# **Cavaliers Rebound with Shut-out of Versailles**

The Coldwater Cavaliers rebounded from their first loss of the season by shutting out the Versailles Tigers 35-0 Friday night at Cavalier Stadium. It is the 11th straight defeat for Versailles at the hands of Coldwater.

The Cavalier offense got back on track with a balanced attack that compiled 186 yards on the ground and 180 thru the air.

Meanwhile the defense had their strongest showing of the season holding the Tigers to just 54 rushing yards and minus 1 yard passing for 53 yards of total defense. They also forced three fumbles, recovering two and Patrick Klosterman recorded his first interception of the season.

Coach Mark Bruns defense recorded their fourth shutout of the season as Versailles deepest penetration into Coldwater territory was the 40 yard line in the first quarter. In the final three quarters the Tigers never crossed midfield.

All the scoring for Coldwater took place in the first half and the second half lasted less than thirty minutes due to the running clock rule. Both teams played their reserves in the second half.

Coldwater scored their first touchdowns on the third play of the game as Brody Hoying scored on a 64 yard run just 48 seconds into the game.

With 3:23 left in the first Hoying got loose again along the home sidelines twisting, turning, slicing and dicing his way for 29 yards and his second touchdown. At the end of the first quarter Coldwater led 14-0

Two minutes into the second

quarter Hoying went to the air and found Neal Muhlenkamp for a 17 yard touchdown pass to top off a 9 play 55 yard drive.

The final minute of the first half saw the Cavaliers score twice in 49 seconds. Hoying scored his third rushing TD from 8 yards out to complete a 7 play 56 yard drive. Then after Versailles fumbled the ensuing kickoff, the Cavalier managed the clock and covered 51 yards in 5 plays culminating with Derek Thobe taking a 20 yard scoring pass from Hoying. After Kyle McKibben converted his fifth PAT of the night the score was 35-0 at halftime.

Once again, Hoying lead all rushers posting 163 yards on 17 carries and 3 touchdowns. He also contributed 165 yards on 9 of 17 passing for two touchdowns on a very windy night.

Chris Post led all receivers with 3 catches for 55 yards. Thobe caught 2 passes for 42 yards and a touchdown. Muhlenkamp totaled 30 yards on three catches and McKibben caught 1 pass for 28 yards.

The victory give Coldwater sole possession of 2nd place in the MAC. With the defeat Versailles falls to 5-3 as they will go from the frying pan into the fire as they host the #1 Marion Local Flyers next week.

Next Friday Coldwater will travel to Stadium Park in Delphos to face the 4-4 St. Johns Bluejays. The Jays started out strong defeating Elida and LCC, but have won only 2 of their last 6 games defeating New Bremen and Parkway who are both 0-8 on the season. Coldwater will be highly favored

but will have to keep their guard up.

The Cavaliers lead the all time series 25-15-1 winning 8 of the last 10 meetings including last seasons 41-6 rain soaked victory at Delphos.

# **Playoff update**

With the loss to Marion Local last week costing the Cavaliers a MAC title, all their attention is now focused on the on the playoffs.

According to Drew Pasteur, Coldwater is a 100% lock to make their 18th consecutive playoff appearance which is the longest active streak in the state of Ohio. The worst they can finish is 7th in Region 16.

To secure a home game in Week 11, the Cavs will needs some help. Losses in the last two weeks by any of the three remaining undefeated teams will help. Coldwater can also benefit with continued wins from Kenton and Hartley for those precious 2nd level points.

## **Brody & the Record Book**

Despite working through an injury this season Brody is improving his position in the Coldwater record book.

He needs nine rushing TDs to pass Tony Harlamert who is in second place with 55.

With 49 career TDs to date Brody needs 3 more to surpass Ross Homan for second place.

Ross also holds 2nd place with 312 career points. Brody is 16 points behind with 296.
