# **Backyard Battle? Not So Much**

On Friday night the Coldwater Cavaliers traveled the nine miles from their locker room to the Wally Post Athletic Complex in St. Henry and defeated the previously unbeaten Redskins by a score of 38-0.

They have called it the Backyard Battle for years and there have been some classics like the 47-41 four overtime thriller in the 2009 regional final in Wapak or the 7-6 slugfest in 2010 both won by the Cavaliers. But in the last few years their meetings have not really been battles at all as the Cavaliers have won by combined scores of 165-20.

The Cavalier defense had another outstanding game as they limited the Redskins to a total of 94 yards, 53 on the ground and 41 in the air. The Skins never got the ball inside the Coldwater 20 yard line.

Kyle McKibben and Tony Rammel each had an interception and Rammel had the biggest play of the night as in the first quarter he blocked a St. Henry punt. He and the punter chased the ball into the end zone where Tony shoved his nemesis out of the way and pounced on the ball to record a touchdown. On offense, Coldwater gained 313 total yards on just 37 plays, 79 rushing yards and 234 passing.

Senior quarterback Jack Hemmelgarn had another big night as he connected on 11 of his 16 passes for 230 yards and 3 touchdowns.

His biggest pass was the shortest one he threw all night as on the third play from scrimmage he shoveled the ball to Kraig Schoenherr who romped for 65 yards to put the Cavs up 7-0. This season the Cavs have scored on all four of their opening possessions.

On their next possession the Redskin defense stiffened and forced the Cavs to kick a field goal. Kyle McKibben nailed the 27 yard attempt and the Cavs led 10-0 with just six minutes expired on the first quarter clock. The blocked punt for the touchdown occurred on St. Henry's next possession and after one quarter Coldwater led 17-0.

A light rain fell during the second quarter and slowed things down a little for both teams. Hemmelgarn hit his second touchdown pass, this one for 7 yards to Aaron Harlamert. The halftime score was Coldwater 24 St. Henry 0.

## **Anna Rockets Coming to Town**

Fans of the Ohio State Buckeyes know well that Hawaii and Northern Illinois gave the Buckeyes plenty of trouble the past two weeks. In the next two weeks, Coldwater needs to use those games as object lessons on what can happen if you don't give serious consideration and effort against lesser opponents.

After facing four quality opponents (at least in terms of past performance) in the first four weeks of the season, the Cavaliers now look forward to facing two teams who though not highly touted could be even more dangerous than previous opponents.

First up is the Anna Rockets who come to town with a 1-3 record (1-

1 in MAC play). Anna opened the season losing three straight, but finally got a win against winless Parkway last Friday 27-6. The Cavaliers travel to Rockford to face Parkway in Week 6.

Anna was 5-5 last season and this year have a new head coach in Nick Marino who came from Urbana where in two season he was 17-4.

Anna has not had much success against Coldwater. The Cavs lead the series 11-1 and are nursing a five game win steak against the Rockets. Coach Otten is 5-1 all time after last years 34-21 victory.

The Rockets last got the best of the Cavaliers in 2010 for their only win

the fourth quarter as Chris Post scored twice on a 4 yard run and a 5 yard pass from Hemmelgarn.

Post finished the game with 25 rushing yards on 10 carries. Hemmelgarn added 14, McKibben added another 22. Reserves Dylan Thobe had 8 yard and Nate Rindler had 10 yards.

Aaron Harlamert led the air-corps as he caught 6 passes for 133 yards. Schoenherr had 80 yards. McKibben, Post and Zach Klosterman had 12, 5 and 4 yards respectively.

In addition to his first field goal of the season, McKibben was 5 for 5 in PATs pushing him to 20 for 20 this season. Kyle also exceled in kickoffs as five of his seven kicks sailed into the end zone for touchbacks.



in the series by a score of 38-28.

Anna is also in the same playoff Region as Coldwater (Region 18) which gives this game added significance.

After four weeks of play we can look to the first official release of Harbin playoff points. Currently Coldwater sits on top of Region 18 with a 4-0 record.

Brookville (4-0) in second place is the only other undefeated team in the entire Region which does not speak well for the strength of the teams in the region.

Fellow MAC teams Versailles and Anna are also in Region 18 and are 8th and 21st respectively.
