CAVALIERS ARE OPTIMISTIC AS THE 2012 SEASON APPROACHES

As he enters his third season at the helm of Coldwater Cavalier football, Coach Chip Otten is "cautiously optimistic" about how the coming season will unfold.

Otten has been successful at maintaining the high level of performance that Coldwater fans have become accustomed to. With back-to-back 11-4 seasons and a pair of Division 5 state runner-up trophies, Coldwater is the most successful high school football program in the state of Ohio winning 145 games since 2000 and making 15 consecutive playoff appearances.

And if somehow the Cavaliers can return to Canton this year, the senior class of 2013 will become the first class at Coldwater High School to play in 60 football games and four consecutive state title games. A number of key returning Seniors will give Coldwater a shot at achieving that mark including...

* Quarterback Austin Bruns (6'4-205) has 55 TD passes and 5,378 yards passing the last two years.

* Wide receiver/cornerback Caleb Siefring (5'10-170) is the leading pass catcher with 18 TDs and 7 interceptions.

* Running back/safety Jordan Chapin (5'10-175) has over 200 tackles including 124 last season to go along with 6 fumble recoveries.

* Linebacker Zach Dickman (6'1-220) has 143 tackles.

* A lineman on both sides of the football, Jordan Harlamert (6'1-235) was All MAC last season with 67 tackles and 5 sacks.

These five young men are all three year starters and will have to provide leadership for this team both on and off the field. Other returning starters include center Mike Rios (6'1-205), All-State punter Kyle Bergman (6'0-175), defensive tackles DT Alan Kunk (5'10-215) and Cody Madaj (5'7-215).

Of the best football conference in Ohio, the MAC, Coach Otten stated, "The MAC conference looks to be strong again. Several outstanding, big, strong QB's return this year."

When asked what it will take to be successful this season Otten replied that the Cavs, "must strive to become better, enjoy the journey, and DTIFG, don't take it for granted."

Over the summer Coldwater and Columbus Bishop Hartley signed a two year agreement to play football during week two of the 2013 and 2014 seasons. In 2013, Coldwater will travel to Columbus Bishop Hartley and Hartley will return the favor in 2014

Columbus Bishop Hartley won the Division IV State Championship in 2010 and was the Division IV Poll Champion in 2011 before being defeated by Kenton in the Regional Finals 30-28.

Coldwater's 10-game schedule in 2013 will feature six teams that have won state championships in the past 10 years. Kenton, Hartley, Versailles, Delphos St. Johns, St. Henry, and Marion Local.

The 2012 schedule will be nearly identical to 2011. The season opens at the home of traditional rival and 2011 state runner up Kenton. Then Hicksville, who Coldwater defeated in the State Semifinals

last season, comes to Cavalier Stadium. Then the MAC gets underway as the Cavaliers will alternate road and home games each week beginning at Versailles followed by St Johns, Minster, St Henry, Anna, Marion Local and Parkway. The regular season will close when Ft Recovery returns to Cavalier Stadium for the first time since 2007.

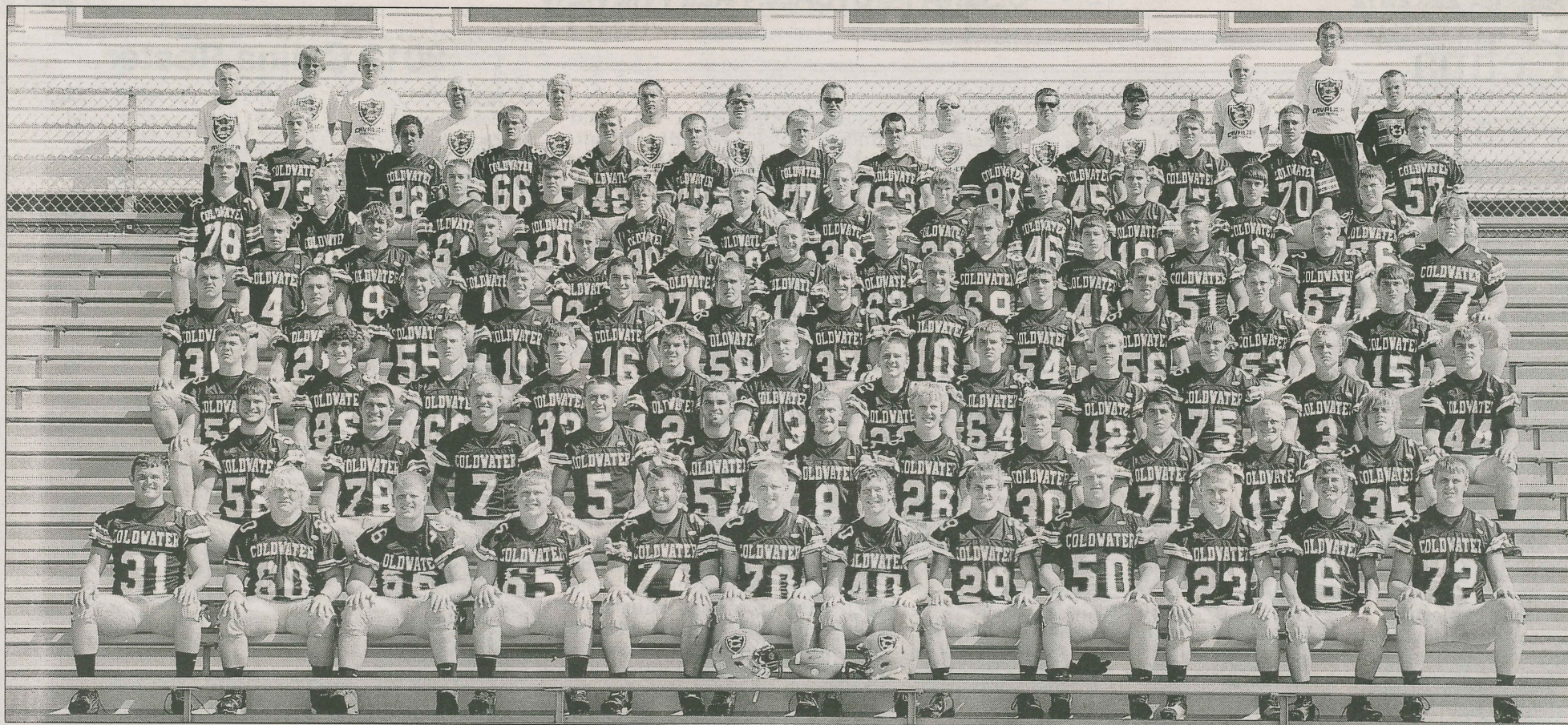

Coldwater loaded for another special season

COLDWATER — The Coldwater football team has a wealth of experience for the upcoming 2012 season as 23 seniors, most of whom will either start or see significant playing time, dot the roster for coach Chip Otten.

“A lot of our best players from last year are returning,” said Otten, who has a 22-8 record in his first two years

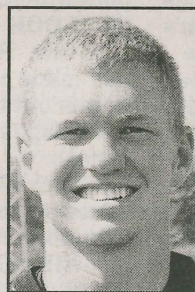
at Coldwater. “Certainly they have leadership, and hopefully, they have improved. They’ve gotten a little bit bigger and stronger. Hopefully, they can carry that over.”

OFFENSE

Austin Bruns will look to cap off a strong three-season run as the Cavaliers’ quarterback after having already thrown for over 5,100 yards with 50 TDs in the last two seasons.

“He’s gotten better. He went

to a lot of camps, so I think he learned a lot there,” said Otten of Bruns. “Two years ago, he was just out there playing and surviving (after getting the job in camp after an injury to Ethan Bet-

tinger in the preseason). Last year early, he was doing too much, but once he got comfortable, he started playing well in the playoffs. This year, (with) all that experience, he knows what we’re trying to do.”

Coldwater also welcomes back some solid returning receivers in the Cav-Gun offense. Caleb Siefring had 852 yards receiving a year ago with 16 touchdowns and Josh Huber added 623 receiving yards

with Jordan Chapin contributing 213 yards as the scatback in the spread offense. Kyle Post, Mitch Schoenherr, Adam Klosterman, Drew Otten and Christian Schramm will also be threats for the Cavs as receivers.

"All those do a great job catching the ball," said Otten. "We've probably got 10-12 guys (that) we're not afraid to put out there."

Otten notes the running game could use a step up this season after averaging just 115 yards per game last season. Chapin (368 yards, 4 TDs) will look to be the main rushing threat, but Mitch Feltz, Grant Muhlenkamp and Derek Collet could also work their way onto the field. The Cavs have been utilizing some double tight end packages with Zach Dickman and Josh Forsthoefel.

"We've got three backs that have done a good job: Mitch, Chap and Grant. Those three guys will hopefully be able to mix and match. When you get right to it, it comes to the O-Line guys," said Otten.

The Cavaliers' offensive line is an experienced group. Mike Rios will be the center with Jordon Harlamert and Jake Kramer set at the tackles. Kyle Bergman will set up at one guard spot with seniors Nick Albers, Ryan Thobe and Kyle Boeckman in the running for the other opening at guard.

DEFENSE

The Cavaliers allowed just 12.6 points per game last season and will bring back the majority of last year's starters.

Inside linebacker Zach

Dickman had 143 tackles a year ago while Chapin added 124 tackles at a strong safety. Chapin may end up playing more toward the line of scrimmage as a linebacker on some plays.

The defensive line will feature Alan Kunk and Cody Madaj (67 tackles) with Harlamert working either inside or on the end. Vinny Droesch, the long snapper for the special teams, will contend with Kramer and Andrew Schwieterman for the other end spot.

Joining Dickman at linebacker in the 4-4 set will be Derek Collet on the inside with Brent Collet, Schoenherr and Forsthoefel on the outside.

"Zach's our anchor man," said Otten. "He calls all the plays and knows everything that's going on."

The depth of the skill players on offense will also help make up the foundation of the Cavaliers' secondary. Siefring earned first-team All-Ohio honors at defensive back a year ago after intercepting seven passes. Huber added six picks of his own at the other cornerback spot while Brody Hoying will see some secondary time as well.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Bergman earned first-team All-Ohio honors at punter last season and will take over PAT chores as well this season. Otten noted that he had a kicker in each class with

Matt Kramer (junior), Hoying (sophomore) and Kyle McKibben (freshman) that could also be available if needed.

OUTLOOK

With an experienced roster returning after three straight trips to the state championship game, the Cavaliers are poised to make another long run in the postseason.

Otten thinks that another

trip to state is possible, as is winning the Midwest Athletic Conference for the first time since 2008. The two keys, though, are keeping the players focused and avoiding injury.

"We feel like we have a good team, but you have to go out there and do it," said Otten. "On paper, it looks good. But it doesn't always

work that way. We have to keep them healthy and keep them focused.

"That's always the hardest part (keeping the players focused). They hear a lot from everybody 'Hey, you guys are supposed to win the league', but you still have to go out there and do it and keep trying to improve so you can do it."

Coldwater is **Chip Otten's** second stint as a head football coach. A graduate of Coldwater High School he played quarterback under his father, Head Coach Barney Otten. He played college football and graduated from Bowling Green State University. Later he served as a graduate assistant at BGSU as well as at Ball State and Indiana University.

His first experience as a Head Coach was from 1995-2000 at Middletown where he compiled a 26-34 (43%) record. He also served as an assistant at Middletown from 1987-1994 and at Valley View in 2001. He returned to Coldwater as an assistant to John Reed in 2002. During these years the Cavaliers were 100-9, with 5 MAC championships, 4 state appearances, and 2 State Titles (2005, 2007).

Coach Otten became head coach at the recommendation of Coach Reed in the spring of 2010, shortly before Coach Reed passed away of esophageal cancer.



Tim Hoyng is a graduate of Coldwater High School and Wright State University. This is his 36th season at Coldwater. He is currently the Defensive Coordinator and served as head coach from 1990-1994.



Randy Wright is a graduate of Huron High School. He attended Ohio Northern and Bowling Green State University. This is his 28th season at Coldwater.



Jason Hemmelgarn is a graduate of Coldwater High School and attended Bowling Green and the University of Dayton. This is his 14th season at Coldwater.



Thad Forsthoefel is a graduate of Coldwater High School Bowling Green State University. This is his 9th season at Coldwater.

Cavaliers sporting yellow to support player's father

To show their support for a teammate and his family, the Coldwater football team will go to any lengths.

Even adorning their orange-and-black uniform with a little bit of yellow.

Since midway through the season, the football team has worn bright yellow socks to honor Ty Boeckman, the father of senior lineman Kyle Boeckman and president of the Coldwater Athletic Boosters.

After battling cancer several years ago and being in remission, Ty Boeckman was diagnosed with liver cancer this year and has been going through chemotherapy and other treatments to battle cancer for a second time.

It was before the Minster game that a couple of Kyle Boeckman's close friends on the team, Zach Dickman and Kyle Post, came up with the idea of showing support for Ty Boeckman, who would be missing the game due to treatment.

"We thought we should do something for him," said Post, a senior wide receiver. "We decided to wear yellow socks, yellow being the color of (liver) cancer (awareness). We thought that would be a good idea for us."

Parents bought the socks and dyed them bright yellow for the seniors to wear for awareness. The game was postponed due to lightning, but the players sported the yellow socks the next day when the game was resumed. Since the Cavaliers won, the players continued to wear the socks.

"I had no idea," said Kyle of the move of his teammates "That was pretty cool."

Originally, the seniors sported the socks, but enough socks were dyed for all the team members to wear.

"I thought we'd wear (the socks) one game," said Post. "Big thing on this team is keeping family number one."

Coldwater's head coach Chip Otten isn't surprised that his team would rally around a teammate and his family.

"This group of seniors, and juniors, really get along well," said Otten. "They all know Kyle's dad. He really put in a lot of time to help these guys with all kinds of things. It's a little show (of support) to him that everyone's thinking about him."

The movement carried through the community. Fans were encouraged to wear yellow for the Cavaliers' home game with St. Henry a week later. The Coldwater High School Marching Band, of which Ty's daughter Amber is a member, placed a yellow capital T on their hats. A blood drive was held in Ty's honor and McSober's started a "Ty Tuesdays" when a percentage of their sales goes towards the family.

"They definitely appreciate it," said Dickman, a senior linebacker. "You could just see it when we were out there in our yellow socks. (During the game where fans wore yellow), you could see the emotion from the family and on Kyle's face. It was touching that we could do that for them."

Even while going through treatments and the toll of the disease, Ty Boeckman is still rooting on the Cavaliers. At the remaining home football games, Ty sat in the press box to avoid the cold and weather. Ty attended last Saturday's win over Covington in Dayton.

"My dad loves Coldwater sports in general: from football to golf," said Kyle Boeckman. "It almost helps (in his battle). It makes him want to drive more with the whole community (supporting him). It means a lot for the sports he follows and watches are now dedicating to him. It almost fuels him to keep going."

"It's a good learning lesson," said Otten. "There's things more important out there than football."

Cavaliers Defeat Wildcats 41-22

The Coldwater Cavaliers successfully opened the 2012 campaign defeating the Kenton Wildcats 41-22.

It was not the prettiest of performances by a veteran Coldwater team, but playing on a hot August night after travelling well over an hour up to Hardin county; well, you take what you can get.

Both teams found it difficult getting started as the teams traded punts. But punting on fourth and long on their second possession, the Kenton punter shanked his kick and Coldwater got the first break as they started their second possession at the Cats 28 yard line. Five plays later Jordan Chapin got the first touchdown of the season going in from 7 yards out. Kyle Bergman's PAT made the score 7-0.

Kenton wasted little time as they needed only three plays to go 45 yards with Kenton QB Grant Sherman finding Justin Sawmiller on a 5 yard toss. The PAT pass failed and the Cavs led 7-6.

Then the Cavaliers took control. Over the next eight minutes the Cavs scored three times. Chapin dove in from a yard out and Caleb Sieftring caught passes from Brody Hoying - 35 yards, and Austin Bruns - 53 yards. Three more Bergman PATs and the score was 28-6 with 2:02 to play in the 2nd quarter.

The Cavaliers appeared to rest on their laurels at that point as the Wildcats recaptured the momentum and drove 72 yards on nine plays to score with 10 seconds left in the half and reduce the deficit to two scores 28-14.

In recent years, Kenton's kicking game has been well... how do you say this nicely? Unconventional? The Cats have not had a player with a good leg that can kick the football deep in to their opponents territory, so they have taken advantage of junk kicks and that is exactly what they did to open the second half. They caught the Cavaliers unprepared and the on-side kick rolled 15 yards and was recovered by Kenton.

Five plays later Sherman found Sawmiller behind the defense for a 34 yard

touchdown strike. The conversion pass was good and Kenton closed to within 6 points 28-22.

That was the last time the Cats would see the end zone the rest of the evening. Coldwater scored on a 11 yard Bruns to Chapin pass and Chapin completed a big night by scoring again on a two yard rush early in the fourth to set the final score at 41-22.

Though the loss was a disappointment for Kenton fans, they will find solace in the fact that they found a replacement for that long line of quarterbacks named Mauk. Grant Sherman, lets just call the 6'4" 200 pound junior "The General" from now on, was 30 of 54 passing for 288 yards and three touchdowns. He also led the Wildcat running game with 60 yards on 19 totes.

During the spring and summer the word was Kenton was moving to a more conventional spread and would be balancing the run with the pass. Forget that! Only one other Kenton player rushed the ball and that was a sweep for 18 yards. 74 plays from scrimmage and only 20 were rushes.

Coldwater was led by senior quarterback Austin Bruns who passed for 191 yards on 12-21 passing and 2 touchdowns. He added 47 yards on 14 rushes. Caleb Sieftring caught 5 passes for 148 yards and two scores. Jordan Chapin ran for 36 yards on 8 carries and 3 touchdowns. He also caught 2 passes for 32 yards and a fourth score. Game ball to Chapin.

The victory was the first over Kenton since 2009 and moved the Cavaliers to a 17-11 advantage all time.

Next week Coldwater opens the home portion of the 2012 schedule with their final scheduled meeting with Hicksville as the two year contact with the Aces expires this season. Though short the series has been memorable. There is a tremendous amount of respect between the coaching staffs. Last season Coldwater traveled to Hicksville and pasted the Aces 51-13, Coach Otten spoke to the Aces after that game and encouraged them to keep working hard.

They were 1-2 at that point and Otten told them how in 2010 the Cavaliers found themselves at 4-3 and on the outside looking into the playoffs. The Cavs made it to the state finals that season.

The speech must have inspired the Aces to some point as they turned their season around advanced to the State Semifinals where they met the Cavaliers again. The outcome was the same but the Aces had improved immensely.

It will be interesting to see what Hicksville brings this season. They were defeated by Archbold 19-14 to open their season. The Cavs are 5-0 all-time in the series.

Countdown to 500

The Cavalier program is now 495-262-21 all time. If they can win their first five games this season, they will enter the rivalry game with St. Henry looking for number 500. That should put some mustard on the Sept. 28 matchup!

Coldwater Too Much for Hicksville to Handle

The Coldwater Cavaliers moved to 2-0 with a 44-0 shut-out of an over-matched Hicksville Aces squad who fell to 0-2.

The battle only lasted for about 5 minutes as Coldwater saw a touchdown on their first possession wiped out by a penalty, but the second time they got the ball it only took 3 plays to cover 26 yards as Caleb Siefing hauled in a 29 yard pass from Austin Bruns to put the Cavs up 7-0. And the rout was on as Coldwater proceeded to score on their next five possessions to set the half time score at 37-0.

Austin Bruns tossed five TD passes including a 9 yarder to Christian Schramm, a 30 yard strike to Drew Otten, a second one to Siefing for 32 yards, and finally a 13 yard pitch to Mitch Schoenherr.

On the evening six different Cavaliers scored points for the home team and Bruns finished the night completing 17 of 20 passes for 278 yards.

Kyle Bergman kicked his first field goal of the year - a 34 yarder and Jordan Chapin scampered 24 yards for the only Coldwater score in the second half to set the final score at 44-0.

Hicksville only have 32 players on their roster and most of them played, but still 7-9 of those boys played both sides of the ball. It showed on offense as they could only tally 82 total yards on 41 plays.

Meanwhile, Coldwater had 10 different players rushed the ball 33 times for 209 yards; an average of 6.3 yards per carry. Likewise 10 different Cavs caught passes from Bruns and Matt Kremer who played most of the second half after many of the starters retired for the night.

Coldwater's total offense for the night totaled 520 yards on 58 plays; almost nine yards per play.

Coldwater now turns it attention to MAC play which begins next week at Versailles versus the 1-1 Tigers. Coldwater will be looking to even the series as the Tigers hold a 27-28 -2 edge. Coldwater won their regular season matchup last season 36-19 and shut-out Versailles in 43-0 in the second week of the playoffs.

MAC Preseason

The Midwest Athletic Conference completed the non league portion of the schedule going a combined 14-6. Versailles and St Johns finished 1-1 while Parkway and New Bremen failed to pickup a victory. Everyone else won both their games.

Coldwater Tops Versailles 21-7

Thanks to a storm front that moved through the Midwest Friday evening, the annual Coldwater - Versailles matchup took about twenty one and a half hours to complete. But when the teams returned to HB Hole Field on Saturday, the Cavaliers prevailed by a final score of 21-7.

Most of the football games played in western Ohio (at least those north of Dayton) experienced a weather related delay of some length. Many had to postpone the games for completion on Saturday.

As for this game the delay came at the 6:31 mark of the second quarter with Coldwater leading 7-0.

The Cavs and Tigers fought to a first quarter stalemate as the team traded possessions and field position. Versailles was forced to punt on their first possession. Coldwater responded with a serious scoring attempt on their first possession, driving to a first and goal at the Versailles 3 yard line. But a misplaced hand-off from Austin Bruns to Jordan Chapin resulted in a fumble which Versailles recovered at their 2 yard line.

The Tigers moved out the shadow of their end zone, but were forced to punt again. Coldwater regrouped at their 31 yard line. An 11 yard gain was enhanced by a 15 yard late hit penalty which put the ball on the Tigers 42 yard line. On the next play Bruns found Josh Huber wide open on the left side. Huber hauled in the ball and carried it into the end zone untouched to put the Cavs on top 7-0.

Play continued for another 5:20 when the officials spotted lightening in the western sky and sent both teams to their locker rooms. The wait and the lightening continued

for nearly an hour when at about 9pm the officials and school representatives concluded that the weather pattern was set to continue into the early morning hours and postponed the game until 3:30 Saturday afternoon.

When that time came the sky was partly cloudy and the sun was shining brightly. Versailles took the ball and continued a drive that started the night before and completed an 80 yard 14 play drive to score on a 19 yard pass from Nick Campbell to Jacob Barga to knot the score at 7-7 with 4:14 to play in the second.

Like the Tigers, the Cavaliers can out guns-a-blazin' too. On the ensuing drive they drive 80 yards in 11 plays as Bruns found Caleb Siefring on a five yard pass to score with 12 seconds left. Kyle Bergmans PAT was blocked and the half time score was 13-7.

Coldwater had scored on the final possession of the first half and were set to receive the second half kick off. Scoring on back to back possession which span half time is an opportunity that teams must take advantage of and the Cavaliers did. Jordan Chapin scored on 12 yard rush at the 8:43 mark of the third. Bruns found Chapin on a PAT pass attempt and the score was 21-7.

The rest of the second half was a defensive clinic by Coldwater as they stopped the Tigers each time they had the ball including a red-zone stop on Versailles final possession.

The game ended when at the :12 second mark of the fourth Kyle Bergman launched a booming 72 yard punt that the Tigers fielded at their own 15 yard line, but time ran out during the return.

Bruns finished the game 15 of 18 passing for 267 yards and 2 TDs. He ran for 34 yards and Chapin ran for 32. Josh Huber caught 5 passes for 169 yards and one touchdown.

Coldwater moved to 3-0 on the season and Versailles dropped to 1-2.

Next week 2-1 Delphos St John visits Cavalier Stadium. St John dropped their opener to LCC and have defeated Port Clinton and St. Henry. After 7 consecutive victories over the BlueJays, the Cavs dropped last seasons meeting 27-20. Coldwater is 22-14-1 all time versus DSJ.

Both teams entered the game with high expectations and experts were predicting a close game. But once night 'MO' momentum starts it's engine he's hard to stop. Coldwater scored on it first five possessions in the first 18 minutes of play and led 35-0 with 6:10 to play in the first half.

When the dust had settled Coldwater had sent Delphos packing by a final score of 41-6.

Coldwater excelled in every facet of the game. At the end of the first quarter Coldwater had run 14 plays covering 189 yards and led 21-0. Delphos ran 12 plays for just 10 yards.

At half time with the score 38-0 the Cavaliers had run 29 plays for 295 yards. The Jays had run 23 plays, for 41 yards and did not get a first down until the 1:07 mark of the second quarter.

Four of Austin Bruns first 6 passes when for touchdowns. For the game Bruns was 9 of 12 for 180 yards. Ten Coldwater players rushed for a total of 184 yards (4.3 yards per carry). Six Cavs caught 11 passes for 226 yards.

On the defensive side, the Jays who rely on the rush managed just 100 yards on 29 carries. Add 33 yards in the air and the Cav defense allowed a paltry 133 yards on 40 plays for just 6 points and 5 first downs. Super Sophomore Brody Hoying picked off two Blue Jay passes also.

Coldwater simply had more speed, more quickness, committed no turnovers and only punted twice. But don't write off Delphos or be surprised if they make the play-offs. They have a habit of getting better as the season goes on. Good thing for Coldwater they met in week 4, not that old traditional week 10.

To summarize the Coldwater attack; in the first quarter - four plays for 62 yards capped off by Bruns rolling left, untouched into the end zone from eight yards out. Coldwater 7-0 Bruns finds Mitch Schoenherr for a 52 yard strike. Four plays, 60 yards, 14-0.

Caleb Siefring got into the score-book catching two Bruns aerals. The first for 48 yards to finish a 4 play 57 yard drive. Early in the second quarter he snagged a 12 yard pass to cap a 5 play 27 yard drive to put Coldwater on top 28-0.

Josh Huber caught the final touchdown pass of the night from Bruns from 11 yards out to cap off a 6 play 33 yard drive. Coldwater 35-0.

Kyle Bergman added two field goals in the second (37 yards) and fourth quarters (22 yards) to close out the Coldwater scoring.

Delphos lone score came midway through the third quarter when Andy Metzger hit Mark Boggs for 14 yards.

Next week Coldwater travels to Minster, site of a stinging 22-6 defeat by the Wildcats to close out the 2011 regular season. Revenge is not something that Coldwater coaches will talk about this week. But you can be sure their performance in that game will be used as motivation for this year's match up. Coldwater owns the series 44-13.

Bits and Pieces

The Coldwater defense is solid through four games allowing only 35 points and 787 total yards.

The offense is getting off to strong starts having scored 116 of their 147 points in the first half. The second quarter is particularly strong with 75 points, over half their total.

Kyle Bergman is averaging 45.9 yards per punt and 53.6 yards per kick.

Bruns has thrown for 916 yards and 13 TDs and 2 interceptions.

Josh Huber has 15 catches for 299 yards and 2 TDs. Caleb Siefring is Bruns favorite target snagging 14 passes for 327 yards and 7 touchdowns.

Jordan Chapin has 106 yards on 20 carries and 5 touchdowns.

Coldwater Defeats Minster 34-6

For the second time in three weeks the weather postponed many of the area's high school football games. So after getting only three plays in on Friday (a kick-off and two scrimmage plays), the MAC matchup between the Coldwater Cavaliers and Minster Wildcats had to be restarted at 11am on Saturday morning.

Despite the postponement, the Coldwater offense fired on all cylinders. And the defense took Minster's best efforts, but thanks to untimely turnovers and dropped passes was able to hold a third straight opponent to just one score.

The game restarted with Minster unable to converted a 3rd down and they punted to Coldwater. The Cavs ran off six plays covering 58 yards with Austin Bruns scoring from the 1 yard line. Kyle Bergman made the first of four PAT kicks to set the score at 7-0.

Minster came right back, driving the ball inside the Coldwater 20, but on a sweep left the runner lost control of the football and it popped right into the waiting arms of Josh Huber who ran the ball all the way back for an 85 yard touchdown and Coldwater led 14-0 with 3:30 left in the first quarter.

On their next possession Coldwater drove 70 yards in just 7 plays as Kyle Post caught a pass from Bruns for a 28 yard touchdown on the first play of the second quarter.

That was all the scoring in the first half and the teams went to the locker room with Coldwater leading 21-0.

Coldwater opened the third quarter as Bruns connected with Caleb Siefring on a 48 yard pass to complete a four play 65 yard drive and the

advantage was 28-0 at 7:21 of the third quarter

The teams traded possessions through the rest of the third and the first 10 minutes of the fourth quarter until Coldwater's second team offense went on a 7 play 62 yard drive which ended with Drew Otten scoring on an 8 yard rush. The PAT kick was missed due to a bad snap and the shut out was in hand at 34-0.

But as ready as the second team offense was to play, the defense not so much. Minster's second team offense only needed one play as Scott Sekas ran untouched around left end and continued down the sidelines for an 80 yard touchdown. The PAT failed and the final score was set at 34-6.

For the game Coldwater compiled 394 yards of offense as Bruns completed 16 of 21 passes for 190 yards and two scores. The rushing attack logged 204 yards led by Mitch Feltz who came off the bench to compile 67 yards on 11 carries, Bruns added 54 yards on a dozen totes and Caleb Siefring tallied 48 yards on just three rushes.

As is their way, the 190 passing yards were distributed among multiple Cavalier receivers. Caleb Siefring lead the corps with 63 yards on 4 catches, Kyle Post 3-51, Mitch Schoenherr 2-30 and Brody Hoying 2-26.

The win moves Coldwater to 5-0 at the mid point of the season and Minster drops to 3-2.

In a surprise, Versailles defeated Marion Local 24-14 to drop the Flyers to 4-1, leaving Coldwater alone at the top of the league and in complete control of capturing an outright MAC championship.

Next up is the annual Backyard Battle with St. Henry at Cavalier Stadium. The Redskins are 4-1 after defeating New Bremen 49-7. They have also defeated Minster and St. Johns in the MAC. Should be a good one.

With the season at the halfway point Coldwater sits atop the standings in Region 20 ahead of Dayton Christian, Covington and Summit Country Day. MAC foes Anna and Versailles are in 6th and 12th respectively. Only five teams in the region remain undefeated after five games.

Coldwater Defense Solid in Win Over St. Henry

These days when you talk about football in America, be it High School, College or Pro, the focus always seems to be on the offense. We are always talking about the exploits of quarterbacks, running backs and receivers. Yes, you have to put points on the board, but it really is defense that wins championships.

Coldwater (6-0) took a step closer to their first outright MAC championship since 2008 with a 41-7 victory over rival St. Henry (4-2). It was the defense that led the way.

This season the starting Cavalier defense has only yielded two touchdowns since allowing three to Kenton in week 1. As a whole the Cav D has only allowed one score in each of the last four games.

On Friday night the defense came up big again. They shut down a quarterback that is one of the best in the MAC who is a potential D1 recruit and stuffed a running game that has ground up recent opponents.

Coach Tim Hoyng had his charges well prepared to face the Redskins as they yielded only 23 yards in the first quarter, 19 in the second, and just 35 in the second half before the 2nd team defense gave up a 9 play 67 yard touchdown drive to St. Henry's first team offense late in the 4th.

On the night the defense allowed just 32 rushing yards on 21 carries (1.5 yards per carry) and 70 yards passing with three interceptions by Josh Huber, Brody Hoyng and Jordan Harlamert. For the game St. Henry only managed 102 yards on 39 plays (2.6 yards per play).

One other item of note. The defense played with out the services

of Jordan Chapin who sat out his second game in as many weeks with a hamstring injury. Grant Muhlenkamp miss the game after a getting a concussion in last week's game. Then early in the game, on St. Henry's first punt, Caleb Siefring twisted his ankle and had to watch from the sidelines the rest of the night. Many younger players had to step in and answer the call.

On the offensive side Coldwater got a balanced attack as Austin Bruns threw for 195 yards on 17 of 20 passes with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Mitch Schoenherr led the receivers with 1 catch for 57 yards and a touchdown. Josh Huber caught 3 passes for 37 yards, Kyle Post 6 for 36 yards and Christian Schramm snagged two catches for 18 yards including a 16 yard TD catch.

As the Cavaliers charged out to a 24-0 halftime lead, the rushing game was called upon to pile up the yards and run down the clock. On the night 9 Cavaliers combined for 205 yards on 37 carries averaging 5.5 yards per tote. Bruns had 14 carries for 65 yards and two TDs. Mitch Feltz is proving to be a strong runner for his size as he racked up 63 yards on 14 carries and one score.

Kyle Bergman made his fourth field goal of the year (in four attempts) from 20 yards out. Matt Kremer, the backup to Bergman also kicked his first field goal of the year, a 27 yarder with plenty to spare.

The victory was Coldwater's 17th consecutive victory over St. Henry. The Cavs remain alone at the top of the MAC with just four games to play. Next up is Anna who is struggling having lost their last three games. Coldwater is 7-1 versus the

Rockets who joined the MAC in 2006. A victory will set a milestone in the history of Coldwater football as it will be their 500th. It would also be their 152nd win since 2000.

The playoff picture continues to evolve. Coldwater remains at the top of Region 20. Anna and Versailles sit at 6 and 8.

Coldwater Survives Anna and the rain 7-0

The 2012 season will provide many great memories for the Coldwater football team. It will definitely be remembered as one of the wettest seasons in recent memory too.

Friday night Coldwater had to adjust to the rain and an Anna offense that took advantage of the wet conditions but the Cavs managed to grind out a 7-0 victory.

Judging by the scores at other local games the field conditions at Anna were the worst in the area. Afternoon rains had left the field extremely soggy with water standing in many places. Of course both teams had to deal with it, but Anna appears to have had the better game plan.

The Rockets choose to deny the Cavaliers high powered offense opportunities to score by employing a disciplined ground attack that took minutes off the clock. On dry turf that game plan probably has a 50-50 chance of working, but with a field more the consistency of oatmeal, the odds increase greatly.

In the first half Anna possessed the ball for over 18 of the 24 minutes. On one drive they ran more than 10 minutes off the clock on 18 plays. Not a bad game plan and it almost work save for one thing, you gotta score.

Time and time again the Coldwater defense stopped the Anna rushing attack and the rain stifled their passing attack.

Meanwhile the Coldwater offense just could not find its footing. Receivers were unable to run precise routes which allowed the Rocket defense to pressure quarterback Austin Bruns out of the pocket. And Coldwater was not able to match the Anna rushing attack.

So the game came down to making the best of your opportunities and late in the second quarter, Coldwater got one.

Anna was forced to punt and Coldwater took over at their own 36 yard line. Bruns ran a draw for 8 yards and on the next play found Josh Huber on the left side. Hubie caught the pass, maintained his footing while the Anna defenders lost theirs and he slogged into the end zone for a 56 yard touchdown. The point after was a near disaster as two false start penalties moved the ball back to the 13, making Kyle Bergman's kick more like a 30 yard field goal. But his kick was true and the score was 7-0.

On the ensuing possession Anna fumbled the ball right back to Coldwater, but a rare snap over Bruns head on third and goal forced Coldwater to attempt a 39 yard field goal which drifted wide right.

In the second half, the rain fell even harder and both teams could not sustain any scoring drives. Bergman proved to be Coldwater's best weapon on the evening as his last three punts averaged 50 yards and pinned Anna deep in their own territory.

Bruns finished the night 10 of 15 for 135 yards. He ran the ball 19 times but posted zero yards thanks to that bad snap in the second quarter and three kneel-downs for -14 yards out of the victory formation. Huber caught three passes for 68 yards. For the game Coldwater had 144 yards on 41 plays while Anna tallied 171 yards on 57 plays. Despite the conditions, Coldwater posted no turnovers while Anna fumbled the ball 5 times but lost only one.

Next up for Coldwater is 6-1 Marion Local. The Flyers are the last serious contender the Cavs will face, so a victory will bring the dream of a league title even closer.

The teams have a highly competitive series going with Cavs holding a 31-24-4 edge. Last season the Flyers won a hard fought 7-0 victory

Coldwater continues to hold a commanding lead in Region 20. Anna dropped out of playoff contention and Versailles holds the seventh of eight playoff spots.

Coldwater Dominate in Victory over Marion Local

The Coldwater Cavaliers posted their best overall performance of the season in with a 27-0 defeat of the Marion Local Flyers at Cavalier Stadium.

The victory moves Coldwater to 8-0 on the season and give them a two game lead in the MAC title race over the Flyers and the Minster Wildcats with only two games left in the regular season.

Although the score would not indicate it, the game was very competitive and Flyers performed very well but three turnovers cost them the game.

The Cavaliers were back to full strength as Caleb Siefring and Jordan Chapin returned from injuries and bolstered an already stout Cavalier defense.

The game opened with Marion taking the opening kickoff and driving to the Coldwater 4 yard line with a good mix of pass and run. But Brody Hoying stripped Jacy Goettemoeller of the ball on a run off left tackle and Coldwater recovered the ball at the two yard line.

Coldwater went right to work as senior quarterback Austin Bruns led the Cavs 98 yards down the field and on the tenth play of the drive found Caleb Siefring in the end zone for an 8 yard reception and the Cavs led 7-0 with 3:16 on the first quarter clock.

Both defenses asserted themselves as the teams traded possessions until the final minute of the second quarter when Adam Bertke was intercepted by Brody Hoying who ran it down the field for 68 yards and a touchdown. Coldwater led at halftime 14-0.

In the third quarter the Flyers again drove into Cav territory, but they

fumbled the ball back to Coldwater. Using mostly the rush, the Cavs drove 59 yards in 10 plays when Bruns found Zach Dickman for a nine yard TD strike. Kyle Bergman kicked his third PAT to set the score at 21-0.

On the ensuing possession, the Flyers went three and out and Brody Hoying struck again returning the punt for 31 yards. The Cavaliers only needed three plays to go the final 32 yards as Bruns found Seifring in the right corner from 11 yards out. Bergman's kick missed the mark and the final score was set 27-0.

For the game Bruns was 19 of 27 for 220 yards and three touchdowns. He added another 60 yards on 13 carries. Mitch Schoenherr caught 4 passes for 68 yards, Siefring caught 5 passes for 51 yards and 2 scores.

Sophomore Brody Hoying was the player of the game as he tallied an interception for a touchdown, a 31 yard punt return to setup a score, seven tackles, a forced fumble, and broke up one pass.

The Flyers put up some nice yardage totals, but those three turnovers spelled their doom. The Cavalier defense yielded 136 rushing yards but only 120 passing to record their second straight shutout and third goose egg of the season. Since the Kenton game in week one where they gave up 22 points the Cavalier defense has only allowed 26 points; 48 points in 8 games for a six point per game average.

The victory assures third year head coach Chip Otten his first MAC title.

Next week the Cavaliers travel to Rockford to visit the Parkway Panthers. A win will earn the Cavs the outright conference title.

Coldwater has dominated this series leading 61-13-2 including winning the last 23 straight games with shutouts the past two seasons.

In Region 20, Anna and Versailles have dropped out of playoff contention. Coldwater and Covington hold down the first two spots followed by Summit Country Day, Dayton Christian, West Liberty-Salem, New Lebanon Dixie, North Lewisburg Triad and West Jefferson.

The Cavaliers have earned a playoff spot for the 16th consecutive season.

Coldwater Captures Midwest Athletic Conference Crown

The Coldwater Cavaliers defeated the Parkway Panthers 47-6 to win the outright 2012 MAC conference title.

It is Coldwater's 17th conference title and they own 11 all by themselves. This is their first title since 2008.

The victory moves the Cavs record to 9-0 while the Panthers fall to 0-9.

Parkway accepted the opening kick off and were able to move the ball initially, but a decision to go for it on a fourth down near mid-field proved costly. The Cavaliers were able to stop the Panthers and they took over at the host's 40 yard line.

Coldwater Head Coach Chip Otten decided to strike quickly. Josh Huber lined up wide left and when the defensive back moved to within 3 yards of the line of scrimmage with no safety to back him up, Hubie sprinted right past him and Austin Bruns threw a pass which he caught and ran into the end zone for a 7-0 Coldwater lead at the 8:36 mark of the first quarter.

Mitch Feltz scored on a 33 yard run at the 3:22 mark to cap a second one play drive and Coldwater led 14-0.

Late in the first Coldwater got the ball at the Parkway 49 and ran six plays before Bruns dove in from six yards out to put the Cavs on top 21-0 at 11:44 of the second quarter.

The defense got into the act on Parkway's ensuing possession as Mitch Schoenherr intercepted a pass and ran 62 yards for a touchdown.

Mitch Feltz closed out the first half scoring with his second TD run from 5 yards out and Coldwater went to the locker room with a 35-0 lead.

The Coldwater starters played the first series of the second half and then gave way to the reserves, but not before they were able to put one more score on the board as the offense drove 69 yards on 6 plays capped off by Bruns second TD run from 5 yards out.

Late in the third Matt Kremer scored on a 2 yard run to close out the scoring for the Cavaliers and they led 47-0.

Though out-manned Parkway never quit. The Panthers only had 28 player dressed for the game (Coldwater has 23 seniors by comparison) and many of them play both sides of the ball, but they did manage to score on a 1 yard dive by Dakota Hucke with just 9 seconds remaining in the game to set the final score at 47-6.

For the night Bruns was just 9 of 20 passing for 197 yards and 1 touchdown. Those 9 receptions went to 8 different receivers and Kyle Post was the only one to catch two, for a total of 45 yards. Bruns made the most of his receptions as six of his nine passes when for 40, 31, 22, 23, 26 and 32 yards. Not bad on a soggy field.

As a team the Cavaliers totaled 145 yards on the ground. Feltz posted 57 yards on 7 carries, Bruns ran 5 times for 37 yards and backup QB Matt Kremer logged 33 yards on five carries.

The defense was stout yet again allowing just 136 yards on the ground and 49 in the air for a total of 185 yards on 59 plays, 12 more plays than the Cavalier offense was able to run.

Coldwater returns home for the regular season finale as they host the Ft. Recovery Indians. This will be

the first meeting between the two teams since 2007. Coldwater holds a 13-0 lead in the series and have outscored the Indians 593-73

Looking to the playoffs Coldwater will most certainly finish 1st in Region 20 and host the opening game verses the #8 seed.

Coldwater Caps Off Undefeated Regular Season

The Fort Recovery Indians returned to Cavalier Stadium for the first time since 2007 and it was not pleasant. Rain fell from the sky as the temperature dropped and their hosts, the Coldwater Cavaliers, put up the most points they scored in a game all season. In the end the Cavs prevailed 55-0 to complete an undefeated regular season. The Indians closed out the 2012 campaign 3-7.

The Coldwater defense opened the game by stopping the Indians and forcing them to punt after running 8 plays and posting 1 first down; the only first down they would post in the first half. The Cav offense led by senior quarterback Austin Bruns, ran an 8 play drive of their own which ended when Bruns scored the first of three touchdowns as he drove in from the 5 yard line.

On their next drive the Cavs needed just one play as Bruns found Kyle Post from 27 yards out.

On Coldwater's third and fourth possessions Bruns scored on runs of 20 yards and 1 yard to put the Cavs up 28-0 just 26 ticks into the second quarter.

At that point Head Coach Chip Otten began using his junior varsity players as it was obvious that the Indians were over matched. Mitch Feltz scored on a 5 yard run and Brody Hoying ran a beautiful draw from the quarterback position 33 yards up the middle for the final score of the first half and Coldwater led 42-0.

In the first half Coldwater racked up 237 yards of total offense to Ft. Recovery's meager 39 yards.

The third quarter was a scoreless affair as youth and inexperience was apparent on both teams. But on the first play of the fourth quarter the Cavaliers got the better end of a play as Christian Schramm got behind the Indian's defense to snag a Matt Kra-

mer pass and he ran 84 yards to the end zone to record Coldwater's longest offensive play of the season. Kyle McKibben kicked his first PAT of his career and Coldwater led 49-0.

Not wanting to be left out, fourth string quarterback Greg Gilliland found Troy Muhlenkamp on an 8 yard pass for the Cavs final score of the night. The PAT went wide right and the final score was set at 55-0.

Bruns had the most bang for the night scoring three times on the ground and throwing for another. He was a sparking 8 of 9 passing for 104 yards. Kramer was 4 of 8 for 104 yards and 1 touchdown.

The four Cavalier quarterbacks completed 15 of 21 passes for 246 to nine different receivers. The ground game was a committee effort as well as 12 ball carriers accumulated 140 yards on 40 carries.

Kyle Bergman continued to be solid as a place kicker going 6 for 6 on his point after attempts. He also averaged 51.9 yards on 7 kickoffs with two kicks going for touchbacks.

Defensively, Grant Muhlenkamp intercepted two passes and Adam Klosterman picked another.

For the game Coldwater posted 386 yards on 61 plays while the Indians could only manage 74 yards on 49 plays.

The victory gives Coldwater their first undefeated regular season since 2008, the 11th such season in school history.

Coldwater will now turn their attention to the post season. They finished first in Region 20 and as such earned the right to host Casstown Miami East at Cavalier Stadium. The Vikings posted a 7-3 record in the Cross County Conference. This will be their third playoff appearance having been there in 2007 and 2008 but losing in both of those games. Looking at their schedule they faced 4 playoff bound teams,

but only won one of those games.

The Cavaliers have faced the Vikings four times and won three times. They last met in 1976 with Coldwater gaining a 34-0 shut out victory.

This will be Coldwater's 16th consecutive playoff appears and 18th overall. They own a 45-15 record and are 13-0 in first round games.

This is the first time since 2008 that Coldwater has earned the #1 seed in their region. They also will finish the season as the #1 team in the Associated Press Poll, their fifth AP poll championship in school history (2002, 2004, 2005, 2008).

Cavaliers Defeat Miami East 42-7

The Coldwater Cavaliers began their bid for a fourth consecutive visit to the State Championship game with a convincing 42-7 win over the Miami East Vikings.

The Cavs were just too strong in every facet of the game, rolling up 535 total yards on offense and holding the Vikings to just 104. Coldwater ran nearly twice as many plays, 60, as Miami East, 34.

It did not take long for the issue to be settled as the Vikings deferred the coin toss and allowed the Cavs to have the ball first. Coldwater used just three plays as Austin Bruns found Caleb Sieftring in the back of the end zone from 9 yards out to set the score at 7-0 just 48 seconds into the game.

Miami East responded with their best drive of the first half, running 8 plays and gaining 1 first down before punting back to Coldwater. And that is where the avalanche began...

Bruns to Sieftring for 10 yards, 14-0. Bruns to Brody Hoying for 11 yards, 21-0. Bruns to Josh Huber for 40 yards, 28-0 and Bruns to Mitch Schoenherr for 32 yards and the Cavs went into halftime leading 35-0.

In the first half Coldwater rolled up 352 yards in the air and 52 on the ground for 404 total yards. The Vikings only managed 25 yards, 14 on the ground, 11 by pass.

The Cavaliers used their only possession of the third quarter to grind out 61 yards on 12 plays and a little over 6 minutes of the clock. Jordan Chapin, who returned to the backfield for the first time since week four, rushed the final yard and Coldwater led 42-0.

At that point the reserves entered the game and got over 16 minutes of playoff experience. The Vikings first team remained on the field and were able to get a touchdown with nine minutes remaining for their only score.

Austin Bruns had the best performance of his career going 20-26 for 353 yards and 5 touchdowns. 7 of his 20 completions went for more than 20 yards including 41, 39, 40 and 32 yards.

Brody Hoying completed one pass on a half-back reverse option for 54 yards to Kyle Post on the Cavs second possession. Sieftring caught 4 passes for 81 yards and Schoenherr caught 3 passes for 80 yards. Post caught 2 for 76 yard and Huber 3 for 69 yards. On the night 13 Cavs caught passes and 10 of them ran the ball.

The Cav Defense was lights-out again as the first team only allowed 30 yards total through three quarters and as a team allowing just 104 yards. The Cav defense has allowed a touchdown or less in the last 10 games.

Next up Coldwater will travel to Alexander Stadium in Piqua for a regional semifinal match versus undefeated West Liberty Salem who defeated previously unbeaten Dayton Christian 28-14. This will be the first meeting ever between the two schools. Coldwater is 13-4 all time in week 12 games.

All MAC Team Announced

Coldwater swept the major awards as the MAC coaches announced their All Conference teams this week. Chip Otten was named Coach of the Year for the first time. His father Barney garnered the award in 1975 & 76.

Austin Bruns was named Offensive Player of the Year. The quarterback threw for 1903 yards, 23 touchdowns and just 3 interceptions. He also rushed for 469 yards and 9 TDs for a total of 2372 all purpose yards and 32 touchdowns.

Zac Dickman was named Defensive Player of the Year. Zac anchors the Cav defense at linebacker where he totaled 93 tackles, 3 sacks and a

forced fumble.

As MAC champs usually do, Coldwater garnered most of the first team honors.

Bruns was joined on 1st Team Offense by Caleb Sieftring, Josh Huber, Kyle Bergman (as punter and kicker), and Jordon Harlamert

Dickman was joined on 1st Team Defense by Alan Kunk, Caleb Sieftring, Josh Huber and Brody Hoying

Second Team honors went to Nick Albers on Offense and Jordon Harlamert and Jordan Chapin on Defense.

Mike Rios, Cody Madaj, Derek Collet, Mitch Schoenherr and Jake Kramer gained Honorable Mention.

Cavaliers Tame Aggressive Tigers Squad 41-22

The Coldwater Cavaliers continued their march toward a fourth consecutive state title game with a hard fought victory over the previously unbeaten Tigers of West Liberty Salem at Alexander Stadium in Piqua by a final score of 41-22.

The game was more competitive than the final score would indicate. The Tigers were worth every bit of their 11-0 record as they battled tooth and nail for 48 minutes but could not overcome the talent and depth of the Cavaliers.

West Liberty won the coin toss and choose to receive the opening kickoff and test their metal against Coldwater's vaunted defense. But they were forced to punt and the offense led by MAC Offensive Player of the Year Austin Bruns went to work, scoring on their first two possessions. The first score was an 8 play drive that covered 43 yards as Bruns plunged in from the 4 yard line. The second drive was a 9 play 66 yard drive capped off again by Bruns 2 yard run. Coldwater led 14-0 and it was looking like the game would follow the script of most of the Cavaliers games this season.

But you can never look past a team in the playoffs and for a moment, the defense let their guard down. On the second play of West Liberty's next possession Travis Mayse took an option pitch off the right edge and raced untouched 82 yards to bring the Tigers back to within a touchdown at 14-7. It was the first time a team scored in the first quarter on the Cavs since week 1 versus Kenton. That play seemed to wake up the Tigers who until that point appeared to be awestruck by the Cavaliers. For the rest of the night the Tigers played with an urgency that forced Coldwater to up their intensity.

The teams traded possessions until late in the second quarter when MAC Defensive Player of the Year Zach

Dickman broke through the middle of the Tiger front to block and recover a punt at the Tiger's 29 yard line. Then with just 41 seconds remaining in the first half Bruns found Mitch Schoenherr in the front left corner of the end zone for a score and the Cavs went to the locker room leading 21-7.

Coldwater increase their lead in the third quarter as Jordan Chapin scored from 2 yards out and Bruns scored his third TD of the night on a 9 yard leap and twist over the cone on the right front corner of the end zone to put the Cavs on top 35-7. Those two drives covered 177 yards in 17 plays and it appeared that Coldwater was wearing down the Tigers, but they still had some fight left.

Early in the fourth quarter the Tigers drive 72 yards in 10 plays and scored on a 12 yard run. Coldwater answered five minutes later as Mitch Feltz scored from 7 yards out to set the score at 41-14 and it appeared the issue was settled as both teams put in their reserves. But when the Tigers got the ball with a little over a minute to play Kameron Evans ran a sweep off the right side and just like their first score he ran untouched for a 60 yards. The Tigers ran the exact same play on the PAT and the final score was set at 41-22. This was the exact same score as the Kenton game and most would agree it was similarly competitive.

Austin Bruns showed leadership in a tough situation as he was 17 of 23 passing for 214 yards and one TD. He added another 91 yards on 19 carries and scored three more TDs. Jordan Chapin ran the ball 7 times for 71 yards and a TD. Brody Hoying led the receiving corps with 118 yards on 6 catches. Caleb Siefring added 79 more yards on 7 catches.

West Liberty piled up 325 yards of offense, the most since the Kenton game. The fans can take solice in

that 142 of those yards came on two plays which would reduce the total yardage to 183. But in the playoffs, games can turn on 1 or 2 plays, so the Cavs must prevent big plays the rest of the way.

West Liberty retires for the season at 11-1 and Coldwater moves to 12-0 and the Region 20 Championship against 12-0 Covington who defeated Cincinnati Summit Country Day (11-1) 58-14.

Coldwater defeated Covington last week in a week 11 matchup by a score of 31-7. The Cavs have won both their previous meetings with Covington.

Coldwater Shuts Out Undefeated Covington 20-0

The Coldwater Cavaliers (13-0) won their fourth straight regional championship with a 20-0 shutout victory over the previously undefeated Covington Buccaneers (12-1). The high powered Cavalier offense put up three scores in the first 18 minutes of the game but it was the defense that took center stage on the turf at Dayton's Welcome Stadium.

The Cavaliers scored on their first two possession with passes from Austin Bruns to Caleb Siefring covering 6 and 50 yards. In the second quarter, on their fourth possession the Cavs moved 75 yards in 11 plays, capped by Jordan Chapin driving in from the 1 yard line to send the Cavs into the locker room leading 20-0.

Covington entered the game averaging 51.6 points per game for a total of 620 points, good for 8th all time in state history. But the Coldwater defense had only allowed 83 points in 12 games. Two of those games, Kenton (22) and West Liberty-Salem (22) account for half that total.

The Cav D had great success as the Bucs offensive was very one dimensional and it allowed Coldwater to focus their attention on the ground game.

In the first half, Covington could only manage 72 yards rushing and 82 yards of total offense. On the night the Bucs gained just 146 yards on 38 carries and completed 3 passes for 26 yards. They also committed three turnovers, a fumble and two interceptions and only got into Coldwater territory twice, both times in the second half.

Brody Hoying was brilliant as he accounted for 11 tackles, many of them while flying in from his safety position to the point of attack to cut

down the ball carriers on numerous sweep plays. Hoying also logged two 'big hits' (aka 'slobber knockers') and snagged an interception in the fourth quarter.

The Covington defense gave Coldwater some fits as well. After a first half which saw the Cavs pile up 208 yards of total offense, the Bucs held the Cavs to just 77 yards in the second half.

But the Cavaliers scored when they had the opportunity and the defense was lights out all night. As a result, Coldwater's quest to "Play 60" will continue.

For the night, Bruns was 17 of 26 passing for 212 yards and two touchdowns. Caleb Siefring caught seven passes for 150 yards and two scores. Jordan Chapin added 41 rushing yards on 7 carries.

The Final Four

Coldwater will now advance to the OHSAA State Semifinals for the fourth straight year and their 11th appearance overall. The Cavs are 7-3 in state semifinals and have won their last 5 appearance.

They will face the Eagles of Liberty Benton who came from 11 points down to defeat Patrick Henry 22-21.

It will be the first ever meeting between the two teams. LB hails from the Blanchard Valley Conference and they are 12-1 on the season. The game will be played at Lima Stadium.

The other half of the semifinal bracket will feature last years champion the Kirtland Hornets (13-0) and the Baltimore Liberty Union Lions (11 - 2) in a game which will be played at Fawcett Stadium in Canton.

The winners of these two contests will meet at 3pm on Saturday December 1 at Paul Brown Stadium in Massillon for the Division 5 state title.

All Northwest District Team

The Northwest District announced their all Division 5 team this week, and the Cavaliers got the lions share of the awards. Chip Otten was named Coach of the Year while Austin Bruns and Zack Dickman were named Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year respectively.

Rounding out the first team offense were Caleb Siefring at Wide Receiver and Jordon Harlamert as a Line-man. The second team included Josh Huber at Wide Receiver and Kyle Bergman as Punter.

Joining Dickman on the first team defense were Alan Kunk at Lineman and Brody Hoying at Safety.

The All State team will be announced next week.

Cavaliers Will 'Play 60'

Each year the Coldwater Cavalier senior football players pick a motto or mission statement before the season begins. It's purpose is to remind, motivate and inspire.

After last season's defeat in the state title game the mission statement was quickly determined - "Play 60".

It is a rebranding of sorts based upon an NFL advertising program. For the Cavs it served as goal to reach the state title game again in 2012 which would be the 60th football game the senior class would participate in. It is also a mark that no other football team in the state of Ohio has been able to achieve.

Until now.

In the Division 5 State Semifinal game at Lima Stadium, Coldwater (14-0) completely dominated the Liberty Benton Eagles (12-2) by a score of 38-0 and achieved their goal to "Play 60".

On this night the Cavaliers put together every facet of their game and dominated a team that on paper was every bit their equal. The offensive attack was balanced gaining 342 yards, 131 on the ground and 211 through the air. The defense was lights out again yielding 179 yards to a team which averaged 403 yards per game and shut down a running game that averaged 259 yards per game to just 150.

Eagles coach Tim Nichols was very complimentary of the Cavaliers saying, "That's real good stuff right there. There are no weaknesses, and they expose anything you may have that is weak. They are the bar for a lot of programs.

Coldwater scored on their second possession of the game, capitalizing on a Brody Hoying 39-yard punt return with a 32 yard field goal by Kyle Bergman with 2:43 to play in the first quarter.

The Cavaliers then scored on all three of their second quarter possessions. Austin Bruns passed for 17 and ran for 23 yards including the final three yards to cap a 62 yards drive in 11 plays. On their next drive Bruns found Caleb Siefring from 13 yards out to finish an 8 play 63 yard drive.

Then the Eagles, feeling they needed a big play to turn the tide, gambled on fourth down and Zach Dickman tackled the quarterback behind the line of scrimmage at the LB 37 yard line. Bruns made quick work of it as he found Josh Huber on a 30 yard pass to the seven and from there Bruns covered the last 7 yards on the ground. Coldwater led at half time 24-0.

In the third quarter Burns found Huber again for a 32 yard touchdown pass and midway through the fourth, Grant Muhlenkamp scored his first touchdown of the year on a 2 yard run to close out the scoring.

Bruns finished the night nearly perfect, going 15 of 18 passing for 211 yards and two scores. He completed his last 12 passes for a total of 153 yards and two scores. He added another 70 on the ground.

Muhlenkamp had 29 yards on 3 carries and Brody Hoying added 23 more on 4 carries. Siefring led the receivers with 67 yards on 5 catches while Huber totaled 62 yards on 2 receptions.

The defense allowed just 72 yards in the first half and 107 yards in the second half. LB only got into Coldwater territory twice all evening, and not very far. They got to the Coldwater 41 on their first series in the third quarter before a fumble ended the drive. Late in the game the Coldwater reserves allowed the Eagles to advance 53 yards to the Coldwater 23 before forcing a turnover on downs to preserve the shutout.

The shutout is the sixth for the Cava-

liers this season and their second straight in the playoffs. The 2005 state champion team led by Ross Homan was the last squad to post 6 shutouts.

So "Play 60" has been achieved and given birth to a new motto, good for one week only, "Win 60".

The Division 5 Championship Game

The Cavaliers opponent will be the team that vanquished them in last years final. The Kirtland Hornets (14-0) defeated Liberty Union 41-7 to force the rematch.

Last season Kirtland won 28-7 in a game that saw them log 421 yards rushing against a defense that was pretty banged up after a 14 game campaign.

Not much has changed for the Hornets this season as they have piled up 5280 yards on the ground at a 9.5 yards per carry average. With efficiency like that they have only had to go to the air 144 times, completing 69 passes for 1230 yards. So the Cavalier defense which has allowed only 106 rushing yards rushing this season will face a hardy test.

The Quest for Number 100

The MAC is widely hailed as the best small school conference in the state of Ohio and has been acclaimed across the entire nation.

That success continues at the OHSAA State Football Championships this weekend as Marion Local and Coldwater play for state titles.

It will be a milestone for the MAC if either team can achieve victory as it will be the 100th state title for an MAC school. Best wishes to the Flyers as they get the first chance at it on Friday morning.

Other Items of Interest

Coldwater Wins Its Third...Breathtaking, To Say The Least by Sonny Fulks

The Coldwater Cavaliers nursed a second-half lead against the defending state champs to win a title of their own...frustrating to watch, but oh so sweet compared to the frustration of the last three years.

With 2:15 seconds left before the half, Austin Bruns and the Cavalier offense started on their own 22 and mounted a time-consuming march downfield, culminating with a clutch 28-yard field goal by Bergman, who redeemed his earlier error by drilling a kick for three points that would have been good from 45 yards...right through the middle. 10-7 as the two teams went to the the halftime locker rooms, that was the extent of all the offensive scoring for the game.

It would stay that way through a brutally physical third quarter and into the fourth, seventeen minutes of intense hitting by the respective defenses and mounting frustration by the respective offenses. Both teams parried for field position, and with 7:04 remaining in the game Kirtland pinned Coldwater against its own goal line with a 53 yard punt by quarterback/punter Scott Eilerman.

On the second play Bruns and running back Brody Hoying connected on a bubble screen in the end zone...which burst, literally. Hoying was corralled before he could get back to the goal line for a safety. Two points surrendered, possession of the ball surrendered, momentum surrendered, and Kirtland suddenly had the ball at midfield on the ensuing punt.

Massillon - If Marion Local's 28-21 win Friday afternoon in the Division VI championship was, in the words of one, thrilling, and history-making (the hundredth title by a MAC school)...consider the Coldwater Cavaliers' championship win 30 hours later, a 10-9 decision over defending Division V state champion Kirtland, as being nothing less than **breathtaking!**

Breathtaking for the fact that the Cavaliers took an early lead late in the first quarter on a 7-yard pass from quarterback Austin Bruns to wideout Mitch Schoenherr. The lead was shortlived and the drama was just beginning.

Kirtland came right back seven minutes later to mount a ten-play drive from the Coldwater 20 yard line after a muffed punt attempt by the Cavaliers' Kyle Bergman. Matt Finkler scored from four yards out to tie the game at 7-7.

The suspense was numbing, and when Coldwater linebacker Zach Dickman went down with a leg injury it grew so quiet on both sides of Paul Brown Stadium you could hear individual heartbeats. Dickman recovered sufficiently to walk to the sideline under his own power. It gave his defensive teammates just long enough to collect themselves.

They forced a Kirtland punt.

With 4:18 remaining Coldwater tried once more to mount a time and yard-consuming drive from its own 20 to either score or kill the remaining time, preserving their 1-point margin for a state championship. But more frustration on the first two downs, and forced to convert a third and eight Bruns took the snap and starting circling in the backfield, looking for an open receiver. Spotting teammate Mitch Schoenherr racing down the opposite sideline he hit him in stride with a 43-yard strike to extend the drive and put the ball on Kirtland's 35 yard line. They stalled, again, right there.

But having flipped the field position coach Chip Otten elected to punt, and Kyle Bergman, he of the earlier field goal which now stood as the margin of difference, did not disappoint. He hoisted a high lob that came down in the waiting arms of teammate Drew Otten on the six yard line, and with 2:34 remaining Kirtland needed 94 yards to deny Coldwater the win and their third state title, Otten's first.

After a first down pass of 17 yards to running back Damon Washington, Scott Eilerman got greedy over the middle on a third and ten play from the 35. Sniffing out a post route being run by Kirtland's Jacob Boyd, Brody Hoying stepped in front of Boyd and picked off the pass. As if on cue, the nearly 5,000 partisan fans in orange and black seemed to exhale at once, bursting into frenzied bedlam, the frustration of the last three years erased, the game and the long-awaited title for a senior class playing in its 60th high school football game, secured.

Breathtaking one moment...exhilarating the next.

"I jumped the route," said the precocious sophomore. "You focus on your man in coverage, but I was aware of a second receiver that they had tried to throw to all day. I sensed it was coming and just made a play on the ball."

10-9...not pretty, nothing statistically eye-popping, but a win. The pressure of a fourth consecutive loss in a state title game vanquished. Admittedly, it was on the minds of those who had carried the burden of the previous three failures.

"It was something I tried not to think about during the week," said Austin Bruns afterward. "I tried to think nothing but positive thoughts. But yes, it would have been devastating if we had lost again."

For two teams that had rang up such impressive offensive numbers during the season (Kirtland, 536 points, and Coldwater, 498 points) the frustration of having such firepower nullified was felt by both teams, by both coaches.

“Their defense was really good, like we expected,” said Kirtland’s Tiger LaVerde. “Was it frustrating? Yes, because we’d get 10 yards, 12 yards, and then nothing for the next three plays and have to punt. We couldn’t establish any kind of consistency with drives downfield.”

“Yeah, I guess it was frustrating,” admitted Chip Otten. “It didn’t seem like we were getting any yards, but you look at the stats and Austin (Bruns) had a hundred yards rushing and hit 20 of 28 passes for 233 yards.

“It was a great high school football game...it was great for high school football. These guys have been together since grade school and junior high, and now 60 games in their high school career. It seems like everyone loses their last high school football game because only one team can be the champion. Fortunately, it didn’t happen that way for them. They were able to win their last game, and a championship.”

.Red-eyed, senior Caleb Siefing was at a loss for words. “I can’t describe it. I can’t put into words what this feels like.”

Zach Dickman, who missed last year’s Kirtland game with an injury, was likewise dumbfounded to explain his emotions.

And Otten, who endured his own personal frustration of the last two years with the losses to Ursuline and Kirtland, was right there with his players. “This will probably take a while to sink in,” he said with a satisfied smile.

It was a game that featured vicious hitting, and yet, undeniable respect and sportsmanship between combatants.

“Outside of our game with Ursuline in the regionals this was the hardest hitting game of the year,” said Kirtland’s Damon Washington. “They kind of focused on me and I just couldn’t break anything big.”

“Their defense played really well,” added quarterback Mike Eilerman. “Their speed and pursuit made it tough, and their corners were really quick and physical.”

For his part, Austin Bruns couldn’t have agreed more, sharing his own respect for the former state champions.

“I give them a lot of credit. The big guy (Christian Hauber) from last year was gone, but they still had plenty of weapons. #39 (Adam Hess) was a pretty good load.

"But our defense was great. It kept us in the game until we could hit the big play to Mitch in the fourth quarter. I thought that was the big play of the game. He got open down the sideline somehow and I was able to get a catchable ball out there to him."

After a regular season in which Chip Otten continually praised his defense for its ability to control opposing offenses and the flow of the game, his confidence was more than justified Saturday...just 199 yards of total offense by Kirtland (174 on the ground and 25 passing), and just 39 yards by Damon Washington, the all-purpose threat and bonafide Division I collegiate prospect.

"We made the plays," said Otten. "We kept their running game bottled up. And Brody Hoyng was just sick (that's a good thing) with the way he played."

By the same token, he was just as impressed with Kirtland, who by seasonal standards, held Coldwater to an equally meager 314 yards.

"Boy, they were stout," added Otten. "We probably should have gotten more points, but we moved the ball just enough to keep the field position in our favor...except for the screen pass we tried in the end zone. That didn't work out so well.

"Their touchdown came on a short field, after we had the dropped punt by Kyle (Bergman)."

But if Bruns' 43-yard pass was the big play of game...credit the resilient Bergman, one of the 23 seniors on the team, for actually executing the "winning" play of the game. His field goal in the waning moments of the first half, in the end, turned out to be the difference.

"I give him all the credit in the world," said Bruns. "It was his time to shine and he stepped up big

time. I'm really glad for him because people don't realize how hard he worked all summer to do that. It's 95 degrees and he's out there by himself with a bag of footballs practicing field goals. He did the work."

We mentioned sportsmanship, which all too often is given lip service in the face of such bitter disappointment as a title lost by a single point. Credit Kirtland senior Evan Brettrager for words and attitude to the contrary.

"It hurts to lose by a point like we did," said Brettrager in the post-game news conference. "But if we had to lose I'm glad for Coldwater. They're a good team and I know they worked hard all year to get back here undefeated. They deserve it."

There is such a thing in sports as teams having their just due. It doesn't always come when you expect it, or want it. And the wait doesn't always seem fair. Ask former Minnesota Vikings coach Bud Grant, who

took his teams to the Super Bowl four times, and lost all four times. Ask former Buffalo Bills coach Marv Levy, who likewise lost four Super Bowls...in four consecutive appearances.

Saturday, on an uncharacteristic 58-degree December day, Chip Otten avoided the Marv Levy syndrome. Throughout the year he had assured all who asked that there really wasn't any pressure to get a title and the stigma of losing in the finals behind him. Just three years removed from the passing of the late John Reed, the last coach to have won a title, Otten talked about the expectations of the season back in August.

"The kids are resilient," he said then. "Last year was disappointing, for sure, but by the time we got back home on the bus they had pretty much recovered and were ready to go on with their lives. Basketball season started on Monday.

"But it was hell for the rest of us coaches. We don't get it over so fast at our age for some reason. You look at the tape of that game and you see a hundred things you'd do different if you had the chance. We'll approach this season like we do every year. You're never sure you're going to make the playoffs, so the first goal is to win our league. If we win that we're sure to make the playoffs. Once we get there we have a chance for our seniors to play in 60 game during their high school career. If we can do that we'll have a chance to get back to the finals. We'll take things one game at a time, one goal at a time. The pressure, if there is any, is not getting back to the finals...it's getting past that next game. If we can do that we'll get our chance to finally win that championship."

Saturday, at 5:37 pm, the plan came together, the moment Brody Hoying jumped the route and made the interception that sealed the deal. Never mention Chip Otten and Marv Levy in the same sentence again.

The Cavaliers, those 23 seniors...Austin Bruns, Caleb Siefring, Jordan Chapin, Jake Kramer, Kyle

Bergman, Mike Rios, et. al...and Chip Otten have their title.

It was breathtaking to watch...to say the least!

Coldwater wins state football title in nail-biter

MASSILLON

Finally.

In an instant classic high school football game, Coldwater defeated Kirtland 10-9 to win the Division V state championship at Paul Brown Tiger Stadium. It was the third state championship for the Cavaliers (2005 and 2007).

"I can't put it in words," quarterback Austin Bruns said. "I'm always going to remember this."

Bruns, All-Ohio Co-Offensive Player of the Year, completed 20 of 28 passes for 233 yards and one score. He also carried the ball 23 times for 112 yards.

After bringing home the runner-up trophy the last three seasons, Coldwater was able to win the 60th game the seniors were a part.

"Obviously for us it's a great football game," Coldwater coach Chip Otten said. "To be involved in 60 games and to win 17 playoff games ... and this year we won the last game."

"We'll always be the first class to play 60 games," senior All-Ohio Co-Defensive Player of the Year Zach Dickman said. "It feels amazing."

Sophomore Brody Hoying's interception with 1:05 to play sealed the game for the Cavaliers.

It is appropriate the defense sealed the championship game as both defenses shined. Kirtland was held to 199 yards, 282 below its season average. Coldwater's offense garnered 319 yards, 50 below its average. The nine points allowed was the third highest allowed by Coldwater all season.

"I thought our defense played outstanding," Kirtland coach Tiger LaVerde said. "We would have liked to move the ball a little better. I've got to put it on me, I called a crappy game."

Coldwater got on the board first. After forcing Kirtland to punt, the Cavaliers drove 59 yards on five plays. The big play on the drive was Bruns' 28 yard run on second and 4 that took the ball to the 10-yard line. Two plays later, Bruns connected with Mitch Schoenherr for seven yards. Schoenherr twisted and dove for the score. Kyle Bergman's extra point made it 7-0 with 1:54 left in the quarter.

The Cavaliers got the break of the game on Kirtland's next drive. On fourth and 1, the Hornets' 210-pound running back Adam Hess fought for the first down, but Coldwater sophomore Brody Hoying put his helmet on the ball and knocked it loss. Schoenherr recovered for Coldwater.

Coldwater, however, gave it right back. On fourth down, Cavalier punter Kyle Bergman bobbled the snap and Kirtland's Ryan Loncar jumped on the opportunity and made the Cavaliers pay. Kirtland got its first score with 2:20 left in the half. It took seven plays for the Hornets to cover 19 yards, but senior quarterback Scott Eilerman found tight end Matthew Finkler from four yards out on fourth and goal. It was Eilerman's first pass completion of the day. Kyle Adams' PAT tied the score at 7-7.

Eilerman finished the game four of 11 for 25 yards, with one interception and one score.

Coldwater answered and took the lead on the last play of the first half. An 11-play, 67-yard drive in 2:14 culminated in redemption for Bergman as the senior drilled a 28-yard field goal to give Coldwater a 10-7 halftime lead.

"He dropped the snap and dropped the ball and tried to throw," Otten said of Bergman's punt. "He's a football player. That's where we say let it go and forget about it. Hopefully that's a learning lesson."

The Hornets defense and special teams got the Hornets within one point. After a Kirtland punt died at the 1 yard line, Hoying caught a pass in the flat and was dropped in the end zone by Sam Skiljan to make the score 10-9 with 6:17 left in the game.

With all the momentum, the Hornets looked to take the lead. Linebacker Jordan Chapin stuffed All-Ohio Co-Offensive Player of the Year Damon Washington on third and 11 before lineman Andrew Schwieterman knocked down a pass to give Coldwater the ball back with 4:18.

Washington finished the game with 11 carries for 43 yards for a 3.5 yard per carry average. The all-stater averaged more than 13 yards per carry entering the game.

"Our defense," Otten said, "they are athletic and can run and make plays. Because we have good balance with our conerbacks and safety, you can do all sorts of things up front."

All-state wide receiver Caleb Siefring finished the game with six catches for 37 yards.

"It's indescribable," Siefring said. "It's the neatest feeling in the world."

NOTES: Instead of spending the night on Friday in Stark County, the Cavaliers drove up early on Saturday morning leaving at 7 a.m. The team stopped and did a walk through and stopped again and ate breakfast in Wooster. The team arrived at the stadium at 12:30 p.m.

"We just felt like sleeping in our own bed and driving up will better," Otten said. "We'll drive a while and get a walk through at a rest area. Drive a few hours and eat and get there. We are going to get on the bus and make it a business-like atmosphere. It will eliminate all of the dead time."

— Once again the Cavaliers wore their yellow socks in support of senior Kyle Boeckman's father, Ty, who is battling cancer. Coldwater has worn the socks since the fifth game of the season against Minster and has worn the dyed white socks ever since.

— Play 60 was one of the themes for the Cavaliers this season. With their contest against Kirtland in the championship game, Coldwater's seniors participated in 60 high school football games including four straight state championship games. It is the first time in state history that this has been accomplished.

It was also the 50th playoff win in Coldwater football history.

— The attendance was 6,886.

— Former Cleveland Brown and Pro Football Hall of Fame member Leroy Kelley presented the game ball before the kickoff of the contest and the commemorative game ball after the contest.

Coldwater football gets national honor

COLDWATER - The long parade of honors for Coldwater's football team finally culminated in a presentation by the high school sports web site MaxPreps.com and the United States Army National Guard on Monday in the auditoria at Coldwater High School.

The Cavaliers' football team was honored by the MaxPreps Tour of Champions Football Tour as one of the top 50 football programs in the United States for the 2012 season. Coldwater is the only Ohio football team to be selected for the tour.

"Getting state recognized is one thing, but getting nationally recognized? Makes you feel good about your program," said Cavaliers' head coach Chip Otten. "People do notice small-school sports, which for us is really important. ... Great for the kids. Great for the school system and the area. Glad to get recognized."

Coldwater earned the accolade after completing a 15-0 season en route to a Division V state title after a 10-9 win over Kirtland on Dec. 1. That, and the Cavaliers' being ranked 114th nationally - out of over 16,000 schools in the nation - allowed Coldwater to be eligible for the honor.

The players received T-shirts and the school received a banner and a trophy to commemorate the occasion.

"Definitely it's excited for us to be honored," said Coldwater's senior quarterback Austin Bruns, the Division V co-offensive player of the year in the state. "... To be recognized like that is something special."

Senior linebacker Zach Dickman is proud that the team received such a high honor.

"It's definitely an honor to get this last award, I guess, for the season," said Dickman, the Division V state co-defensive player of the year. "To know that we've been recognized nationally is great since we're a small town and small team. It really just shows how far our success has reached."

Coldwater also owns the state's longest current playoff streak at 16 seasons in row.
