Turnovers Crash the Rockets

The Coldwater Cavaliers converted three turnovers into points during the first seven minutes of the game and did not look back enroute to a 43-7 defeat of the Anna Rockets at Cavalier Stadium Friday night.

Adam Klosterman intercepted a pass at the 10:44 mark and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown. Three minutes later Brody Hoying capped a 2 play 69 yard drive with a 16 yard touchdown run and then with 5:04 left on the first quarter clock Matt Kremer nailed a 22 yard field goal and Coldwater led 16-0.

Then Brody Hoying went on a tear. He score three more times in the first half on runs of 11, 14 and 1 yard and Coldwater took a commanding 37-0 lead into the locker room at halftime.

In the second half, as is his habit when sporting a commanding, Coach Chip Otten emphasized the running game to bleed the clock and gave second teamers significant playing time. This led to a 1 yard touchdown run by Chris Post to complete the Coldwater scoring. Anna, who at times were able to move the ball effectively, finally crossed the goal line with 10 minutes to play for their only score. On the night the Rockets tallied 225 yards of total offense, but 3 interceptions and loosing three of four fumbles killed their best drives.

Hoying finished with 76 yards and four TDs, Kraig Schoenheer tallied 42 yards and Post another 23 yards. The passing game was not particularly effective on the evening as Hoying completed just 5 of 10 passes for 80 yards an one interception. Drew Otten caught two passed for 40 yards and Derek Thobe

caught two more for 29 yards. For the defense Klosterman, Otten and Aaron Harlamert each had one interception.

Anna drops to 2-5 and 1-4 in league play while the victory pushes Coldwater to 6-1 and 5-0 in the MAC. The win also sets up the game which will decided who wins the MAC title in 2013.

Next Up - Marion Local

The Marion Local Flyers, defending Division 6 State Champions, enter this seasons game with the Cavaliers sporting a perfect 7-0 record. The Flyers return most of their starters from last season including Senior QB Adam Bertke who is verbally committed to the University of Pittsburg. Unfortunately Bertke broke a bone in his throwing hand in week 5 and will not see action against the Cavaliers. Junior RB/DB Jacey Goettemoeller is one of Ohio's premier players and a first team All-MAC selection as a sophomore. He tweaked his ankle in that same week 5 game but should see playing time against the Cavaliers. Despite these injuries the Flyers are still loaded with talent and this game will be of great interest across the entire state of Ohio.
