Cavaliers Rumble over Depleted Blue Jays 47-7

Playing their game like they have all season, the Coldwater Cavaliers dispatched the Delphos St. John Bluejays by a score of 47-7.

The offense continued to get a large number of players handling the ball and the defense was just simply lights out.

As a result the Cavs move to 9-0 on the season with one game to play. They have gained at least a share of their 18th MAC title. A victory next week at New Bremen will earn the program its 12th outright football championship and their first since 2012.

The game got off to a slow start for the Cavs as it appeared they were having a hard time getting motivated to play the Jays who entered the game with a 1-7 record. For only the second time this season they failed to score on their opening possession. Marion Local is the only team other team do that this season.

When the Cavaliers got the ball for the second time, they got down to business. Running nine plays and covering 80 yards, Kraig Schoenherr looked like a man among boys as he barreled his way into the end zone from 15 yards out to give the Cavaliers a 7-0 lead with 3:44 to play in the first quarter.

Less than two minutes later Coldwater got the ball back at the Jays 46 and needed just five plays to score again as Jack Hemmelgarn found Zach Homan for a 6 yard touchdown pass and the lead was 14-0 with just sixteen seconds left in the first quarter.

The fire works continued in the second quarter as Coldwater scored four more times. Chris Post scored twice on a 28 yard pass from Hemmelgarnn and on a 5 yard run after the Cavalier defense block a Blue Jay punt and recovered it at the 7 yard line.

Kyle McKibben who was 5 for 6 in the PAT department on the night got two touchdowns on a 3 yard run and again on a 12 yard pass. With 3:43 left in the second quarter Coldwater led 41-0.

During the second quarter Coldwater got a mix of varsity and JV players on the field and the second string pretty much played out the second half themselves.

Delphos got on the board the only time they managed to cross 50 yard line. With 10 minutes remain-

Coldwater to Visit New Bremen in Week 10 Matchup

The final game of the regular season will see Coldwater travelling to New Bremen to face a very young and struggling Cardinal football team.

The Cardinals opened the season with a 21-0 shutout of Bradford, but the last eight weeks have been difficult for the Bremen boys.

In week two Holgate bested them 25-14 but once the MAC season started the Cards have only mustered 6, 6, 0, 0, 0, 6 and 7 points in their last seven games.

The last time New Bremen beat Coldwater was a 23-0 upset in 1997.

The playoff picture is pretty clear for Coldwater at this point. As ex-

pected the Cavaliers dropped to 3rd place in the region but a week 11 home game is a lock no matter what happens next week. The best the Cavs can finish is second.

Brookville and CHCA will finish 1-2 unless one of them loses in which case the loser will drop to third.

At this point it appears as though Coldwater's week 11 opponent will be #6 Carlisle. Cincinnati Aiken or Richwood North Union could finish #6 if other chips fall just right.

ing in the game they scored on a 1 yard run.

Later Seth Obringer score his first touchdown of the season to set the final score at 47-7.

The offense was nicely balanced for the Cavaliers as they totaled 343 yards on 164 rushing yards and 179 passing yards.

Hemmelgarn was 9 of 12 passing for 122 yards and 3 touchdowns. Dylan Thobe was 1 of 3 passing for 57 yards.

Seth Obringer lead the receiving corps with one catch for 57 yards. Post caught 3 for 49 and Aaron Harlamert caught 2 for 33. Six Cavaliers caught passes on the evening.

Nine Cavaliers carried the ball including Post who tallied 53 yards and Schoenherr who got 46.

The defense only allowed a total of 2 yards and no first downs in the first half and finished the night allowing just 66 yards on 44 plays and 4 first downs.

They also picked off three Delphos passes, two by McKibben to give him four on the season and another by Jacob Schwieterman.
