Cavaliers Defeat the Indians - Ready for Playoffs

For the second week in a row the Coldwater Cavaliers faced a less talented opponent and the results were nearly identical. The Cavs scored three touchdowns in both the first and second quarters enroute to a 42-14 victory over the Ft. Recovery Indians. The victory give te Cavs sole possession of 2nd place the MAC with a 7-1 record and 8-2 overall. They will travel to Pemberville and face the Eastwood Eagles in the Regional Quarterfinals of the OHSAA Playoffs next Saturday.

All of Coldwater's scoring came between the 5:00 mark of the first quarter and the 8:17 mark of the second quarter or 9:43 of game time but just 3:16 of possession time. That's 42 points in just over three minutes of play.

Adam Klosterman drew first blood as he caught a perfect over the shoulder 53 yard pass from Brody Hoying. At the 1:12 mark Hoying scampered 47 yards for a score and just 34 seconds later he hit Kraig Schoenheer with a 45 yard TD strike. With just 16 seconds expired on the 2nd quarter clock, Hoying scored again on a 21 yard rush. Later the Cavs scored two more times in 42 seconds as Jason Bills got his first touchdown of the season on a 2 yard pass from Hoying and Klosterman closed out the scoring with a 27 yard interception return. In total the Cavaliers ran 12 plays (including the interception) gaining 195

yards and 42 points which includes 6 PATs by Kyle McKibben who replaced the injured Matt Kremer.

For the evening, Hoying rushed 3 times for 77 yards and 2 TDs. He was 5 of 7 passing for 114 and 3 scores. On the season Hoying has run for 1011 yards and thrown for 1328 more.

The reserves again played the last 2 ½ quarters so the final stats make the game look closer than it was. Coldwater ran 36 plays for 244 yards while the Indians ran 66 plays for 238 yards.

Coldwater will begin their 2013 playoff quest as they travel to

Pemberville to face the 8-2 Eagles. This will be the first meeting between these teams. Eastwood is a member of the Northern Buckeye Conference where they finished second to Genoa Area who was a perfect 10-0.

The Eagles are lead by Head Coach Jerry Rutherford who has been at Eastwood since 1981 (32 years). His teams have won 9 NBC titles and been to the playoffs seven times, their last appearance was in 2011, where they have posted a 6-7 record.

Eastwood appears to be a good matchup for Coldwater. They have scored 416 points while allowing just 143. Comparatively Coldwater has scored 332 and allowed 137.

Offensively they are led by Deven Snowden who has 134 rushes for 1106 yards and 14 TDs . Also, Grant Geiser has 54 rushes for 451 yards and 10 TDs . Their quarterback is Jake Schmeitz who in ten games has completed 39 of 70 passes for 623 yards and 12 TDs with 5 interceptions. His favorite receivers are Michael Flipse, 10 catches for 229 yards 6 TDs, and Grant Peters 11 catches for 124 yards and 3 TDs. The Eagles rely on their ground attack which is 82% of their offense and is averaging 7 yards per carry.

On defense the Eagles main stopper is Geiser who has 99 tackles, 15 for loss. Michael Glaze also has 15 tackles for loss and a team leading 7 sacks. Jordan Faykosh has 4 of the teams 11 interceptions. As a team Eastwood is plus 13 in turnovers (12 to 25).

Coldwater owns the longest active streak of playoffs appearances at 17straight years, including playing in the state championship game in each

of the last four seasons. Until last year, Columbus St. Francis DeSales owned the longest active streak at 18-straight years.

The MAC sends three teams to the playoffs this season including Marion Local and Delphos St. John. The MAC has won more state football titles than any other conference in the state. Delphos St. John's, Marion Local, St Henry and Versailles each have 6, Coldwater has 3 and Minster has 1 for a total of 28. The Greater Catholic League of Cincinnati is number 2 with 19 titles.
