Coldwater Powers Past CHCA 44-14

Boasting size, strength and a number of Division 1 prospects, the Eagles of Cincinnati Christian Hills Academy presented a daunting challenge to the undefeated Coldwater Cavaliers in the Region 18 semifinal at Alexander Stadium in Piqua.

But as they have done so many times before the Coldwater Cavaliers rose to the challenge and schooled the Eagles to the tune of a 44-14 victory. #3 Coldwater at 12-0 advances to the regional final against 12-0 and #1 Brookville. #2 CHCA closes a successful season at 10-2.

The Cavs got off a slow start failing to score on their first possession for only the third time this season. But once they got on track it was fast and furious.

At the 3:00 mark of the first quarter Aaron Harlamert capped a 9 play 82 yard drive with a 16 yard touchdown run. Coldwater led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter. No opponent has scored on Coldwater in the first quarter this season.

In the second quarter the Cavaliers did something very rare as they drove 92 yards consuming 14 plays and most of the second quarter clock to score their second TD. Jack Hemmelgarn found Chris Post on a 21 yard pass play to put Coldwater up 14-0 with 5:32 left in

the half. It was the most number of plays consumed by the Cavs on a scoring drive this season.

By comparison, last week Coldwater used a total of 15 plays to score six touchdowns on Bethel-Tate.

Seeing the game start to slip away CHCA got on their horses and scored on a 3 yard run with 2:04 remaining to set the score at 14-6 after a missed extra point.

Coldwater, knowing that they would receive the second half kickoff, saw the opportunity to put up two scores without the Eagles getting the ball back. So they switched to lightening mode and took the ball 78 yards in nine plays culminating with Kyle McKibben catching a 3 yard pass from Hemmelgarn with just :17 seconds left and the Cavs led 21-6 at halftime.

Then to start the second half Neal Muhlenkamp took the kickoff back to the CHCA 32 and 7 plays later Harlamert scored again on an 11 yard jaunt. Coldwater led 28-6.

Ninety seconds later Muhlenkamp struck again, this time intercepting a pass a taking it 38 yards to the Eagle 7. Two plays later Post scored his second touchdown on a 1 yard run.

CHCA failed to move the ball again and Coldwater took over at their own 49. Needing only three plays,

Post scored again, this time from six yards out, and the Cavaliers led 41-6 with 4:56 left in the third. Queue the CHCA bus drivers.

The final quarter saw CHCA score on a 10 yard run and Kyle McKibben nailed a 29 yard field goal, his third FG of the season, to set the final score.

Despite giving up 14 points for the second time this season, the Cavalier defense was stellar against a much bigger opponent. They allowed just 103 yard rushing on 27 carries and 170 yards on 9 of 19 passes with 2 interceptions.

Chris Post was the work horse for the Cavs gaining 120 yards on 20 carries scoring 2 TDs and catching 5 passes for 101 yards and a third TD. If Post is the 'ground' then Kraig Schoenherr is the 'pound' as he picked up 56 yards on 8 carries and made CHCA tacklers pay a painful price to bring him down.

Jack Hemmelgarn was nearly perfect completing 18 of his 20 passes for 208 yards and two TDs. Aaron Harlamert caught 6 passes for 43 yards and McKibben snagged 3 for 14 yards and a touchdown.

Offensive totals for Coldwater totaled 202 yards on 36 carries plus Hemmelgarn's 208 passing equals 410 yards on 57 plays or 7.2 yards per play. Outstanding!

Its Coldwater Versus Brookville in Regional Final

The last two undefeated teams in Region 18 will face one another for the Regional Championship as the Coldwater Cavaliers will face the Brookville Blue Devils.

Brookville is coached by the son of former Versailles Head Coach Al Hetrick, Mike Hetrick, who has led the Blue Devils since 2000.

They have been the playoffs four times under Hetrick (2000, 07, 08 & 15) and their two playoff wins this season are their first since the 2000 season.

The Devils are primarily a running

team working from the I and T formations. Their leading rushers are senior Harry Hall and sophomore Bailey Wallen.

Coldwater last played Brookville in the season opener from 1993 to 1998. The Cavs lead the series 4-2 having won the last four games.

For the second week the Cavaliers will play in Piqua, a sort of home way from home. The Cavs have played at Piqua 7 times since 2007 and are undefeated at Alexander Stadium. The most memorable? No doubt the triple overtime 59-52 victory over Kettering Alter in 2007.
