Coldwater Defeats Parkway 42-7

It was a rainy night with gusty winds blowing all game long, but the Coldwater Cavaliers ignored the harsh conditions and blitzed the Parkway Panthers with 3 first quarter touchdowns enroute to a 42-7 victory. With the win Coldwater moves to 6-0 and 4-0 in the MAC. Parkway, fraught with injuries remains winless on the season.

Early in the first quarter following a Parkway turnover on a bad punt snap, Cory Selhorst completed a 4 play 18 yard drive with a 2 yard touchdown run.

Three minutes later Jack Hemmelgarn completed a pass to Aaron Harlamert who ran 43 yards for the Cavs second score.

Then, as time expired in the opening quarter, Kraig Schoenherr completed a bruising 17 yard run to crack the end zone for the Cavs third touchdown. The snap on the PAT was sloppy and as Hemmelgarn ran away from pursuing Panthers he found kicker/receiver Kyle McKibben in the flat and heaved a desperation pass that Kibby took into the end zone for a 2 point conversion and the Cavs moved to a 22-0 advantage.

Getting Down to the Nitty Gritty

Two games in the next two weeks will go a long way in determining who will win the MAC title.

Coldwater, Fort Recovery and Marion Local have perfect league and overall records (4-0, 6-0) and sit on top of the Midwest Athletic Conference.

Coldwater hosts Marion Local this week and the Flyers host Fort Recovery next week. Coldwater does not play Ft. Recovery this season so this weeks match up with the Flyers is for all the marbles as far as the Cavaliers are concerned.

Beat Marion and they gain at least a share of the conference title with the Indians and hope the Indians falter against Minster, Marion Lodeliberate on offense. They used most of the second quarter clock to run 9 plays covering 66 yards, the final 46 yards coming when Hemmelgarn and Harlamert hooked up for their second touchdown pass of the night. The PAT kick missed the mark and Coldwater led 28-0 at halftime.

Early in the third quarter Kraig Schoenherr scored his second touchdown of the game when Hemmelgarn hit him with a pass that he took 40 yards to pay dirt.

The JVs got in on the action from that point and when Dylan Thobe passed 15 yards to Zach Homan the Cavaliers had a commanding 42-0 lead.

The Panthers Justin Barna got Parkway on the board with 3:47 remaining to set the final score at 42-7.

Despite the strong winds, Jack Hemmelgarn had a good night throwing the ball completing 14 of his 20 passes for 254 yards and 3 touchdowns. Kraig Schoenherr and Aaron Harlamert each scored two touchdowns to lead the Cavaliers.

Brad Giere led the Cavalier rushers with 57 yards on eight carries.

If Marion defeats the Cavs and Indians it will secure another MAC title for the Flyers.

Coldwater will have to reverse their fortunes with the Flyers as their last two meetings, both in Maria Stein, have seen the Flyers dominate the Cavaliers. In 2013 it was a 47-14 beat-down and in 2014 it was a 20-0 shutout.

But this season the game will be at Cavalier Stadium and Head Coach Chip Otten will be looking to even his record against the Flyers which stands at 3-3. Coldwater lead the series 32-26-4.

One might think that this season Coldwater should be favored in this Harlamert's three catches netted him 108 yards in receptions.

For the game Coldwater rushed the ball 21 times for 61 yards and caught 16 passes for 275 yards for a total of 336 yards on just 45 plays.

The Coldwater defense continues to be stellar and they allowed the Panthers just 183 yards, 96 on the ground and 87 in the air. The defense still has not allowed a touchdown in the first three quarters of any game this season and the starting defense remains perfect in not allowing any team to score yet.

The victory leaves Coldwater sharing the top spot in the MAC with Fort Recovery and Marion Local, all with perfect 4-0 league records. Minster, St. Henry and St. Johns are in second place at 2-2 in the MAC. Versailles and Anna are 1-3 while New Bremen and Parkway are looking for that first league win.

In Region 18 Coldwater maintains the top spot followed by Brookville. Both teams are 6-0 overall. Versailles lost to St. Henry and thus fell out of the 8th playoff position, replaced by Cincinnati Madeira.

match up given the way the teams have played so far. Marion has a number of younger players and Coldwater returned more veterans. But Flyer Head Coach Tim Goodwin is adept at getting his teams to improved week to week. The earlier in the season you catch the Flyers the better chance you have.

On paper Coldwater appears to have played a stronger schedule and the defense has made a strong statement so far this season. But games aren't played on paper are they?
