one. With only 40 yards passing Ben Logan tallied just 171 total yards and no touchdowns. It was the first shutout for the Cavalier D since the Hamilton Badin game in week 11 last season.

And now the fun really begins...

Rockets On The Pad for MAC Liftoff. The MAC schedule begins this week as the Cavaliers will travel to Anna to face the Rockets. The next two weeks will feature rematches between to MAC foes the Cavs met during the playoffs last season. Coldwater and Anna hooked up in a week 12 affair which the Cavs won in overtime 28-21. Anna has some

young talent stepping up to replaced some seasoned graduates from last seasons 9-3 squad. In the first two weeks of this year they have looked strong defeating Sidney Lehman 29-7 and throttling Sherwood Fairview 55-14.

Since joining the MAC in 2006 Anna has not defeated the Cavs and stand 0-5 overall. Coldwater is one monkey that they would like to get off their backs and last season's playoff loss must still sting. So the Cavaliers have their work cutout for them.

MAC 'Preseason' Results. After going 7-3 in the first week of the season the MAC completed non-league action at 13-7. Anna, Ft. Recovery, Marion Local, St. John's and Versailles all went 2-0. Coldwater, St. Henry and Parkway finished 1-1 and Minster and New Bremen failed to post a victory.

WTLW Honors Coach Reed. This past weekend WTLW television in Lima announced the formation of the *John Reed Leadership Award*. In consultation with John son David Reed, WTLW will present this award to an area high school sports coach who best exemplifies the traits that were demonstrated in the life of Coach Reed. Kudos to the folks at WTLW for honoring Coach Reed in this way and may this award inspire current and future coaches to see that sports are a tool one can use to prepare students for the challenges of life after high school.

The Anna Rockets had a milestone victory Friday night as they defeated the Coldwater Cavaliers for the first time in team history by a score of 38-28.

The youth of the Cavalier squad showed for the first time this season as too many mistakes and a run of early turnovers put the Cavs in a hole that they were unable to climb out of. But make no mistake, they never gave up and outscored the Rockets over the final three quarters.

The first 14 minutes saw the Rockets score four times. Two of those scores followed Cavalier turnovers. Dexter Bensman cut back against the grain of the defense for a 64 yard score and on the first play of Anna's next possession Gage Beasecker swept around the left side of the line and found no one covering the corner. Sixty eight yards later and the score was 28-7 with only 2 minutes gone in the second quarter.

of 39 passing for 352 yards and three touchdowns. Those three TDs were snagged by a determined Reese Klenke. Reese had another stellar night as he caught 11 passes for 201 yards. Drew Feltz caught another 4 passes for 108 yards. Coldwater's other was scored by Aaron Rammel on a 5 yard run.

The loss drops Coldwater to 1-2 on the season for the first time since 1994. Dropping the first game in the MAC will make success in the remainder paramount if the Cavs wish to contend for a league title.

The Backyard Battle #39. This week the Cavaliers tee it up with neighboring St. Henry in the 39th renewal of their classic rivalry. The Cavaliers have won the last 14 meetings including a 47-41 quadruple overtime battle in week 13 last season. Coldwater leads the series 27-10-1.

Both teams are equally matched with sophomore quarterbacks and both teams losing just about the same number of seniors from last year's squads. This should be another exciting matchup.

It will be an emotional night for Cavalier fans as Coldwater High School will honor Coach John Reed in pregame festivities.

Cavaliers Tame the Unbeaten Tigers

Coldwater moved their record above the .500 mark as they defeated the Versailles Tigers by a score of 24-7. The victory moves the Cavaliers to 3-2 and 2-1 in the MAC. The Tigers drop their first game of the season and fall to 4-1 overall.

Coldwater opened up the scoring on it's third possession going 77 yards in two plays. Austin Bruns hit Kurt Schoenherr on a passing covering 72 yards. Aaron Rammel rushed the last five yards to put Coldwater up 7-0 after Troy Otten's PAT.

On their next possession Coldwater drove into Tiger territory and Otten kicked his first field goal of the season from 35 yards and the score was 10-0.

Midway through the second quarter Bruns threw an interception and Versailles took over at midfield, driving the ball to the Coldwater seven. The Cavalier defense came up huge and stopped the Tigers on fourth down at the 2 yard line. Rammel was the force on this drive as he rambled 53 yards to the Tiger 42 and three plays later covered the last 19 yards to make the score 17-0 after Otten's second PAT.

Versailles was finally able to score late in the second quarter and the score was 17-7 at half time.

The game was pretty much decided as Coldwater took the second half kick-off and drove 65 yards in eight plays to close out the scoring.

Aaron Rammel led the Cavalier offense with 87 yards rushing on 13 carries and scoring all three Coldwater

touchdowns. Austin Bruns was 8-14 passing for 180 yards and one interception. His receiving corps was led by Schoenherr with 2 catches for 72 yards and Caleb Sieftring caught 2 balls for 47 yards. The Tigers double teamed and harassed Reese Klenke all night and he only caught one pass for 35 yards.

Kyle Bergman made his debut as the punter and was solid with 6 punts averaging 38 yards which was huge as Versailles consistently suffered from poor field position.

The Coldwater defense was solid as well. The first five Versailles offensive possessions were short and sweet, 1-2-3 punt. Overall the Cavs limited the Tigers to 303 yards on 72 plays for 4.2 yards per play.

Coldwater now has won the last six matchups with the Tigers and have close the series gap to 25-28-2.

The victory also helped the Cavaliers in the computer rankings. Currently Coldwater is ranked 5th right behind Versailles. MAC foe Anna has dropped to ninth.

Next up for Coldwater is Mercer County rival Parkway (2-3). Last week Parkway defeated Ft. Recovery 21-15 The Panthers are currently suffering a 0-21 losing streak to Coldwater and have not defeated the Cavs since 1988 when Ronald Reagan was president and gasoline was \$1.08.

Coldwater Defeats Parkway

Coldwater improved its record to 4-2 and stayed in the hunt for a MAC title at 3-1 as they outplayed an undermanned Parkway squad 42-0. The Cavs outperformed the Panthers, but they looked a little sluggish at times. Maybe they are looking ahead to the next couple of weeks—more on that later.

It was the passing attack that led the way again as Senior Ethan Bettinger returned from a broken ankle suffered in the preseason and shared the quarterback duties with Sophomore Austin Bruns. The two signal callers combined for 302 yards and five touchdowns.

Bruns started the scoring, completing a 8 yard pass to Aaron Rammel just 3 minutes into the contest. With just over 2 minutes remaining in the first quarter Bettinger hooked up with Reese Klenke for 16 yards.

Just three minutes later, Dustin Gillis took his only carry of the night over from the one yard line and Coldwater moved up 21-0. They took that score the locker room at halftime.

The second half opened as Coldwater took the kickoff and completed their longest scoring drive of the night - 7 plays covering 65 yards. The final 35 yards came as Bruns hooked up with Klenke again and the score moved to 28-0. With just over a minute remaining in the third Bruns completed his third touchdown pass, a 21 yard toss to Klenke.

The final period opened with Coldwater's final scoring drive as Bettinger

returned and completed the longest pass play of the evening hitting Klenke for 74 yards.

Individually, Bruns was 13-24 passing for 173 yards and three touchdowns. Bettinger was sharp in his first action of the season hitting 5 of his 6 passes for 129 yards and two scores.

Klenke had his best night of the season snagging 10 balls for 227 yards and four touchdowns. Drew Klosterman added 59 yards on 7 carries. Aaron Rammel and Ross Wermert added 37 & 25 yards respectfully.

Troy Otten has become a solid kick specialist this season as he connected on all six of his extra points and run his consecutive extra point streak to 15.

The Cavaliers now turn their attention to the most difficult part of the 2010 schedule. Next Friday they travel to Stadium Park to take on the #1 team in Division 6, the Delphos St. John BlueJays. The following week they will host Marion Local. St. John and Marion Local both sit atop the MAC with unblemished 4-0 (6-0 overall) records. Winning both these games will vault the Cavs to first place with two games remaining (New Bremen & Minster). Lose one and they will need some help. Loose both and the only hope for continuing to week 11 will be some unpredicted results in Region 20 of Division 5.

Coldwater, Versailles and Anna are currently 5-6 & 7. Ben Logan has provided some good second level points for the Cavs as they are 4-2.

Cavaliers Shoot Down the Flyers

The Coldwater Cavaliers played their finest game of the season and it came at just the right time as they shocked the previously undefeated and #2 ranked Marion Local Flyers 42-21.

The loss knocks the Flyers out of a first place tie with Delphos St. John. Those two teams meet in Maria Stein next week and the Flyers will need a victory to regain a share of the MAC crown.

The victory was big for Coldwater as it will move them up to fifth place in the Region 20 computer rankings as Marion will deliver precious level 2 points to the Cavs.

The game began with Coldwater taking the opening kickoff 86 yards in 10 plays as Austin Bruns hit his favorite receiver Reese Klenke from 19 yards out to set the score at 7-0.

Marion was equal to the task as they took the ensuing kickoff and marched 81 yards in 11 plays to knot the score at 7-7.

Later in the first, Coldwater pinned the Flyer at their own 8 yard line following a 64 yard punt by Kyle Bergman. On the next play the Coldwater defense made their only glaring mistake of the night as Greg Schwieterman got behind the defensive backs and Ryan Mescher hit him in-stride with a perfect pass and 92 yards later the Flyers led 14-7.

Midway through the second the flyers cashed in on a Cavalier turnover

and with under six minutes remaining in the first half the Flyers led 21-7.

It was at this point that the Cavaliers appeared to rekindle that never-say-die flame that was lit by the late head coach John Reed. Taking the ball from their own 34 Coldwater sprinted 66 yards in just 5 plays and when Bruns found Kurt Schoenherr from 14 yards out the half ended with the Cavs down by just one score at 21-14.

The second half was total domination by Coldwater as they scored 28 unanswered points on 21 and 91 yard touchdown strikes from Bruns to Klenke. Meanwhile Aaron Rammel and Ross Wermert added 1 yard and 29 yard TD runs respectively as the Cavaliers closed out the victory by a final score of 42-21.

The defense for Coldwater was stellar as they held the Flyers to just 34 yards of total offense in the second half until the final 6 minutes when Marion took the football and drove 82 yards to the Cavalier 1 foot line before turning the ball over on downs with about 2 minutes remaining.

With the victory Coldwater moves into a three way tie for third place in the MAC with Anna and Minster.

Next for Coldwater is a road trip to New Bremen to face the 2-6 Cardinals.

Later Bettinger hit Kurt Schoenherr on a five yard scoring pass followed by Jordan Klosterman picking off a New Bremen pass and taking it 40 yards to the house to close out the first half with Coldwater leading 42-0.

Coldwater's reserves saw significant playing time in the second half with

Eric Schmackers scoring on a 12 yard rush to set the final score.

Troy Otten converted all seven of his PAT attempts. Since missing three of his first 10 attempts this season, Otten has converted 26 consecutive extra point attempts. Also, three of his eight kickoffs were kicked into the end zone for touchbacks.

Cavaliers Defeat Wildcats - Look Forward to Playoffs

The Coldwater Cavaliers defeated a much improved Minster Wildcat squad 40-20 at Coldwater Stadium in the regular season wrap up of first year Head Coach Chip Otten.

The victory brings the Cavaliers to 6-2 in the MAC and 7-3 overall, good for a second place tie with Marion Local and Anna. Minster finishes 5-3 (5-5) good for third place. Despite their .500 record the Wildcats will also advance to the playoffs next week also.

Minster was quite fired up and ready to play as they took the opening kick off and drove 80 yards in 8 plays to light the scoreboard first.

Coldwater opened the second quarter driving 89 yards in seven plays as Austin Bruns found Ross Wermert from 8 yards out. Troy Otten missed the PAT (why did I mention his streak of 26 last week?) and the score was 7-6.

On the very next series Wermert stepped in front of a Minster pass and took it 28 yards to the end zone to make the score 12-7 as the pass attempt on the PAT fell incomplete.

On the Cavaliers next possession they drove 65 yards in just five plays as Wermert scored again from 1 yard out and on Otten's successful PAT the score was 19-7.

Both teams traded touchdowns in the third quarter as Bruns found Kurt Schoenherr from 17 yards out and Minster scored on an 18 yard pass to set the score at 26-13. But Coldwater found pay dirt one more time, a 68 yard bomb from Bruns to Otten. Bruns found Klenke in the corner on the PAT and that set the score at 34-13 after three quarters.

Both teams scored once more in the fourth period as Wermert scored on

a five yard run. It marked Wermert's fourth touchdown on the evening.

Minster score late in the game to set the final margin at 40-20.

The game was much closer stat-wise than the final score would indicate. Minster was balanced as they rushed for 210 yards on 44 carries plus 157 yards through the air which totaled 367 yards on 65 plays (5.6 yd average). Were it not for three interceptions by the Wildcats, the game would have been much closer.

Meanwhile the Cavaliers did it as they usually do, through the air. Bruns was 18 of 27 for 338 yards and three touchdowns. Bruns added 49 of Coldwater's 82 yards on the ground. The Cavs finished with 420 yards on 51 plays for an average of 8.2 yards per play.

The victory secured a #5 seed in Division 5, Region 20 for the Cavaliers and it sets up a rematch Anna. It will be second trip to Shelby County for Coldwater.

Anna won the regular season match up 38-28 in week three. Coldwater got off to a slow start that night as they spotted Anna a 28-7 lead two and a half minutes into the second quarter. Coldwater cannot afford to extend to Anna that kind of cushion next week.

Other MAC teams to make the playoffs include MAC champion Delphos St. John and Marion Local which places half of the leagues representatives in the playoffs.

We should also recognize the fine season that Ben Logan had. Finishing 7-3 is a marked improvement from last seasons 2-8 record.

Cavaliers Ground the Rockets

For the second season in a row, the Coldwater Cavaliers knocked the Anna Rockets out of the playoffs, this time by a score of 27-17.

In week three the Rockets used big plays to put the Cavs into a deep hole that they could not recover from. But their second meeting did not provide the same big play opportunities. The Coldwater defense allowed the Rockets to run 69 plays, (22 more plays than the Coldwater offense) for an average of only four yards per play. The longest play they allowed was a 25 yard late in the game.

Anna's three scoring drives consumed 37 plays and major chunks of time from the game clock. By contrast three of four Coldwater scores came on drives of 2, 6 & 2 plays, proving that extended time of possession on the offensive side must be accompanied by a defense that protects the end zone and Anna could not do that.

Coldwater did have an 11 play scoring drive late in the game which sealed the victory, but it was a six minute, 10 play drive that only netted 32 yards and no score which demonstrated that the Cavalier offense could chew up time as well.

Anna opened the scoring with a 35 yard field goal. Coldwater answered right away in just two plays including a 68 yard touchdown pass from Austin Bruns to Kurt Schoenherr. The officials

said the PAT kick was wide and the first quarter ended with Coldwater on top 6-3

Anna opened the second quarter with a four yard TD to go back on top 10-6. Later Drew Feltz snagged a pass on the Anna sideline, sidestepped a defender and sprinted to the end zone for a 27 yard score that gave the Cavs a 13-10 lead at half time.

Coldwater added to their lead early in the third as Aaron Rammel took a pitch from Bruns around the left side of the line and crossed the goal line just inside the pylon to push the Cavalier advantage to 20-10.

Late in the third Anna scored for the last time on a 10 yard pass play to close to within three at 20-17. But Coldwater answered with Schoenherr's second touchdown pass from six yards out to close out the scoring.

On the night Bruns was 13 of 18 passing for 225 yard, three touchdowns and no interceptions. The backfield of Wermert, Rammel and Bruns provided a balanced rushing attack with 40, 37 and 29 yards respectively.

The receiver corps were led by Schoenherr with 112 yards on four catches and two TDs. MAC Co-offensive player of the year Reese Klenke had five catches for 59 yards. Feltz added two catches for 39 yards and one score.

The Cavalier defense spent a lot

of time on the field but came up big picking off 3 Rocket passes, one each for Wermert, Feltz, and Caleb Siefiring.

All tolled the Cavalier offense ran 47 plays for 337 yards (7.1 avg) while Anna tallied 282 yards on 69 plays (3.9 average).

The victory propels Coldwater to the regional semifinal against 6-5 Hamilton Badin at Sidney's Memorial Stadium. Read more about Badin on page 2.

Coldwater Rallies to Defeat Upstart Hamilton Badin 13-7

For forty-six minutes of the Division 5 Region 20 semifinal the Coldwater offense struggle to find consistency. Try as they might they just could not drive the ball deep into Hamilton Badin territory. But with 2:13 remaining in regulation and facing a 7-0 deficit and elimination from the playoffs, the Cavaliers dug deep and in the face of adversity drove the ball down the field and into Coldwater football history.

In the first half Coldwater could do no better than the Badin 49 yard line. Meanwhile Badin loitered at Coldwater's end of the field and could do no better. Badin did reach the Coldwater six on one drive but came away empty. The game became a defensive struggle and the half end in a scoreless tie.

Badin scored their first possession of the second half as they drove 35 yards in six plays ending on quarterback Jeff Smith's six yard scramble to give the Rams a 7-0 lead. And Coldwater continued to struggle well into the 4th.

Badin's last possession in regulation found them with a fourth and 1 at the Coldwater 11 with 2:13 left to play.

They had been pounding the ball up the middle all night long and their fans were calling for the Rams to go for the first down. But the Badin coach's choose to kick a field goal. Freshman kicker Tyler Williams who was kicking for Luke Wurzelbacher who was nursing a sore hip, performed well in his first start, but he was too aggressive this time and his kick sailed wide left.

"I was a little surprised that they kicked it," Coach Otten said. "But if he makes it, it's the ball game." The miss gave Coldwater one last shot and it began the most important two minute drill in recent memory.

Let's just call it "The Drive": Austin Bruns started the Cavalier drive at the

20 yard line and in eight plays drove them to the Badin 35 yard line. On the eight play of the drive Bruns took a nasty hit and was knocked out of the game.

Insert senior signal caller Ethan Bettinger who lost the starting QB job in the preseason when he broke his ankle. Facing a fourth and 15 he rolled to his left and found Aaron Rammel in the left flat and completed a 23 yard pass to the Badin 13. A false start penalty moved the ball back to the 18 with 8.9 seconds remaining in the Cavaliers' season.

When Coldwater needs a big play there is one go-to guy and that's All MAC wide receiver Reese Klenke. Bettinger found Klenke in the right corner of the end zone and he made a diving catch. After Troy Otten's PAT kick the score was tied at 7-7 with 3.4 seconds to play. The ensuing kickoff ran out the game clock.

Coldwater won the overtime coin toss and choose to go on defense first. Badin managed to get one first down but their drive stalled at the 8 yard line and this time Wurzelbacher was called upon to kick a field goal. His hip injury must have proved too much as the kick barely cleared the line of scrimmage and bounced harmlessly through the end zone.

The Cavaliers only need two rushing plays from the Wildcat formation as Aaron Rammel bulldozed his way into history from 15 yards out to secure the unexpected 13-7 victory.

It was the third time in three matchups that Coldwater came away with a victory. They defeated Badin in week 11 last season 41-0 and in the Regional final in 2001 23-3.

The final stats were as close as the final score. Coldwater had 33 rush yards and 205 passing for 238 yards on 61 plays. Badin rushed for 184 yards

and finished with 234 total yards. Badin intercepted three Bruns passes but could not turn those into points.

Next week: Next up for Coldwater are the undefeated Mid-State League / Cardinal Division champion West Jefferson Roughriders. The game will be played at Good Samaritan Stadium at Clayton Northmont. This is Jefferson's fifth straight playoff appearance for what has been an historically successful program.

Reflections: The conventional wisdom before this season began was that this was going to be a down year for Coldwater football. After graduating 22 seniors from last season's state runners-up squad and with the tragic loss of beloved head coach John Reed one could rightly forecast that this season would not rise to the level that Coldwater fans have become accustomed.

The only ones that believed in what this team could accomplish were the players and the coaching staff. I am sure that there were moments of doubt like the 1-2 start or the dagger that Delphos St. John delivered to MAC title hopes. But beginning with week 8 and Marion Local, this edition of the Cavaliers have reminded us all of the lessons learned in those 15 seasons under Coach Reed's leadership.

Never give up. Respect your opponents, but never fear them. Remember that you are a family. Stand arm in arm with your brother and do everything you can to make each other successful.

As the Cavaliers prepare for their fourth straight region final (the 7th in 8 years) we would do well to remind ourselves of these lessons again and no matter how the rest of the season turns out be thankful for success and lessons learned.

West Jefferson No Match for the Cavaliers

Hey Coldwater fans! If someone told you 13 weeks ago that your Cavaliers would be returning to the State Football Finals for the third time in the last four years, what would your reaction have been?

Well after a 44-12 spanking of the previously unbeaten West Jefferson Roughriders, that is exactly where your Cavaliers find themselves.

Under the guidance of Chip Otten (who really should be given serious consideration as D5 Coach of the Year) they find themselves one win away from returning to Canton.

West Jefferson though highly successful in the past few years, just did not have the horses to keep up with the likes of Rammel, Wermert, Klenke, Chapin, Harlamert and Bettinger.

Coldwater scored three times in the opening quarter on a 23 yard run by Aaron Rammel, a 26 yard pass from Ethan Bettinger to Reese Klenke and on a punk blocked by Jordan Chapin and recovered in the end zone by Jordan Chapin. Rammel scored again on a 33 yard scamper in the second quarter and the Cavaliers went to the locker room leading 28-6 at half time.

The Coldwater defense turned in their finest performance of the season as they only allowed 41 yards and one first down in the first half and finished the game allowing only 169 by an offense that averaged 381 yards per game. The only gave up four first downs and picked off three passes.

The Cavs put up three more scores in the second half as the defense got in on the action when Rammel picked of a pass and returned it 21 yards to advance the lead to 35-6.

In the fourth quarter Ross Wermert scored from 26 yards out to make the score 41-12. Late in the game the Cavs drove 55 yards in nine plays and rather than add insult to injury settled for a 20 yard Troy Otten field goal.

On the night Rammel led all rusher with 72 yards on 7 carries. Bettinger threw for 107 yards on 13 of 25 passes and two touchdowns. The Coldwater offense tallied a total of 320 yards on 56 plays (5.7 average).

The victory gives Coldwater 10 wins on the season continuing a streak of eleven seasons of double digit wins.

Going to State: So the improbable season for the Cavaliers continues with a state semifinal matchup with the Fredricktown Freddie's, champions of the Mid Buckeye Conference and Region 19 and undefeated at 13-0.

Fredricktown is located near Mount Vernon just north of Columbus. Their community was struck by tragedy recently when three murder victims were found in a woods near Mount Vernon in a story which made national headlines. We hope that the success of the Freddie's has give their community a respite from these horrors.

They have a couple of players who line up at quarterback, Ryan Logan (42/77 for 592 yards, 8 TD, 2 INT) has a strong arm and throw the ball downfield. Also Tyler Hathaway (Reg: 40/49 for 719 yards, 4 TD, 2 INT) has taken most of the postseason snaps but will move to a receiver spot in some situations.

They have two solid running backs too. Led by sophomore Matt Smith

(Reg: 257 carries, 2240 yards, 8.7 avg, 27 TDs) who is small and elusive and Austin Hoeflich (Reg: 130 carries, 792 yards, 6.1 avg, 12 TDs) who is solid at fullback and was voted the MVP by his teammates.

Hoeflich also leads their defense with 192 tackles, 11 for loss and 4 sacks. He is was voted the Central Districts co-defensive player of the year.

The Fredericktown defense has forced 10 turnovers while remaining turnover free on offense in the post season.

The defense will line up in a 4-3 but it will look like a 4-4 when a safety or corner blitzes as they do on most plays. Their defense is said to be fast and always running to the ball.

They are lead by first year head coach Brian Baum who says that they want to run a balanced offense by the run is by far the better part of their game as they only attempt about 10 passes per contest. Like Coldwater their o-line is bit small, but they make up for it with tenaciousness.

This is Fredericktown's 1st trip to the state semis. They lost in the regional final in 2007 and 2009.

All Northwest District Team: A number of Cavaliers received more post season honors last week as Reese Klenke was name to the first team offense and Aaron Rammel was named to the first team defense. Kyle Bergman and Kyle Post were named to the second team defense while Austin Bruns and Jordan Chapin were special mention.

Coldwater Defeats Fredricktown - We're Going to Canton!

The most improbable season in Cavalier history will continue after Coldwater defeated the Fredricktown Freddie's in a Division 5 state semifinal by a score of 26-6.

The victory propels Coldwater to a rematch of last year's championship game with The University of... err excuse me... Youngstown Ursuline who defeated Lima Central Catholic in the other half of the D5 bracket 51-36.

The game was pretty much decided in the first half as Coldwater scored three times to take a 21-0 lead at half time. The Coldwater defense which by far has been the key to the Cavaliers success this post season allowed a potent Freddie offense only four first downs and 45 yards of total offense in the first half.

Fredricktown had scored over 40 points in nine of their previous 13 games and at least 28 points per game in the post season.

Their leading rusher, Matt Smith who tallied over 2000 rushing yards this season, only managed 59 yards on 18 carries. The Freddie offense was led by Tony Lybarger who had five catches for 107 yards.

On the night Fredricktown posted 66 yards on the ground and 151 through the air for 217 yards. Their downfall were mistakes made deep in Coldwater territory, two of three lost fumbles and two interceptions.

Reese Klenke was the Cavaliers leading performer as he snagged eight passes for 188 yards and two touchdowns, an interception and a tackle of quarterback Ryan Logan for a safety.

Coldwater opened the scoring just 57 seconds into the game as Ethan

Bettinger found Klenke on a 60 yard pass only three plays into the game. Troy Otten's point after kick was wide right and Coldwater led 6-0.

Midway through the first, Bettinger found Klenke again from two yards out to cap a 8 play 63 yard drive. Otten made good this time and the score was 13-0.

The Freddie defense as putting seven to eight players in the box trying to stop the run. Coldwater noticed this and bided their time, knowing that at just the right moment, they could exploit this mistake by the Freddie's.

In the middle of the second quarter and facing a 2nd and 12 at their own 48, the Cavaliers put three receivers wide left including tailback Drew Klosterman. Bettinger threw Klosterman a backwards pass which looked like a screen to the defense who reacted to the ball leaving Kurt Schoenherr all alone down the left side line. Klosterman completed the pass for a 52 yard score and after Bettinger ran in the two point conversion, Coldwater led 21-0

In the second half the defenses stiffened as neither offense could muster a drive. Coldwater choose to keep the ball on the ground and just run out the clock. The Cavs did add five points on the safety and a Troy Otten 36 yard field goal to set the score at 26-0.

Fredricktown's first team did score on Coldwater's second team with 1:45 to play on a gadget play when Lybarger hit Smith in the end zone on a 23 yard pass. The two point conversion pass fell incomplete and the final score as set at 26-6.

Ross Wermert and Ethan Bettinger

had 43 and 27 yards rushing. Bettinger completed 10 of his 22 passes for 122 yards and two touchdowns with one interception which was the Cavaliers only turnover. As a team Coldwater had 81 rushing yards and 174 passing yards for a total of 255.

Statistically the game was close, but turnovers and the inability to penetrate the red zone cost the Freddie's their only loss of the season. They close their most successful campaign in school history at 13-1.

As for Coldwater, the journey continues. Since opening the season at 1-2 losing to playoff teams Kenton and Anna, they have gone 10-1, losing only to Delphos St. John who will be playing in the D6 final next Friday morning in Canton.

At 11-3 the Cavaliers advance to their first back-to-back state final in school history and their sixth state final overall. They won state titles in 2005 & 2007. Their playoff record now stands at 41-13.

As for this year's senior class, they are playing in their third state final, no other class has done that. They also have a record of 50-7.

Cavaliers Fall Short In State Title Game

The morning broke under sunny skies in Canton and though the temperatures were low the spirits of the Coldwater Cavaliers were high. They had reached the OHSAA State Football finals for the second year in a row after a season that early on looked like some of them would be playing basketball in early December instead of football.

But it turned out the road to the state title was maintained by the defending champion Irish of Youngstown Ursuline. Just like last season the Irish brought a team that was few in number but loaded with talent and the result was another 30 point defeat of the Cavaliers, this time by a score of 51-21. It could have been worse, but credit goes to the Irish who in the second half used up the play clock and kept the ball on the ground, running most plays up the middle into the heart of the Cavalier defense. Most of the fourth quarter featured the backup squads for both teams.

The Irish were led by 2010's Mr. Football Akise Teague who carried the ball 19 times for 248 yards and 4 touchdowns on runs of 46, 65, 17 & 42 yards. He also scored on the third play of game; a 73 yard pass reception. Add in his kick return yards and Mr. Football recorded 387 all purpose yards. OSU Coach Jim Tressel was in the press box for the first three quarters. Is there a scarlet and gray uniform in Teague's future?

The Irish complete the season at 15-0 and winners of their third consecutive state title.

As for the Coldwater Cavaliers, they close out the most unexpected season in school history. After graduating 22 seniors from last season's

state finalist and the emotional loss of Coach John Reed last spring, this season looked like more of a rebuilding year. And yet, they won 11 of their 15 games which is about 3 or 4 more wins than most people expected. They played in back to back state finals for the first time in school history and have participated in the state finals 3 of the last 4 years and 4 of the last 6.

Head Coach Chip Otten and his staff including Tim Hoying, Randy Wright, Jason Hemmelgarn, Jerry Kanney, Thad Forsthoefel, Jeff Kerr and Chuck Alig are to be praised and congratulated for the job they did this season. Considering the cloud under which the season began including injuries to key players and a 1-2 start, things could have really fallen apart. But the coaches kept the boys focused on the foundational principles that Coldwater football has been build upon since Coach Reed came to town 16 years ago. Their student-athletes never stopped working, never gave up, never stopped believing in the dream and in the end they did not lose a football game, they were simply defeated by a more talented team. Are they disappointed? Certainly, but they should not be the least bit discouraged.

As for this day, the Cavaliers were led by Reese Klenke who caught 8 passes for 125 yards and all three of Coldwater's touchdowns. Kurt Schoenherr also caught 4 passes for 66 yards and Alex Stammen 3 for 27 yards. Ethan Bettinger eluded great pressure from the Irish defense and completed 18 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns. The other touchdown pass was a 24 yarder from Aaron Rammel. Rammel also

had 51 rushing yards and Ross Wermert added 23 yards.

This season closes out a great run that saw Coldwater win 50 of 58 games during the last four years. Those 58 games represent the most participated in by a senior class at CHS. Keep in mind that the most games one can see is 60, based upon a 15 game schedule (including playoffs).

So as we close the book on the 2010 season we congratulate the class of 2011; Aaron Rammel, Kurt Schoenherr, Ross Wermert, Ethan Bettinger, Nate Kaup, Drew Feltz, Reese Klenke, Dustin Gillis, Brad & Nick Gilliland, Ryan Seas, Kyle Post, Cody Homan and Brad Buening.

We say "job well done". You have much to be proud of and what you have learned these past four years playing football at Coldwater High School will serve you well.

There's a force behind Coldwater's success

My first high school football game as a professional sports writer took place 13 years ago in a little hamlet on the Ohio-Indiana border.

I was in Fort Recovery to cover Coldwater and the home school in their Midwest Athletic Conference opener. It was a nearly competition-free contest. The Cavaliers won 41-7 in a game that could have been 441-7.

It was also the first time I worked with John Reed. I'm glad to say my first impression didn't last.

On initial glance, he was a stereotypical football coach. A little gruff. A lot to the point. In the next three years, I came to find how wrong that was.



I bring it up this week because Fredericktown will play the program he built on Saturday night in a state semifinal game.

And because in May -- just two weeks after missing an invitation as the guest of honor at the Ohio State spring game -- John Reed died of esophageal cancer. He was 64.

You could discuss the results and records, sure. Reed guided Coldwater to the state title game five times and won twice, 2005 and 2007, both times over Youngstown Cardinal Mooney. His Cavaliers won conference championships and made routine trips to the playoffs.

But he was the consummate credit deflector. After a win, it was always a version of how well the kids played. After a loss, it was always a version of what the coach should have done better to put them in a position to win.

Also, always, how proud he was of his team.

I learned quickly to respect his football knowledge. His squads, depending on the opponent, ran everything from the spread to a power run game to the option. They always executed whatever game plan was designed.

Beyond that, one of the things that always struck me was Coldwater's entrance to the field. A line of players, side by side in pairs, walking until they hit the goal post. It was a

disciplined look that gave the impression that everyone in orange and black knew something you didn't. Then they sprinted on the field and won, most of the time.

His players answered his requests with a simple "Yes Sir." It was the only place I've ever seen seniors carry out risers for the team photo while freshmen watched. His program was that kind of group. No one questioned the guy at the top.

Coldwater grew to love its coach while I gained more respect for him every season. In 13 years as a writer -- 12 spent mainly around high school teams -- I never saw a more disciplined program. The danger with some teenagers is their natural urge to cut loose. This was the most structured high school program I ever covered and the kids would have eaten rusty nails if he asked.



That's what made me believe the guy had something others do not. I've only been around one other program in 13 years, four different stops on the vagabond newspaper train and countless seasons that has matched the success this program has seen. That program had nowhere near this kind of structure.

John would probably wince if he knew I was saying this, but some of that was because of the guy in the headset. It doesn't hurt to have players like Ohio State linebacker Ross Homan in your program, either. That's what he'd say. You could talk about what part he played in the structure of the program and he'd list all of the terrific athletes he coached in Coldwater. It's a long list, too.

If you attend the state semifinal on Saturday and take your Freddie rooting interest along, remember this about the team you hope to see lose. These are kids who went through something that impacted them deeply six months ago. There aren't many high school kids who have watched their coach wilt away.

John was a deeply religious man. He used to pray before each game that the better team would win.

Saturday, I think that's all we can hope to see.

Hoyng gives Cavaliers experienced voice

COLDWATER — Walk the halls of Coldwater High School and try to find someone who remembers the Cavalier football team without defensive coordinator Tim Hoyng. They are hard to find.

Hoyng is completing his 33rd season as football coach at 11 a.m. Saturday when Coldwater will face Youngstown Ursuline in the Division V state championship at Canton's Fawcett Stadium.

Hoyng began his coaching in the fall of 1977 as a junior high football coach. He moved to the varsity and was the head coach for two different stints — 1986-87 and 1990-1994. Hoyng was the head coach when the Cavaliers made the playoffs for the first time in 1986. Hoyng's first season was current Coldwater head coach Chip Otten's senior year at Coldwater.

"I did all the play calling (both offense and defense)," Hoyng said. "It led to some stress. I didn't have time to think."

Hoyng's teams went 33-37 during his head coaching tenure. In 1995, Hoyng stepped aside and made room for Coldwater's new head coach, John Reed.

"I helped interview John as part of the process and that went well," Hoyng said. "We went to a clinic and met in a back room and talked defense the whole time. The rest is history. It was a great time and great relationship. My niche is as an assistant and I feel blessed that John had enough confidence in me as a defensive coordinator."

Despite the numerous years on the sideline, Hoyng has not lost his passion or emotion for the game. Since 1995, Hoyng's defenses have giving up fewer than two touchdowns per game on average in 10 seasons and they have never given up more than an average of 19 points per game in a season.

"He's a great in-game coach because he's prepared," Coldwater coach Chip Otten said. "Preparation is huge and he has a great feel during the game on when to change things and call things. He make's kids accountable for playing at a high level regardless of the situation."

In addition to coaching football, Hoyng is also a track coach. He has been a part of three state track championships (1994, '95 and '96) and two football state titles (2005 and '07).

“What’s incredible to me is his dedication and loyalty to Coldwater,” Otten said. “He’s coached multiple sports and won multiple championships. He’s seen the highs and the lows. His work ethic and attention to his responsibility is incredible.”

Much of the Coldwater success, according to Hoyng, is the closeness of the coaching staff that has more than 100 years’ experience with the Cavaliers.

“From the get-go, John and I had a great relationship,” Hoyng said. “Then we put all the pieces of the puzzle together — Coach Jerry Kanney, coach Chip Otten, coach Randy Wright, coach Thad Forsthoefel, and coach Jason Hemmelgarn. Continuity is important in everything. You learn how each coach acts and reacts. It just works — that’s the best way to say it.”

With years of experience and hundreds of games under his belt, Hoyng is surprised by this year’s team’s success.

“I told my two sons when we were 1-2 that this was the first November that I’d be off,” Hoyng said. “(The turning points were) the Delphos game defensively and the next week (Marion Local). From then on we just caught fire. I didn’t see it coming and it took a caliber of teams like Delphos and Marion to say we’ve got a chance.”

Saturday, Hoyng and the Cavalier defense will face one of their biggest challenges as they face 2010 Mr. Football, Akise Teague and an Ursuline offense that averages 457 yards and 41 points per game.

“This is one of those games where you want to control him, corral him, pursue and not miss tackles, but that’s a lot easier said than done,” Hoyng said. “We’ll have to play a great game and they’ll have to play a subpar game. We won’t back down.”

With 33 seasons of coaching nearly complete, does Hoyng see 34 in his future? He admits the thought of retirement crossed his mind when Reed died in May.

“I feel blessed that I’ve been healthy,” Hoyng said. “I love coaching. Few jobs in life can get the adrenaline pumping on a Friday night. John and I always said we’re in this together, but I knew Chip was going to do a great job.”

Remembering Coach John Reed

On September 17 the Coldwater will face neighboring St. Henry at Cavalier Stadium. On that evening the community will honor John Reed who coached the Cavaliers for the last fifteen seasons. A graduate of Upper Sandusky High School and Southwestern Oklahoma St. he earned his Master's Degree at St. Francis College.

After graduation from college he started his teaching career at Montpelier High School and was their head baseball coach for a few years. In 1973 he took over as the head football coach at Parkway High School and in his first season finishes 10-0 and won the inaugural MAC football championship. Over five seasons his teams were 43-6-1 and won three MAC titles.

In 1978 Reed moved on to Marion Harding High School where success was hard to come by and over five seasons was 20-30. Next he returned to his hometown Upper Sandusky and again struggled to develop a winning program. In five seasons at his alma mater he was 21-29.

Things began to turn around in 1988 when he moved on to Lebanon High School. Over six seasons his record was 31-30 and he made his first appearance in the state playoffs. But as gridiron success returned, off the field, some folks did not like the way John mixed his faith and his teaching/coaching duties and after the 1993 season he was fired. It was probably the lowest point in his professional career and the 1994 season found John Reed sitting on the sidelines without a team to coach. Then came a call from Eric Goodwin, Athletic Director at Coldwater High School with an offer to return to MAC country and coach the Cavaliers.

In 1995 the Cavaliers were 10-3 and advanced all the way to the State Semifinals. In 15 seasons at Coldwater Coach Reed was 168-31. He led the Cavaliers to 6 MAC titles, 2 OHSAA State Championships and 3 State Runner-Up titles and four Associated Press Poll titles. His greatest honor came in 2007 when he was inducted into the Ohio High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame. His overall record of 283-126-1 places him 11th all-time in the state of Ohio.

Coach Reed certainly excelled at football and he enjoyed coaching, watching and talking football. He sought the council of other coaches and was a frequent presenter at the Ohio Football Coaches Clinic held each spring at The Ohio State University. He counted many famous coaches among his friends including Jim Tressel of OSU and Joe Tiller formerly of Purdue University.

John grew up as a boy in the football crazy state of Ohio during the days when Woody Hayes stalked the sidelines at Ohio State and the conventional wisdom of the time was that the best coaches were former players. It would surprise many to learn that John

Reed, Hall of Fame football coach and a man who in years to come will be considered a legend in Ohio Football never played a down of organized football in his life. He never wore thigh pads or donned a helmet. In high school he could be found on the football field, not as a member of the football team but rather as the drum major in the band! One of his prized possessions is a drum major's baton, a gift from Ohio State University.

For the vast majority of those who have heard of John Reed he will be remembered as a football coach, but that is not how he wanted to be remembered. For John football was a means to an end. Whether coaching football, teaching history or providing guidance as an academic counselor, John's desire was to serve his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ and to make His name known. His knowledge and love of Holy Scripture was vast and he stood on many a Sunday morning behind a pulpit teaching and exhorting others to make a relationship with God the most important achievement in their lives. In the final years of his life he had the opportunity to co-pastor Covenant Community Church in Coldwater.

In the fall of 2009 John began to have discomfort in his abdomen and chest. Initial diagnoses were gall bladder problems, reflux and the like. But soon it was found that a tumor had lodged in his esophagus. Early treatments appeared to be successful, but unfortunately cancer can be as hard to catch as an elusive tailback. It spread throughout his body and by Easter of 2010 it became apparent that John would soon be called home. Despite all the suffering from treatments and the cancer itself, John continued to teach the Word and used every opportunity to witness for his Lord.

John used to tell his players "Respect everyone. Fear no one." He fought cancer with the same determination. In his final days he looked forward to leaving this life and going home to Heaven where all the pain would be gone. His greatest desire was that those he knew and loved would accept God's gift of salvation so that they too would see Heaven as well.

One of John's favorite scripture passages is found in Hebrews chapter 11 verse 6 where it says "...without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him."

John Reed's legacy will live on through The John Reed Memorial Fund Scholarship. This organization will award academic scholarships to students who demonstrate Christ centered academic and athletic excellence.
