Cavaliers Ground the Rockets To Remain Perfect in 2014

With the 2014 season at the halfway point the Coldwater Cavaliers now stand at 5-0 after defeating the Anna Rockets by a final score of 34-21 at Booster Field in Anna. With the loss, Anna fall to 3-2.

The Cavs and Marion Local are the only undefeated teams left in the MAC. Coldwater is also #1 in the Division V AP Poll and sits atop the Region 16 playoff standings with 5 games left.

The Rockets started off fast shutting down the Coldwater offense and holding them scoreless in the first quarter. After scoring on a 40 yard pass play at the 8:24 mark, Anna became the first team to lead Coldwater on the scoreboard this season.

But that did not last for long.

Late in the first quarter the Cavalier offense found its rhythm and drove deep into Anna territory. Thirteen seconds into the second quarter Neal Muhlenkamp took a pass from Brody Hoying for 12 yards into the end zone and after the PAT Coldwater led 7-6.

Hoying was making his first start at quarterback after suffering a knee strain in week 2. Looking like he had some catching up to do, Hoying scored the next two Cavalier

touchdowns on runs of 10 and 5 yards as Coldwater took the lead at halftime 21-6

Anna dominated the first quarter and Coldwater the second. The second half was more evenly played.

At 9:24 of the third Coldwater covered 67 yards in just 6 plays and scored on a hook and lateral play with Chris Post covering the final 23 yards to put Coldwater up 27-6.

Not to be out done, Anna scored on a five yard run and with a successful pass on the point after closed their deficit to 27-14.

The first 8 minutes of the final quarter was a back and forth affair as the two teams traded punts. Then Coldwater capitalized on an Anna turnover at their own 18 yard line.

Five plays later Hoying found Derek Thobe from 15 yards out to give Coldwater a 34-14 lead.

Anna did not give up as they posted one more score with less than a minute to play to set the final score, 34-21.

The Coldwater defense gave up 208 rushing yards to a tough Anna offense whose forte is the run. On the night Anna totaled 323 yards but a fumble, interception and 7 penalties worked

against them.

Meanwhile the return of Hoying provided Coldwater with a shot in the arm as they rushed for 188 yards and picked up 228 yards passing on just 50 plays.

Hoying was the games leading rusher with 97 yards on 17 carries. Post picked up 21 yards on 7 totes.

Hoying also completed 16 of his 26 passes for 228 yards and two touchdowns - his first of the season. He also threw Coldwater's only interception so far this season.

Thobe lead all receivers with 99 yards on 4 catches with one touchdown. Post caught 6 for 40 yards and Muhlenkamp's once catch was good for 12 yards and a touchdown. But the most impressive receiving performance was Kyle McKibben who caught 5 passes for 77 yards. Kyle did not score but many of his catches were rather acrobatic and a couple had some impressive yards after the catch.

The first five games were the most difficult stretch on the schedule. The next five will have some lesser opponents but the match up in two weeks at Marion Local could well prove to be the MAC Championship game.

Parkway Next Up For The Cavaliers

This week Coldwater returns home to Cavalier Stadium to face the Parkway Panthers.

It has been a tough season for Parkway as they enter the game 0-5.

Coldwater leads the all time series 47-6-1 and have won

their last 25 matchups including last seasons 48-6 victory.

This years match up should provide an opportunity for some younger Cavs to get some playing time under the Friday night lights.
