## **Cavaliers Use Big Plays to Tame the Tigers**

In the Fall of 1936 Coldwater played the first football game in the history of its program. Their opponent was the Versailles Tigers in a game the Tigers won 20-6

Eighty one years later these historic foes met again in Versailles for the 63rd time. The Cavaliers have won about half of the games played and the series is one of the oldest in small school west central Ohio.

One this night Coldwater won for the 33rd time by a final score of 24-10.

It was not a particularly well played game as each team committed three turnovers. Coldwater was penalized 6 times for 76 total yards while Versailles committed 7 infractions totaling 55 yards.

The offensive lines struggled to protect their quarterbacks. Sam Broering was sacked 8 times and his rushing total was -31 yards. Tiger QB Noah Waymire was sacked 5 times for negative 47 yards.

Neither team was able to develop any offensive rhythm as the defensive lines dominated the game. In the end it was big plays that made the difference.

Versailles took the ball to start the game and could not score and their punt pinned Coldwater deep at their end of the field.

A Broering pass was soon intercepted and the Tigers took over at the Coldwater 17. Six plays later they scored on a 4 yard run and Versailles took an early 7-0 lead.

The Cavs pulled themselves together and drove 69 yards in seven plays - the final 30 yards

coming when Broering found his favorite receiver, Jacob Wenning for his first of three touchdown passes. Blake Dippold's PAT tied the score at 7-7.

They would hookup again with just over five minutes left in the second quarter on a 38 yard pass play to give the Cavs a 14-7 lead

As is his habit, Coach Chip Otten always looks for a score late in the half and Versailles was more than happy to oblige. Coldwater next possession covered 54 yards in 11 plays and ended with Dippold kicking a career long 37 yard field goal to give the visitors a 17-7 halftime lead. It was the sophomore's 4th field goal in 6 attempts this season.

In the second half the defenses reigned supreme as Versailles managed a 30 yard field goal of their own in the third and the Broering to Wenning tandem completed their trifecta with a 36 yard touchdown pass midway through the final quarter to seal a 24-10 victory for Coldwater.

Ben Wenning was Coldwater's leader rusher with 47 yards in 10 attempts. Broering had a career best passing night with 244 yards on 13 of 27 passing and three touchdowns.

Jacob Wenning caught 6 passes for 145 yards and three TDs, a career best for him as well.

As a team Coldwater rushed 41 times for 56 yards and with the passing yards the Cavs put up 300 yards of total offense running a season high 68 plays.

Meanwhile the defense continues to play solid football giving up just 147 yards on 44 plays and forcing 3 fumbles. It was the least productive night for a Coldwater opponent this season.

Versailles falls to 3-5 and will probably miss the playoffs. Coldwater improves to 6-2 and controls their own destiny in the post season. If they win out the can be assured of a home game in Week 11.

Next up for Coldwater is the final regular season game at Coldwater Stadium. The opponent will be a challenge as the surprising 7-1 Anna Rockets pay a visit.

Last year Coldwater won their seventh in a row downing the Rockets 34-0. This season Anna is much improved. Coldwater will need to play their best football of the season if they hope to be victorious.

This game plus the Marion Local at St. Henry game see the top four teams in the MAC square off in Week 9. That is the way it should be right?

Upset wins by the Cavs and Redskins will create a tie at the top with Coldwater and Marion Local. Anna and St. Henry will be tied for second. All four teams would be playoff locks.

Minster and Coldwater's Week 10 opponent Delphos St. John are also anticipating playoff spots. With Ft. Recovery's 21-10 loss to the Flyers, they could be on the outside looking in.
