Coldwater Too Much For Parkway

Coldwater defeated Parkway on the first chilly night of the fall season by a final score of 41-0.

Following a day of heavy rain showers, the temperature dropped as did the Panthers record to a bleak 0-6. Conversely the Cavaliers stayed perfect on the year at 6-0.

The Coldwater defense had its best performance of the season holding Parkway to just 75 total yards on 43 plays. CJ Seibert and Dylan Thobe each had an interception. CJ also captured the Homecoming Throne as he was named King of the festivities prior to the game.

Most of the game was played in Parkway territory as the Panthers only crossed the 50 a couple of times. They did get inside the Coldwater 20 once in the final quarter but were denied a score.

All of Coldwater's scores came during a 19 minute stretch of the first half. In the first quarter Brody Hoying scored on a 15 yard run. Shortly there after the Cavalier defense forced it's third safety of the season as Panther running back Cody Coffman was tackled in the end zone by Mitch Clune to bring the score to 9-0.

One minute later Hoying scored

again on a 5 yard run. Coldwater closed the first quarter as Hoying found Chris Post on a pass to complete an 11 yard touchdown and Coldwater led 22-0.

Post scored his second TD of the night on a 6 yard run in the second quarter and later Cory Selhorst got his first touchdown of the season on a 12 yard run.

Coldwater closed the scoring as Hoying got his second touchdown pass of the night by connecting with Derek Thobe on an 8 yard completion.

Kyle McKibben had a difficult night on PATs. He made his first two attempts to increase his consecutive made PATs to 12, but misfired on 2 of his next three attempts.

The varsity players took to the sidelines in the second half as for the first time the new running clock rule was implemented during a Coldwater game.

For the night the Cavaliers tallied 336 yards on 50 plays including 22 rushes for 106 yards and 230 yards in the air.

Brody Hoying led the offense with 53 yard rushing and 152 yard passing completing 11 of his 15 attempts.

Cory Selhorst had 28 yards rushing and Chris Post had 13. Neal Muhlenkamp, Mitch Fullenkamp and Caleb Keck each had one carry to contribute another 12 yards.

Jack Hemmelgarn ran the offense in the second half completing 7 of 12 passes for 78 yards.

The receiving corps were very effective catching 18 passes. Muhlekamp snagged 3 for 68 yards. Post was 2 for 42 yards. Aaron Harlamert tallied 29 yard s on 4 catches, McKibben and Thobe each caught 2 for 23 and 22 yards. Teddy Fisher also had two catches for 16 yards and Jason Kaiser caught his first pass of the year for 11 yards.

The victory assures Coldwater of a winning season for the 20th consecutive season since going 4-6 in 1994. It was also the 26th consecutive victory over Parkway, the longest wining steak Coldwater has over any opponent.

Halfway through the MAC schedule Coldwater and Marion Local stand on top at 4-0. Versailles and Ft. Recovery stand at 3-1. Minster and Anna can only hope to play spoilers at 2-2, while Saints Henry and John are a disappointing 1-3. New Bremen and Parkway will decide in Week 9 which one will occupy the MAC cellar as both teams are winless at 0-4.

Its Coldwater Versus Marion Local For All The MAC Marbles

Two undefeated, #1 AP, defending State Titleist will meet in Maria Stein next Friday as the Coldwater Cavaliers will travel to Marion Local for the second year in a row to battle the Marion Local Flyers for the top spot in the MAC. This game, which will be of high interest across Ohio, is probably the defacto MAC Championship Game. Coldwater has Versailles, St. John and New Bremen remaining whose records are 7-11 The Flyers have St. Henry, Ft. Recovery and St. Johns who total 11-7. These two teams met last season in Week 5 and Marion dominated the game winning 47-14. It was the Cavaliers worst defeat in a series they lead 32-25-4.

Coldwater will have to play its best game to come out on top.
