Coldwater Defeats Anna 40-7

The Coldwater Cavaliers completed the halfway point of the 2015 season with a 40-7 victory over league rival Anna at Cavalier Stadium on Friday night. With the win Coldwater moves to 5-0 on the season and sits atop the MAC with a 3-0 record. The Rockets fall to 1-4 (1-2).

The score does not indicate how competitive the game was. Anna used a very deliberate running game to slow the clock down and keep the Coldwater offense off the field. But the Cavaliers countered by being efficient on offense, scoring on 6 of their 10 possessions.

The offense did give minor cause for concern as they committed two turnovers and had a few bad center exchanges. Not the kind of things fans like to see at this point of the season especially with Marion Local waiting in the wings for a Week 7 showdown. And maybe that is in the back of the players minds too.

The Cav offense continues to feature a balanced attack that spreads the wealth as they gained 165 rushing yards and 137 in the air over 51 plays. Eight players carried the ball and 7 caught passes. Six different players scored Coldwater's six touchdowns.

Meanwhile the Cavalier defense continues to dominate opponents and give the offense the best opportunities. They only allowed Anna 37 plays which was partly because of Anna's desire to slow the game down. But what really stood out on this night was the Rockets gained just 2 rushing yards on 27 attempts and 31 yards on 10 passes. That is a total of 33 yards or .9 yards per play!

Chris Post opened the scoring on a 4 yard pass from Jack Hemmelgarn as the first quarter was about to expire. It capped a 13 play 73 yard drive, Coldwater's longest possession this season. The other scoring drives were more common to Cavalier football.

Aaron Harlamert ran a punt back 40 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter. Later, Kraig Schoenherr scored on a 7 yard run to close out the first half with Coldwater leading 20-0.

Zach Homan opened the third quarter catching a 20 yard pass from Hemmelgarn and a short time later Kyle McKibben scored on a 1 yard plunge. In the fourth quarter the JVs took over and Dylan Thobe scored on a six yard run and Coldwater lead 40-0.

The shut out was blown late in the 4th quarter when Thobe made an ill advise pass into the right flat which an Anna defender intercepted and ran 64 yards back to the Coldwater 1 yard line. It was Anna's biggest play of the night which more than doubled the offensive output of the Rockets. One play later Anna scored with just 3:07 to play and the final score was set at 40-7.

Individually Post carried the ball 12 times for 94 yards. Schoenherr had 26 yards on a pair of totes.

Hemmelgarn finished 12 of 16 passing for 131 yards and two touchdowns. Schoenherr caught 3 of those passes for 49 yards and Zach Homan had 2 for 33 yards.

Kyle McKibben carried it twice for 21 yards. He continues to improve as a kicker as he kicked the ball 7 times for an average of 55 yards. 4 of his kicks went for touchbacks. He did have a bummer of a night in the PAT department though. After extending his streak to 22 consecutive PATs he misfired for the first time this season. He now has to start all over with a streak of 2 PATs

Next up for the Cavs is Parkway.

Cavaliers Travel to Rockford for Week 6 Matchup

Next week Coldwater plays at Parkway to continue what has been their most dominate series in MAC play. The Cavaliers lead the series 48-6-1 and after last seasons 41-0 shutout they own a 26 game winning streak. Coldwater needs to focus on the Panthers and prepare well as they return home in two weeks for the showdown of the season as they host undefeated defending Division 7 State Champion Marion Local.

Playoff Update

The Cavaliers continue to lead Region 18 with a 5-0 record followed by the only other undefeated team in the region, Brookville. MAC foe Versailles continues to hold onto the #8 spot after five weeks of competition.

Schedule Update

Coldwater AD Eric Goodwin announced last week that the Cavaliers will travel to Clarksville to take on Clinton Massie in week 2 of the 2018 season. Massie returns the favor, visiting Coldwater in 2018. Coldwater has played Massie once, in the 2007 Regional Final at Welcome Stadium in Dayton. Coldwater prevailed in that game and went on to win their second state championship.
