Coldwater Puts a 'Goose' on Delphos St. John

The Coldwater Cavaliers travelled to Stadium Park in Delphos and for the fourth time this season they held their opponents scoreless as they shut down the St. John Blue Jays 49-0.

It was the fifth game this season the Cav "D" did not allow a score as they forced two turnovers and limited the Jays to just 64 yards of total offense on 41 plays. In fact, the Jays had more return yardage, 140, on the Cavs nine kick off plays.

Meanwhile the offense continued to crank it up, gaining 230 yards on 25 rushes and another 212 passing yards on just 15 receptions.

Derek Thobe had a good game catching 5 passes for 188 yards and two touchdowns. Chris Post caught four passes for 54 yards and four other Cavaliers caught passes including Aaron Harlamert who caught a touchdown pass.

Brody Hoying was once again the straw that stirred the drink as he totaled 144 yards on nine carries and two touchdowns. One of those TDs came on the Cavaliers first score as he got loose for 72 yards at the 6:06 mark of the first quarter. Kyle McKibben's PAT was good and the score was 7-0 Cavaliers.

Five minutes later Hoying found Harlamert for a 4 yard score. On the PAT, the center exchange was blown and McKibben instead of kicking the ball, threw it to Teddy Fisher to complete a broken play for a two point conversion. The Cavs led 15-0 after the first quarter.

The second quarter was uneventful until the Cavaliers scored three more times in the final six minutes of the period.

Hoying completed two touchdowns passes to Derek Thobe, one for 36 yards and another for 50 yards and Coldwater led 29-0 with 4:30 left in the half.

Delphos got the ball back and could not move it. The Cavs took over at the Jays 30. The Cavs went into hurry mode to put one more score on the board before half time. Using seven plays, Hoying covering the last five on a running play and after the PAT, the Cavaliers went in the locker room leading 35-0.

It was the second week in a row, the Cavs put up 30+ first half points which forced the running clock rule to be engaged in the second half.

Both teams started the second half with their JV squads on the field. The teams were a little more evenly matched but the Cavalier second and third

strings were determined to make their mark on this night.

In the third quarter Jack Hemmelgarn led the offense from his quarterback position passing for 48 yards completing four of his five passes.

Mitch Fullenkamp capped off a 66 yard 12 play drive diving in from the 1 yard line to increase the advantage to 42-0.

Midway through the four quarter as junior Andrew Gillum took a pitch from the Coldwater 24 yard line and displaying some fantastic cornering speed swept around the left side and was forced out of bounds 55 yard later to give the Cavs a first and goal at the Blue Jay eight yard line. Coach Otten allowed Gillum to finish what he stated this time going off right tackle to score untouched. It was Andrew's first touchdown of the season and the final score was set at 49-0.

Delphos falls to 4-5 and must travel to Marion Local for their final game of the year.

The win leaves Coldwater with an 8-1 record as they return home for the final game of the regular season hosting winless New Bremen. Coldwater defeated NB 30-21 last season and has won the last 14 meetings.

Week 8 saw a major shift in the Region 16 playoff standings. Coldwater moved from third to first on the strength of Kenton's game ending field goal to beat Celina and Hartley defeating D3 opponent DeSales. Chippewa dropped from the ranks of the undefeated losing to Hillsdale 18-15 making more room at the top for Coldwater.

According to Harbin prognosticator Bruce Monnin, the worst Coldwater can finish now is 4th, which guarantees a home game in Week 11. A loss by Liberty Benton, Marion Pleasant or Huron this week could solidify the Cavaliers position at #1. All three of these teams play on the road while Coldwater hosts 0-9 New Bremen.
