The Coaches Corner

Seems like just last week I was helping out with a 7 on 7 versus Celina and all of a sudden the 2018 football season is over for the Cavaliers. This caps off my 16th season as a statistician for the Coldwater Football program, but this has been the final season for our "statistician emeritus" if you will, Coach Gary Mastin.

Gary and former Coldwater Head Coach John Reed first met at Montpelier High School where they began their high school teaching and coaching careers. Gary followed John to Parkway High School in 1973 but when John left for Marion Harding, Gary stayed behind to coach in Mercer and Auglaize Counties. When John came to Coldwater in 1995, one of his first calls was to Gary. By this time Gary had stopped coaching, but he offered to do anything else John need. So, for the first two seasons, Gary did scouting for the Cavaliers.

One Sunday afternoon Gary visited John at his home and found him sitting on his front porch trying to make sense of the game stats from Friday night. The hand written pages were pretty sloppy. Gary was very familiar with John's stat system and from that day on, Gary became Coldwater's chief statistician.

For the first couple of seasons, Gary was assisted by his daughter Allisa who did the spotting for him. When I joined the crew in 2003, I spotted for a few games then developed a way of doing the stats on a computer, basically mimicking the paper stats Gary keeps each week. Gary's stat boards are still looked at by the coaches immediately after a game. Rod Staugler who joined us in 2005 does play-by-play recording on paper which assist the coaches when reviewing game video. We have been assisted over the years by others who spot for us or help run the video recording system. This year we were assisted by Jon Yoder, and our sons Jonathon Cron and Nick Staugler. Jon Yoder also helped out for a few games.

But after 23 years, the man responsible for the opportunities each of us have enjoyed, will be stepping aside. Under Coach Mastin we have all learned more about football and the times we have spent together on Friday nights are more fun than a human being should be allowed to have.

Six state championships in 12 appearances, including a record 8 consecutive seasons from 2009-2016. Car rides before and after games, sharing memories and building lifelong friendships. Those three trips to Columbus for the state finals were the best ever.

We have met many of the regions finest media members from newspapers to radio and television. We have been in historic locker rooms in Massillon, Canton and Ohio Stadium.

We have crammed into press boxes that were more like chicken coops, climbed to the ice box over Paul Brown Stadium in Massillon (too darn many times) and enjoyed more luxurious facilities in Coldwater, Findlay, Canton and Ohio Stadium.

Gary has a nephew who plays football for Celina and for the next few years, you will find Gary and wife Chris following the Bulldogs on Friday nights. Gary, for us it all started with you.
