ARE YOU READY FOR SOME FOOTBALL?
Tomorrow night the Coldwater Cavaliers will kick off the 2011 season hosting the defending WBL champion Kenton Wildcats.

This is the 76th season of Coldwater football under the direction of second year head coach Chip Otten. This season also marks the 50th Anniversary of the 1961 undefeated team coached by John Ponzuric.

The Cavaliers are coming off a very successful 2010 campaign which saw them go 11-4 and play in their second consecutive state title game. It was also their fourth trip to the title game in six years having captured the title in 2005 and 2007.

This year sees 12 seniors return to improve on a three year record of 36-7. They will be joined by a half dozen juniors who saw significant varsity action last season. But many fans will be watching junior quarterback Austin Bruns. He worked very hard during the spring and summer to improve his skill set and looks to have a break out year. Not that last season wasn't great for a sophomore. Bruns completed 170 passes for 2477 yards and 24 touchdowns.

Most of the receivers from last years team graduated but keep an eye on Troy Otten, Alex Stammen and Caleb Siefring who combined for 288 yards last season.

Coach Otten feels he has about 10 players he can throw the ball to with success, so opposing teams will not be able to key on just one or two receivers.

Drew Klosterman is the leading returning rusher having gained 270 yards last season.

The Coldwater defense is coached once again this season by Tim Hoying and they looked very stout during the pre-season not allowing a touchdown in two scrimmages. Jordan Chapin returns after leading the defense with 151 tackles last season.

HERE KITTY KITTY...

Kenton returns to Cavalier Stadium off of an 11-2 season that saw them advance to the regional championship in division four. Last season Kenton beat the Cavs in a high scoring affair 50-31 at Robinson Field in Kenton. In his varcity debut Austin Bruns completed 22 of 46 passes for 229 and five touchdowns.

His counterpart for the Wildcats, Mr. Ohio candidate Maty Mauk did it all for the Cats, throwing for 437 yards on 38-59 passing and five touchdowns. He added 73 yards on the ground in 21 rushes scoring two more touchdowns. The Cavs are 9-2 in season openers versus Kenton and 17-10 all time.
