## The 2017 Season Kicks Off As Coldwater Hosts Kenton

Last night, Coldwater travelled to Defiance Tinora to scrimmage the Rams. Without much depth the Rams were not a big challenge for the Cavaliers but it was another opportunity to work out against someone not wearing orange and black.

The Varsity squads played just three quarters before giving the JVs and Freshman squads a chance to work out.

Sam Broering was 18 of 23 passing for 165 yards and three touchdowns.

Ben Wenning caught two of those TD passes and Brad Giere the other. Caleb Dippold lead all receivers with 58 yards on five catches.

Seth Obringer carried the ball just 3 times for 27 yards. Brad Giere scored on a one yard run. Overall the Cavs rushed 21 times for 49 yards. Total offense for Coldwater amounted to 45 plays for 235 yards in just three quarters of play.

Meanwhile, the Rams struggled against the young Cavalier defense, putting up just 50 yards total offense on 38 rushing yards.

Because of Tinora's lack of depth, the Freshman and JV squads had to play against a number of experienced players and did pretty well, each squad scored once.

So two-a-days are over, school starts on next week and another football season is about to begin.

To get things started, the Kenton Wildcats travel to Coldwater to face the Cavaliers in the first game of the season for both teams.

## Kenton Scouting Report

Kenton was 5-5 last season in the fourth year with Brent Fackler as the head coach and is 18 -16 overall. Fackler was the defensive coordinator under Mike Mauk who moved to Missouri in 2014. The Cats continue to play a 4-3 defense and seeing the success of the passing game under Mauk, Fackler continues to call a pass on almost every offensive play.

Kenton returns six starters this year on a team that was very inexperienced last season. Jaron Sharp will play quarterback after starting on defense last season.

Hunter Moore (Sr.), who was their second leading receiver with 800 yds receiving last year will lead the receiving corps. Others expected to contribute are Alex Stephens, Cory Ludwig, Jayden Brown, and Dillion Rall all of whom are seniors.

The offensive line needs retooled as they lost All-WBL player Tyler Heintz, Sadly, Tyler passed away after a conditioning session at Kent State this summer.

Other returning lineman include Steven Stalder (Sr.), Clint Kitchen (Sr.), and Ian Lyons (Jr.).

The Wildcats return 4 starters on defense. Lineman Jon Hord (Jr), along with last years backups Noah Leffler (Jr.), Noah Eikenbary (So.), and Austin Moore (So) will see action.

Linebackers are expected to be led by Shawn Conover (Sr), who has started the last two years. Others include Trent Lawrence (Jr.), Luke Fackler (So.), Noah Eikenbary (So.), and Colin Morris(Jr).

At defensive back, the Wildcats return seniors Trent Reichelderfer and Luke Baird. Other competing in the secondary will be Bryce Ellis (So.), Brian Blankenship (Jr.), and Malik Jett (So.).
