The Cavaliers (and the rain) Douse The Bluejays

The Coldwater Cavaliers visited the Delphos St. John Bluejays at a soggy Stadium Park in Delphos and despite the conditions, the Cavaliers used a balance attack to score 27 unanswered points enroute to a 41-6 dousing of the Bluejays. It is interesting to note that Coldwater was victorious last season by the same score.

The Cavs were unaffected by a stead drizzle which fell during the entire game. Despite two lost fumbles they ground out 295 rushing and 135 passing yards for 430 total yards. Brody Hoying had his best effort of the season scoring three times on the ground and completing two touchdown passes. He ran the ball 10 times for 179 yards, averaging nearly 18 yard per carry and Mitch Schoenherr caught four passes for 62 yards.

Hoying scored just 50 seconds into the game on a 63 yard sprint. He then threw a touchdown pass to Schoenherr with just under three minutes left in the first quarter. The conditions slowed both teams down as they traded possessions for the entire second quarter until Coldwater mounted a drive late in the period with Hoying scoring from the one with :16 remaining and Coldwater led 20-0 at the half. Again in the third period, both teams struggled to move the ball into scoring position. Then suddenly, after the Cavs took possession at their own 15, Hoying ended all hopes of a Bluejay comeback as he took a sweep around the right end and down the sidelines for an 85 yard score as the third quarter expired. The fourth quarter opened with Delphos scoring on a 49 yard run, but on the ensuing possession Hoying hit Drew Otten on a six yard pass. Later, Kraig Schoenherr scored his first touchdown of the year on a 47 yard run to close the scoring.

The Coldwater defense continued to perform well allowing just 15 passing yards as Delphos choose to run the ball almost exclusively for just 158 yards.

Next Up - Minster

The Minster Wildcats will visit Cavalier Stadium this week in a battle for first place in the MAC. The Cavs, Cats and Flyers from Marion Local are locked in a first place tie after the first two weeks of MAC competition.

Last season Minster finished 9-3 and were regional semifinalist having made the playoffs for the third straight season. This year they have a new head coach, Geron Stokes, who spent the last four years at Urbana. The Cats are led this season by senior TE Ethan Wolf (6-6, 232) who will be playing college football for the University of Tennessee. Last season Wolf caught 77 passes for 885 yards and 14 TDs. Also returning are senior DL/OL Wes Hagerman (6-2, 250) and senior LB/RB Paul Dues (6-3, 185). Hagerman is a four-year starter, while Dues had 67.5 tackles, four forced fumbles and three INTs last year. Due to the MAC's revolving schedule, the Wildcats don't face Marion Local during the regular season, so a victory over the Cavaliers would make their road to a MAC title much easier.
