Cavaliers Tame the Tigers 44-7.

It was a cold night in Versailles as the weather turned more football like than in the previous seven weeks of the season. The only ones feeling the chill though were the Tigers and their fans who saw their team shut down by the Coldwater Cavaliers to the tune of 44-7.

There was one warm moment for the home team as they did what no other team has done all season to the Cavalier defense.

After a Coldwater punt into a stiff north wind, the Tigers took possession at the Cavalier 32 yard line and in nine plays they moved to the Coldwater one yard line. On 4th and goal a one yard dive off left tackle saw the Cavs yield their first first-half touchdown this season.

That will be only stat the Tigers can feel good about as on the night. The Cavalier defense only allowed 66 total yards on 42 plays. It is the third time this season the Cavs have held a team to less than 100 yards of total offense.

As for the Cavalier offense, it was the Chris 'Petey' Post Show costaring Kraig 'Thor' Schoenherr.

Petey ran for four touchdowns on 14 carries totally 99 yards. Thor let

Delphos St. John Next up for Cavaliers

The Blue Jays from Delphos St. John visit the friendly confines of Cavalier Stadium next Friday night.

Normally a visit by the Jays would be a highly anticipated matchup. But in the last couple of years the St. John program has fallen on hard times. They will miss the playoffs this year for the first time since 2006. They made it last year despite a 4-6 regular season and lost in week 11.

So far this season St. Johns is 1-7 with their only victory coming against 1-7 New Bremen. Last week they were edged out by Parkway 28-25. It was the first time the Panthers have defeated the Jays since 2007. loose his inner beast as he rushed for 61 yards on two carries, one for 57 yards that moved Coldwater into scoring position. He also caught 2 passes for 99 yards including a short pass that he turned into an 87 yard touchdown, the third longest touchdown pass in Coldwater history.

Jack Hemmelgarn continues to provide solid play from the quarterback position as he was a highly effective 9 or 12 passing for 272 yards. His favorite receiver Aaron Harlamert caught 3 of those passes for 117 yards including one that went for 49 yards.

Coldwater won the toss of the coin and elected to go on defense first. When they got the ball for their first possession they did what they have done in 6 of the 7 previous games, they scored the first time they touched the ball.

Neal Muhlenkamp got is first rushing touchdown of the season, 16 yards, to cap a 7 play 70 yard drive to open the scoring with 5:13 on the first quarter clock.

Two minutes later, Post got his first score on a 14 yard run and after one quarter Coldwater led 14-0.

The last few meetings between the Cavs and Jays have been dominated by the Cavs who have won the last three meetings by a combined score of 131-12.

The 2011 meeting was the last classic matchup between these two historically successful programs.

Coldwater jumped out to a quick 10-0 lead in the first quarter thanks to a 53 yard TD pass from Austin Bruns to Josh Huber and a Troy Otten 42 yard field goal.

Delphos scored once in both the second and third quarters to take a 14-10 lead until the 1:13 mark of the fourth quarter. Bruns found Caleb Siefring on an 18 yard pass to seal the victory for the Cavaliers. down pass from Hemmelgarn, Kyle McKibben found Jacob Schwieterman in the end-zone to complete the two point conversion and Coldwater was on top at 22-0.

Versailles only touchdown of the night left the score at 22-7 when the two teams went to their locker room for a little warmth at half time.

Post score two more times in the third on runs of 17 and 1 yard. He scored his final touchdown two minutes into the fourth, this time from 24 yards out, to move the score to 42-7.

For the 5th time this season the mercy rule went into affect and the clock ran non-stop. Late in the 4th quarter a beautiful 51 yard Ryan Griesdorn punt pinned Versailles at their two yard line. A muffed center snap into the end zone resulted in a safety which set the final score at 44-7.

Coldwater moves to 8-0 on the season while Versailles drops to 4-4. The loss pretty much dashes the Tigers playoff chances, while Coldwater remains #1 in Region 18 with two games to play. The Cavaliers are officially a lock to host a week 11 home game.
