## Cavaliers Defeats Improved Panthers

The Coldwater Cavaliers defeated a much improved Parkway Panther team Friday night by a score of 28-0. Parkway has a new head coach, a new attitude and though the score would make you think nothing has changed, they are playing better football then they have in the past few years. The win moves Coldwater to 4-0 in the MAC and 5-1 overall. Parkway falls to 1-3 and 2-4 overall.

Both teams traded interceptions on their first series. Coldwater began their second drive deep on their own 12 yard line. Austin Bruns capped a 10 play drive with a 23 yard pass to Caleb Seifring. Troy Otten's kick made the score 7-0 with 2:54 left in the first period.

At the 5:05 mark of the second quarter Bruns found Siefring again, this time from 9 yards out for the Cavs second touchdown and with Otten's PAT the score was 14-0. Then with 1 minute remaining before half time, Bruns tallied his third TD pass of the night as he found Aaron Mestemaker for a nine yard score. Otten's third PAT make the score 21-0 at halftime.

As the third quarter began, the weather which had been windy and chilly got wet too as a light rain started to fall. It would pour for a moment then slow to a drizzle. Not wanting to add insult to injury and probably with an eye to end the game sooner so as to escape the rain, Coldwater shifted to the running game. Drew Klosterman was called upon and he toted the ball 14 times for 67 yards. With 2:57 remaining in the third quarter, Klosterman sprinted up the middle for a 22 yard TD to close out the scoring for the evening. Otten

made his 4th PAT of the evening to set the final score of 28-0. Otten now has converted 17 consecutive PATs.

Klosterman led all rushers with 72 yards on 15 carries. Bruns added 54 yards on 11 carries and Jordan Chapin who has proved to be valuable second running back added another 37 yards on just 3 carries.

Bruns had a pretty good night passing as he was 14 of 27 for 195 yards and three touchdowns, but he also threw 2 picks.

Otten led all receivers with 63 yards on 4 catches. Siefring had 32 yards on his two touchdown catches. Josh Huber had 57 yards on 3 catches and Mestemaker had 40 yards on three catches. Five of Bruns' passes went for 28, 20, 23, 24 and 23 yards.

Coldwater is getting good results from the kicking game too. Kyle Bergman's two punts averaged 47 yards and Otten's five kickoffs averaged 56 yards including two touchbacks.

The next two weeks will be very important for the Cavs as they pursue a MAC football title. In two weeks they travel to Maria Stein to play Marion Local but first they return home to host the defending D6 state champion Delphos St John Bluejays. The Jays are 4-2 on the season but are undefeated in the MAC. Friday night the Jays disposed of Versailles 31-7.

St. John has won the last two meetings with Coldwater including last seasons hard fought 14-0 shutout. Coldwater leads the series 22-15-1 (18-13-1 in the MAC).

As week 7 begins the D5 Region 20 computer points will start to be more

closely watched. See current standings below.
