Parkway Provides Little Resistance in Coldwater Victory

It was the 14th century English author John Heywood who is credited with first saying "Many hands make light work." He did not have football in mind when he said it of course but it could well apply to Coldwater's visit to Rockford Friday night.

The Cavaliers saw 15 different players rush or catch the ball and 20 defenders recorded tackles. Parkway despite having some nice talent in skill positions, just did not have enough ponies to keep up and the Cavaliers dominated the night, winning 35-6.

The scoring began when quarterback Sam Broering connected with his favorite target Jacob Wenning on a 31 yard pass to give Coldwater an early 7-0 lead at 8:43 of the first quarter.

The Cavaliers scored twice in the second as Ben Wenning capped off two drives with runs of 1 and 5 yards to give the visitors a 21-0 lead at halftime.

With just three minutes gone in the third quarter Broering again found Jacob Wenning, this time for 33 yards, to push Coldwater's advantage to 28-0.

The final Cavalier score of the evening came with 1 minute left in the third as senior Tyler Backs scored his first touchdown of the season on a 6 yard scamper. Coldwater led 35-0 and the fourth quarter started with a running clock for the first time all season.

As backups began to filter into the game, Parkway man-

aged to score with just under four minutes remaining on a 19 yard run to set the final score at 35-6.

Ben Wenning was the leading rusher with 45 yards on 8 attempts. Brad Giere added 13 more on four carries. For the evening, nine Cavaliers tallied 83 rushing yards on 23 carries

Most of offense was racked up by the air corps which was led by Jacob Wenning with 84 yards on 4 receptions. Alex May had 2 catches for 32 yards. Ben Wenning and Jack Muhlenkamp each had 31 yard on two catches. All tolled, nine receivers caught 18 passes for 214 yards.

Broering was 14 of 17 for 196 yards and a pair of TDs. Young Jake Muhlenkamp completed four of his six passes for 18 yards.

Blake Dippold had another perfect night completing all five of his point after attempts.

The Coldwater defense allowed just 272 yards, 195 on the ground and just 77 through the air while recovering two Panther fumbles. Parkway was only able to convert one of their eight third down attempts and none of their three fourth down attempts.

For Coldwater the victory extended their winning streak over Parkway to 29 games and moved their record to 4-2 (3-1 MAC).

Up next for Coldwater is 3-3 Minster. After a 3-0 start the Wildcats have dropped their last three games to Marion Local, Ft. Recovery in an overtime thriller and last week versus St. Henry.

After ruining Coldwater's perfect season last year, the Cats know they can get the job done. So look for this to be another big time MAC matchup.

As we enter the last four games of the regular season the MAC and playoff pictures are getting clearer. In the MAC the Cavs are tied for second place with Anna and St. Henry, one game behind undefeated Marion Local. The Flyers will need to stumble to give the Cavs a share of the league crown. With games against Ft. Recovery and St. Henry the chance exists if the Cavs take care of their own business.

With home games against Minster and Anna and trips to Versailles and Delphos St. John, the Cavaliers by no means have an easy road. Those teams are 14-10 combined.

Coldwater currently stands 7th in the Region 24 standings for Division 6. This should be called the MAC Region as Marion Local, St. Henry, Coldwater and Ft. Recovery are all in contention as members of the top ten. Look for a lot of movement as the final four games play out.
