## Extending a record

Brody Hoyng ended last season by rushing for at least 100 yards in all five state playoff games to establish a new record at Coldwater for consecutive 100 yard rushing games. With 200 yards against Kenton Friday night, the record is now 6 games.

Brody is now fifth on the all time Coldwater rushing list with 2166 yards. Kevin Hoyng is the all time leader with 2968 yards.

## Coldwater Opens Season With A Victory Over Kenton

The season opener between Coldwater and Kenton has been an annual event since 2000. It has proved to be a good test for both teams as they try to determine how good a football team they are before entering their conference schedules. And for Coldwater the computer points a victory provides could prove to be the difference between going to the post season or getting ready for basketball season.

The last two meetings have been very interesting though. In 2013 Kenton was a veteran team who traveled to Coldwater to meet a team that despite being a defending state champ was in rebuild mode and trying to find their identity. This season Coldwater is the veteran team who traveled to Kenton to meet a team that graduated most of their skill positions and lost a veteran coach who had guided them to two state titles. So the story lines were pretty much reversed.

And in the end the score was pretty much reversed too. Last season Kenton won 22-02, this year Coldwater ended on top 24-02.

Coldwater's senior quarterback Brody Hoyng picked up where he left off last December. He scored three touchdowns and added a two point conversion.

## Coldwater to Face Bishop Hartley For Third Time in 12 Months

Coldwater welcomes Columbus Bishop Hartley to Cavalier Stadium next week to complete the two year home-at-home series. Next season Delphos Jefferson will replace Bishop Hartley as the week 2 opponent.

He led all rushers with 200 yards averaging 8 yards per carry and was 8 of 13 passing for 114 yards.

The Cavalier defense allowed just 182 yards passing and minus 27 yards rushing as they chased the Kenton quarterback all over the Wildcat backfield sacking him 11 times for minus 41 yards.

The Cavaliers took their opening drive 38 yards in just 3 plays as Hoyng covered the last 33 yards himself to put Coldwater on top 7-0 less than three minutes into the game.

Four minutes later Hoyng scored on a five yard run as Coldwater again worked from a short field covering 25 yards in 4 plays. After he ran in the 2 point conversion the score was 15-0.

From that point the Kenton defense figured out the Coldwater offense to some extent and slowed the Cavs down. In the second quarter Kyle McKibben kicked a 19 yard field goal and Coldwater led at the break 18-0.

Late in the third quarter Kenton pinned Coldwater in at their own 2 yard line and the defense provided Kenton their only score of the night as they sacked Hoyng in the end zone for a safety.

Hoyng and the Cavs answered in the final quarter when they travelled 80 yards in 6 plays with Hoyng providing the final points of the evening with a 13 yard scamper to set the final score.

The Cav defense, which forced three Kenton turnovers, Derek Thobe and Aaron Harlamert each had an interception. Mitch Fullenkamp had 4 sacks and 3 tackles for loss.

Thobe led the receiving corp with 2 catches for 44 yards, Harlamert caught 3 for 28 yards and Kraig Schoenherr caught one pass for 27 yards.

After winning the last 7 games of the 2013 season, Coldwater is now riding an 8 game winning streak, their longest since running the table in 2012 with a 15-0 record.

**The MAC Had a Very Good Night** as they captured seven victories including a surprising 40-34 overtime victory by Delphos St. Johns over Elida. While Anna, Marion Local, Minster and St. Henry had convincing victories, Ft. Recovery survived by a single point.

Versailles and Parkway were soundly defeated. But despite fielding just 34 players New Bremen scored four times in a 49-26 loss to Allen East.
